At the Mount Morgan Mine, Queensland, on the 4th November, 1908, a subsidence occurred of a mass of ore weighing about 12,000 tons. Five men at work in the excavations were killed; two, Lyons and Banks, escaped, the latter being seriously injured in the head. Lyons called up the shaft for help. John Shields volunteered to descend, running very great risks while he was being lowered in consequence of falling debris. He reached the two men, and with the help of Lyons, who was unwilling to leave his wounded companion, Banks was securely fastened to the rope, and eventually all three were drawn up.

"In pursuance of higher orders, Notice is hereby given to all holders and possessors of Credits against the State, who have not up to date presented same for settlement in conformity with the Plan of Adjustment proposed by this Government, that, by virtue of a Law enacted by the National Congress under date of the 27th and 28th May of the current year, all Credits which may not have been presented for inspection and adjustment prior to the 1st January, 1910,

will be considered as non-existent.
"The attention of holders of notes of the National Bank, of whatsoever denomination, is likewise recalled, to the end that these also be presented for adjustment, in conformity with the aforesaid Plan of Adjustment, at the rate of 20

per cent. of their nominal value.
