ISSUE OF £3,500,000.

In part replacement of Exchequer Bonds for £6,000,000 due 14th October, 1909, of which £1,196,700 have already been redeemed, and the balance will be replaced by Bonds to be allotted to Public Departments.

The Governor and Company of the Bank of England are authorised by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury to receive Tenders for £3,500,000 Exchequer Bonds, to be created under Acts 29 Vict., c. 25; 52 Vict., c. 6; and 4 Edw. VII, c. 21.

The Bonds, which will be in denominations of £100, £200, £500, £1,000, £5,000 and £10,000, will be for three years, and will be dated the 14th October, 1909.

Interest at £3 per cent. per annum will be paid by Coupon, the first Coupon being payable on the 14th January, 1910.

Tenders may be for the whole, or any part, of the issue, in multiples of £100, and must be delivered at the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England, before one o'clock on Thursday, the 7th October, 1909. Every tender must state what amount of money will be given for every £100 of Bonds, and must be at a price which is a multiple of sixpence.

The tenders of private individuals must be made through a London Banker.

In the event of the receipt of tenders for a larger amount of Bonds than that to be issued, the tenders at the lowest price accepted will be subject to a pro rata diminution.

Payment in full of Allotments must be made by cash, or Banker's draft on the Bank of England, before three o'clock on Thursday, the 14th October, 1909, and Scrip Certificates, which will be exchangeable for the definitive Bonds at
