Crown Agents for the Colonies: Class III Clerkships;

Ecclesiastical Commission: Junior Clerkships;

Exchequer Department: and Audit Examinerships;

Inland Revenue Department: Assistant Surveyorships of Taxes; Second Class Clerkships in the Estate Duty Offices, London, Edinburgh, and Dublin;

Metropolitan Police: Second Class Clerkships in the Commissioner's Office;

War Office: Appointments as Second Class Assistant Accountant in the Army Accounts Department; Junior Appointments in the Royal Ordnance Factories.

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

Both the subjects in Class I must be taken up. No Candidate will be eligible who fails to pass a qualifying examination in Arithmetic and English.

From Classes II and III Candidates may select subjects, one of which must be a language, carrying marks up to a maximum of 10,000, making with the subjects in Class I 14,000 in all. The same subject may not be selected both in Class II and in Class III.

- 3. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made in the writing of the Candidate, at such times and in such manner as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners.
- 4. A fee of £3 will be required from each Candidate attending an Examination.
- 5. From the list resulting from each Examination will be filled (provided there be Candidates duly qualified):—
 - (a) All the appointments which may have been reported to the Civil Service Commissioners as vacant or about to become vacant up to the date of the announcement of the result of the Examination;
 - (b) Such additional appointments becoming vacant within four months from the date of the announcement of the result of the Examination as the Head of the Department may desire to have so filled.

Candidates will be allowed to choose, according to their place on the list, among the vacancies (a) for which they are duly qualified; or they may elect to wait for the chance of a vacancy (b). When vacancies (b) occur, they will be offered in rotation to the qualified Candidates then on the list, who will be free to decline them without forfeiting their claim to subsequent vacancies (b). The declaration of choice is irrevocable, and the name of a Candidate accepting a vacancy (a) or (b) is thereupon removed from the list of Candidates awaiting appointment.



KINGS NORTON AND NORTHFIELD URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL.

TRAMWAYS ACT, 1870.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Urban District Council of Kings Norton and Northfield, as the local authority for the urban district of Kings Norton and Northfield, and as the promoters of the tramways within the urban district of Kings Norton and Northfield worked by the Lord Mayor, Aldermen and Citizens of the City of Birmingham, did on the sixth day of October, 1909, under the powers conferred upon them by section 46 of the Tramways Act, 1870, make the following Bye-laws and regulations with respect to such tramways, namely:—

BYE-LAWS AND REGULATIONS made by the Urban District Council of Kings Norton and Northfield, under the powers conferred upon them by section 46 of the Tramways Act, 1870, as the local authority for the urban district of Kings Norton and Northfield, and as the promoters of the tramways within the urban district of Kings Norton and Northfield, worked by the Lord Mayor, Aldermen and Citizens of the city of Birmingham.

Interpretation.

 Throughout these Bye-laws and regulations the expression "the Council" means the Urban District Council of Kings Norton and Northfield, and the expression "tramways" means such portion of the tramways within the urban district of Kings Norton and Northfield belonging to the Council, which are now or hereafter may be worked by the Lord Mayor, Aldermen and Citizens of the city of Birmingham; the expression "the Corporation" means the Lord Mayor, Aldermen and Citizens of the city of Birming-ham; the expression "car" means any carriage or car run upon the tramways for the conveyance of passengers; the expression "conductor" means any officer or servant of the Corporation having charge of or helping in the charge of a

car; and the expression "driver" means any officer or servant of the Corporation driving or helping to drive the car.

Entering and Leaving Cars.

2. Every person shall enter or depart from a car by the step of the hindermost or conductor's platform, and not otherwise, unless so directed by the conductor.

All persons desiring to mount a car for the purpose of travelling thereon shall first permit all persons to alight who may be intending to do so.

Smoking.

3. No person shall smoke or carry lighted pipes, cigars or cigarettes in or upon any car, except in a compartment or on seats specially set apart for the purpose.

Playing Musical Instruments.

4. No passenger or other person shall, while riding in or upon any car, sing or play or perform upon any musical instrument.

Objectionable Persons.

5. Any person who is in a state of intoxication, or who from that or any other cause is in the opinion of the conductor unfit to be a passenger on a car, shall not be allowed to board or enter upon any car, and may be prevented from mounting or entering any car: and, if any such person be found in or upon any car, he shall forthwith at the request of the conductor leave the car.

Spitting.

6. No person shall spit in or upon any car.

Offensive Language or Conduct, etc.

7. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language, or conduct himself offensively, whilst in or upon any car, or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any car or tramway station, or premises used in connection with the tramway system, or in any way wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger. No person shall distribute advertisements or tracts of any kind, or beg or collect alms or subscriptions, or sell any article, or play any game, or gamble, or deposit remnants of food or fruit in or upon any car, waiting rooms, premises or buildings used in connection with the tramways.

Damaging Cars.

8. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil or damage the seats, cushions, curtains, or linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice, in or on any car, or break or scratch any window of or otherwise wilfully damage any car. Any person acting in contravention of this regulation shall be liable, in addition to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws, to pay the amount of any damage so done.

Offensive Clothing.

9. Any person whose dress or clothing will, in the opinion of the conductor or other duly authorised officer of the Corporation, soil or injure the seats, lining or cushions of the car, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or any person who may for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall not be allowed to enter or

remain in or upon any car, and may be prevented from mounting or entering such car, and any such person found in or upon any car shall, on the request of the conductor or other duly authorised officer of the Corporation, leave the car upon the fare (if previously paid) being returned, provided that on cars specially run for artisans, mechanics and daily labourers, no person shall be prevented from entering or remaining in or on a car under the provisions of this Bye-law on the ground of the condition of his dress or clothing, if such condition is solely due to the nature of his employment.

Payment of Fares.

10. Each passenger shall upon demand, and whether the fare shall have been demanded or not, before leaving the car, pay to the conductor or other duly authorized officer of the Corporation, the fare legally payable for his journey, and obtain a ticket therefor. Any person leaving a car shall be deemed to have completed his journey. Any passenger who desires to take advantage of a through fare must ask for and obtain a ticket issued in respect of such through fare.

No child under five years of age, who is sitting on the lap of a passenger, shall be liable to pay a fare, provided that this provision shall apply only to one such child, accompanying any one passenger; any additional child, irrespective of age, accompanying such passenger shall pay the full fare legally demandable for the distance travelled by such child.

Any passenger paying for a stage less than . the whole journey run by the car shall be deemed to have completed his journey at the end of the stage paid for; if the passenger remains on the car, he shall pay the fare legally payable for the remainder of his journey as a new passenger.

Tickets.

11. Each passenger shall immediately upon demand show his ticket to any officer or servant of the Corporation, and shall also, when required so to do, either deliver up his ticket or in default thereof pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

Tickets shall not be transferable, and shall only be available for the car on which they are issued.

Luggage.

12. Any person entering or mounting upon any car, and having any luggage (including the tools of an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer), shall, if so requested by the conductor, place such luggage upon either of the platforms, and shall not take or place the same in the interior or on the upper deck of the car unless permitted by the conductor so to do.

No person shall bring on to any car luggage of a size or bulk which, in the opinion of the conductor, is likely to cause inconvenience, hindrance or annoyance to passengers.

Travelling on Steps, etc.

13. No person not being an officer or duly authorised servant of the Corporation shall travel or ride on the steps, platforms, outside rails, buffers, or guards of any car, and no person not being an officer or authorised servant of the Corporation shall stand on the platforms

or on the upper deck of any car, or shall sit on the outside rail on the upper deck, or on any part of any car not intended for passengers, and any person so travelling, riding, standing, or sitting, shall cease to do so immediately on request by the conductor or other duly authorised servant of the Corporation.

14. No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, shall enter or mount any car.

Entering Full Cars.

15. When any car contains the full number of passengers which it is licensed to carry, the conductor may place a chain across the entrance to such car, and no person shall remove such chain or enter or board any such car. Any person in a car remaining unseated after the licensed seating accommodation of the car is filled shall leave the car immediately upon the request of the conductor.

Disabled Cars.

16. If at any time a car becomes disabled, or in any way injured or damaged, or from any cause unable to proceed, the passengers shall, upon the request of the conductor, leave the same; and if such passengers have paid their fares, shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of their fares so paid, but on production of their tickets shall be entitled to travel by the next available car the remainder of the distance in respect of which they have paid their fares.

Interference with the Duties of the Conductor or Driver.

17. No person, other than the conductor or driver, shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards, or interfere with the controllers, brakes, lights, ventilators, trolley cord, platform chains, or any part of a car or its equipment, or signal a car to start. Any person acting in contravention of this regulation shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these byelaws and regulations, in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.

Entering or Leaving a Car when in Motion.

18. No person shall enter, board, or leave, or attempt to enter, board or leave, any car whilst in motion.

Dogs.

19. No person shall take a dog or other animal into or upon any car after having been requested not to do so by the conductor. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any car in breach of this regulation shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the car immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

Firearms.

20. No person shall travel in or on any car with loaded firearms.

Obstructing Officers in Exercise of their Duty.

21. No passenger shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Corporation or the Council in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any car or in connection with the tramways.

Impeding Traffic.

22. No person shall in any way wilfully impede or interfere with the traffic on any of the tramways.

Persons suffering from Disease not to Travel on Cars.

23. No person afflicted with any infectious or contagious disease shall board, enter or travel on any car, or attempt so to do, and no driver or conductor shall wilfully or knowingly suffer or permit any such person so to do.

Power to Remove Passengers Committing Offence.

24. Any person who shall commit, whilst on any car, any legal offence, or any breach of these Bye-laws, shall, in addition to being liable to a penalty, be liable to be removed immediately from the car; and, if such person shall have paid his fare, shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of his fare so paid.

Conductors and Drivers to enforce Bye-laws.

25. Every conductor or driver shall to the best of his ability enforce these Bye-laws and regulations, and prevent the breach thereof.

Penalty.

26. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Bye-laws and regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings for each offence, and in the case of a continuing offence, to a penalty not exceeding ten shillings for every day during which the offence continues.

Copy of Bye-laws to be hung on Cars.

27. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each car in use a printed copy of these Bye-laws and regulations.

Repeal of Bye-laws.

28. From and after the date of the confirmation of these Bye-laws and regulations, the Bye-laws and regulations made by the Rural Sanitary Authority of the Kings Norton Union with respect to tramways, on the first day of December, 1886, and the twenty-third day of April, 1890, which were confirmed by the Board of Trade on the third day of February, 1887, and the sixth day of August, 1890, respectively, shall, so far as the same are in force, be repealed.

The Common Seal of the Kings Norton and Northfield Urban District Council was hereunto affixed on the sixth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and nine, in pursuance of a resolution in that behalf in the presence of
