

TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY
BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Wednesday, the 3rd proximo, at one o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Acts 40 Vic., cap. 2, 52 Vic., cap. 6, and 9 Edw. VII, cap. 5, to the amount of £3,000,000, in replacement of Bills falling due on the 10th November.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £1,000, £5,000, or £10,000. They will be dated the 10th November, 1909, and will be payable at three months after date, viz.:—on the 10th February, 1910.

3. *The Tenders must specify the net amount per cent. which will be given for the amounts applied for, and the Tenders of private individuals must be made through a London Banker.*

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same on Thursday, the 4th November, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England not later than three o'clock, on Wednesday, the 10th November, 1909.

6. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

ORDER as to the alteration of the amount of Fees to be paid under the Money Lenders Act, 1900, in respect of the inspection of the Register and for a copy of a registered Return, and as to the collection of the same by means of Stamps.

Whereas by section 3 (1) of the Money Lenders Act, 1900 (63 and 64 Vict., cap. 51), it is provided that the Commissioners of Inland Revenue, subject to the approval of the Treasury, may make regulations respecting the registration of Money Lenders, and respecting the Inspection of the Register and the fees payable therefor:—

Now we, the undersigned, being two of the said Commissioners, with the approval of the Treasury, do hereby order and direct—

That the fee payable for the inspection of each separate Return on the Register shall be one shilling. On the payment of this fee of one shilling, any person shall, on demand, be furnished with a copy of any registered Return, provided such copy does not exceed in length one folio of 72 words or figures. In the event of the copy being required to be certified, there shall be paid in addition the Stamp Duty of one shilling chargeable by law on a certified copy of or extract from any public register. In the case of a copy which exceeds one folio, an additional charge at the rate of 4d. for every folio of 72 words or figures, or part of a folio, shall be payable in respect of every folio or part thereof beyond the first folio.

And whereas by section 3 of the Public Offices Fees Act, 1879, it is provided that the Treasury may, from time to time, make, and when made,

revoke, alter or add to, regulations for all or any of the following purposes respecting fees in any public office, that is to say:—

1. Regulating the manner in which the fees taken in money are to be taken, accounted for, and paid over.

2. Determining the use of impressed or adhesive stamps and the mode of cancellation of adhesive stamps.

3. Regulating the use of stamps and prescribing the application thereof to documents from time to time in use and requiring documents to be used for the purpose of such stamps.

Now we, the undersigned, being two of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, do hereby give notice, and order and direct that the fees under the Money Lenders Act, 1900, mentioned in the foregoing Order, shall be collected by means of stamps, and that all such stamps shall be impressed stamps.

The said impressed stamps shall be of such design and character as the Commissioners of Inland Revenue may from time to time adopt for the purpose.

We do further give notice that this Order shall be binding on all officers or persons whom it may in any way affect.

ORDER OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL IN
ENGLAND.

(Dated 27th October, 1909.)

Whereas by the 21st section of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1874, it is enacted that the Registrar-General, with the sanction of the Local Government Board, may from time to time alter Registration Sub-districts:—

1. And whereas it is expedient that Bradninch Civil Parish should be transferred from Silverton Sub-district of Tiverton Registration District to Cullompton Sub-district of the same Registration District;

2. Now, therefore, I, Bernard Mallet, Registrar-General of Births, Deaths, and Marriages in England, in exercise of the powers given me by the above mentioned Act, and with the sanction of the Local Government Board, do hereby order and declare that the foregoing alteration shall take effect accordingly.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the 1st day of November, nineteen hundred and nine.
