SHORES OR BANKS OF THE SEA AT CLONEA (COUNTY WATERFORD).

REMOVAL OF MATERIALS PROHIBITED.

Whereas the Board of Trade, acting in pursuance of the Harbours Act, 1814, as amended by the Harbours Transfer Act, 1862, find it necessary for the protection of the Port of Waterford to prohibit the taking or removing of any shingle or ballast from the shores or banks of the sea between the southern boundary of the townland of Tallacoolmore and the eastern boundary of the townland of Clonea Middle (i.e. between points situate respectively 1,250 yards south west and 820 yards north-east of the old Castle of Clonea), being within the said port.

Now the Board of Trade do hereby, by this Order, prohibit the taking or removing of any shingle or ballast from the shores or banks of the sea between the points above mentioned.

ORDER of the Local Government Board: Motor Car Act, 1903: Regulations under Section 9 (1).

BOROUGH OF REIGATE.

To the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Reigate;-

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by sub-section (1) of Section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that, within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by Us, the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;

And whereas the Town Council of the borough of Reigate, having made application to Us to make a Regulation in pursuance of the said sub-section putting the above-mentioned provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising certain roads and parts of roads situate within the borough of Reigate (hereinafter referred to as "the borough"), We directed a Local Inquiry to be held into the matter by one of Uur Inspectors, and the Inquiry was held accordingly, and Report has been made to Us thereon:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, We do, by this Our Order, make the following Regulations:-

ARTICLE I.—The provisions of Sub-section (1) of Section 9 of the Act with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour shall apply and have effect within the limits comprising the roads and parts of roads within the borough which are specified in the Schedule hereto.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the fifteenth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and nine.





OTICE is hereby given, that the following By-Laws and REGULATIONS have been made by the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of Rawtenstall, acting by the Town Council as the Local Authority, under section 46 of the Tramways Act, 1870, as to distances between cars, stoppages and traffic.

Interpretation.

1. Throughout these By-laws and Regulations the term "car" means any carriage or car run upon the tramways for the conveyance of passengers, the word "conductor" means any officer or servant of the Corporation having the charge of or helping in the charge of a car, and the word "driver" means any officer or servant of the Corporation driving or belping to drive a

Distance between Cars.

2. The driver of every car shall so drive the same that it shall not follow a preceding car at a less distance than forty yards.

Stoppage of Cars.

3. Subject to the requirements of By-law

the same for the purpose of setting down or taking up passengers at any place appointed as a stopping place by the Corporation, when required by any passenger desiring to leave the car, or by any person desirous of travelling by the car, for whom there is room, and to whose admission no valid objection can be made.

Warning Bell or Whistle.

4. The driver of a car, on coming in sight of a vehicle standing or travelling on any part of the road so as not to leave sufficient space for the car to pass, shall sound his bell or whistle as a warning to the person in charge of such vehicle, and that person shall, with reasonable despatch, cause such vehicle to be removed so as not to obstruct the car.

Interference with Traffic.

5. No person shall in any way wilfully impede or interfere with the traffic on the tramways, nor shall any driver or conductor needlessly cause interruption to the ordinary road traffic.

Penalty.

6. Every driver, conductor, or other person offending against any of these By-laws and Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings for each offence, and not exceeding, for any continuing offence, ten shillings for every day during which the offence continues.

Date By-laws Come in Force.

7. These By-laws shall come into force on the 10th day of January, 1910.

RAWTENSTALL CORPORATION TRAMWAYS.

OTICE is hereby given, that the following BY-LAWS AND REGULATIONS have been made by the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of Rawtenstall, acting by the Town Council as the Promoters of the Rawtenstall Corporation Tramways Undertaking under section 46 of the Tramways Act, 1870, as to Nuisances and as to travelling on Tramcars.

Interpretation.

1.-Throughout these By-laws and Regulations the word "Corporation" means the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of Rawtenstall and such other Local Authority as No. 2, the driver or conductor of a car shall stop I may for the time being use the tramways of the Corporation; the word "tramways" means the tramway system for the time being worked by the Corporation, whether situate in the borough of Rawtenstall or in any other district; the word "car" means any carriage or car run upon the tramways for the conveyance of passengers; the word "conductor" means any officer or servant of the Corporation having the charge of or helping in the charge of a car; and the word "driver means any officer or servant of the Corporation driving or helping to drive a car.

Extent of By-laws.

2. The By-laws hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to every car using the tram ways.

Entering or Leaving Cars.

3. Every person shall enter or depart from a car by the step of the hindermost or conductor's platform, and not otherwise, unless so directed by the conductor.

Terminus.

4. No person shall enter or mount, or attempt to enter or mount, any car arriving or standing at a terminus, stopping place, or other place, until such passengers as may be upon the car and desire to alight shall have alighted.

Entering or Leaving Car in Motion.

5. No person shall enter, board, mount or leave or attempt to enter, board, mount or leave any car whilst in motion.

Smoking.

6. No person shall smoke or carry a lighted pipe, cigar, or cigarette inside any car, except in a portion or compartment specially set apart for

Musical Instruments.

7. No passenger or other person shall, while travelling in or upon any car, play or perform upon any musical instrument, or distribute advertisements or tracts of any kind, or beg or collect money, alms or subscriptions, or sell any article, or play any game or gamble, or deposit remnants of food or fruit in or upon any car.

Obscene or Offensive Language, &c.

8. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language, or conduct himself offensively, whilst in or upon any car, or spit or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any car or tramway station, or premises used in connection with the tramway system, or in any way wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

Intoxicated Persons.

9. No person who is in a state of intoxication, or affected with any dangerous, contagious or infectious disorder, shall enter or mount upon any car, and if any such person is found in or upon any car, it shall be lawful for the conductor or any other officer or servant of the Corporation, to immediately remove such person from the car, and if such person shall have paid his fare, he shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of his fare so paid.

Damage to Car.

10. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil or damage the seats, cushions, curtains or linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice, in or on any car, or break or scratch any window of, or otherwise wilfully damage any car. Any person acting in contravention of this thereof the full number of passengers for which

By-law shall, in addition to the penalty prescribed by these By-laws, be liable for the amount of any damage so done.

Objectionable Persons.

 No person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor of a car, soil or injure the seats, linings or cushions of a car, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, and no person who, in the opinion of the conductor. might for any other reason be offensive to any passenger, shall be entitled to enter or remain in any car, and may be prevented from entering any car, and shall not enter or mount any car after having been requested not to do so by the conductor. Provided that on cars specially run for artisans, mechanics, and daily labourers no person shall be prevented from entering or remaining in a car under the provisions of this By-law on the ground of the condition of his dress or clothing, if such condition is solely due to the nature of his employment.

Payment of Fares.

12. Each passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the conductor, or other duly authorised officer of the Corporation, the fare legally demandable for the journey, and obtain a ticket therefor. No child under three years of age who is sitting on the lap of a passenger shall be liable to pay a

Tickets.

13. Each passenger shall immediately upon demand show his ticket to the conductor or any duly authorised officer of the Corporation, and shall also, when required so to do by the conductor or any duly authorised officer of the Corporation, either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger. Tickets shall not be transferable, and any person leaving a car shall be deemed to have completed his journey.

Artisans.

14. No person not being an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer within the true intent and meaning of the Acts of Parliament relating to the tramways, shall use or attempt to use any ticket intended only for an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer, or travel or attempt to travel on the tramways as an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer.

Luggage.

15. Personal or other luggage (including the tools of artisans, mechanics, and daily labourers) shall, unless otherwise permitted by the conductor. be placed on the front or driver's platform, and not inside or on the roof of any car.

Travelling on Steps, &c.

16. No person, not being an officer or servant of the Corporation acting in the performance of his duty, shall travel or ride on the steps, platforms, outside rails, buffers, or guards of any car, or shall stand in any case on the outside or except by the express permission of the conductor first obtained, in the interior of any car.

No person except a passenger or intending passenger shall board a car, and no person shall hold or hang on to any part of a car.

Full Number of Passengers.

17. When any car contains in the interior

seating accommodation, according to the notice thereof, attached to the car, is provided in such interior, no person beyond such number shall enter, mount, or remain therein, except by the express permission of the conductor first ob-

When any car contains on the outside thereof, the full number of passengers for which seating accommodation, according to the notice thereof attached to the car, is provided on such outside, no person beyond such number shall enter, mount, or remain thereon.

Dogs.

18. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in the interior of any car, nor in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal is offensive or an annoyance to any passenger shall the same be allowed on the outside of any car. No person shall take a dog or other animal on any car after having been requested not to do so by the conductor. Any dog or other animal taken or being on any car in breach of this Regulation shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the car immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

Firearms, &c.

19. No person shall enter, mount or travel in or on any car with loaded firearms, or with any article, instrument or implement which may, in the opinion of the conductor, be dangerous or offensive to any passenger.

Obstruction.

20. No person shall wilfully obstruct or impede any conductor, driver, or other officer or servant of the Corporation acting in the performance of his duty upon or in connection with any car or tramway.

Interference with Driver or Conductor.

21. No person other than the conductor or driver, or other servant of the Corporation acting in the performance of his duty, shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards, or interfere with the controllers, brakes, lights, ventilators, trolley cord, or any part of the car or its equipment, or signal a car to start.

Disabled Cars.

22. If at any time a car becomes disabled or in any way injured or from any cause unable to proceed the passengers shall upon the request of the conductor leave the same, and if such passengers have paid their fares, they shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of their fares so paid, but on production of their tickets shall be allowed to travel by the next available car on the same day for the remainder of the distance in respect of which they have paid their fares. No person shall, except with the leave of the conductor, enter a disabled or injured car.

By-laws to be Placed in Cars.

23. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each carriage in use a printed copy of the By-laws.

Enforcing By-laws.

24. Every conductor and driver of a car shall to the best of his ability enforce these By-laws

and prevent the breach thereof, and if any such conductor or driver fails to enforce the same as aforesaid he shall be deemed to have committed a breach thereof.

Penalty.

25. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these By-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

Power to Remove Passengers Committing Offence.

26. Any person who shall commit whilst on any car any legal offence or any breach of these By-laws shall, in addition to being liable to a penalty, be liable to be immediately removed from the car, and if such person shall have paid his fare, shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of his fare so paid.

Date By-laws Come in Force.

27. These By-laws shall come into force on the 10th day of January, 1910.
