SAINT ELIZABETH'S SCHOOL, MUCH HADHAM, HERTFORDSHIRE.

Institution for Epileptic Children.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department has this day issued a Certificate under the provisions of the Children Act, 1908 (8 Edw. 7., c. 67), for the premises known as Saint Elizabeth's School, Much Hadham, in the county of Hertford, which have been certified by the Board of Education, under the Elementary Education Act, 1899, as a Special School for epileptic

children, with a view to the reception therein of such epileptic children as may be sent thereto from time to time in pursuance of the provisions of the Children Act, 1908, or of the Elementary Education Act, 1876 (39 and 40 Vict., c. 79).

The number of inmates authorized by the Certificate is 60 (namely, 30 boys and 30 girls).
