**ORDER of the Local Government Board: Motor Car Act, 1903: Regulations under Section 9 (1).

COUNTY OF MIDDLESEX.

Urban District of Teddington.

To the County Council of Middlesex;-

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that, within any limits or place referred to in Regulations made by Us, the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;

And whereas the County Council of Middlesex, having made application to Us to make a Regulation in pursuance of the said sub-section putting the above-mentioned provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising a certain road situate within the urban district of Teddington, We directed a Local Inquiry to be held into the matter by one of Our Inspectors, and the Inquiry was held accordingly, and Report has been made to Us thereon:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, We do, by this Our Order, make the following Regulations :-

ARTICLE I.—The provisions of sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Act with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour shall apply and have effect within the limits comprising so much of Waldegrave-road, within the urban district of Teddington, as extends from its junction with High-street to its junction with Teddington Park (formerly Blenheim-road).

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the twenty-second day of November, one thousand nine hundred and nine.

To sanction and confirm the purchase or acquisition by or the leasing or granting to the Company of, and to empower the Company to retain, hold and use for the purposes of their water undertaking all or any of the lands or any interest in the lands in the said parishes of East Grinstead and Lingfield already purchased or acquired by or leased or granted to the Company for the purposes of or in connection with the Hackenden Works, and to empower the Company to acquire, compulsorily or by agreement, easements or rights for the purpose of maintaining or laying down and from time to time enlarging, repairing, renewing and inspecting the aforesaid existing aqueducts or lines of pipes (No. 1 and No. 2) and apparatus connected therewith and new water mains, pipes and apparatus in, under or over the lands, road and property in the said parish of East Grinstead hereinafter described (namely) :

To enable the Company to purchase, take on lease or acquire by agreement the well and waterworks now in course of construction near the most pond on the estate known as "Place Land," in the parish of East Grinstead aforesaid, and to complete the construction of the said well and waterworks and from time to time alter, improve, enlarge, extend, renew or reconstruct the same, and to hold and use the same for the purposes of their water undertaking and if thought fit to sanction, confirm and provide for the carrying into effect of any agreement made or to be made with respect to all or any of such purposes.
- 11. To empower the Company to hold lands for the purpose of protecting, securing and preserving their waterworks or water supply, and to exempt such lands and the Company in respect thereof from the provisions or some of the provisions of the Lands Clauses Acts, with respect to the sale of superfluous lands, and to empower the Com-

13. To empower the Company to pump, collect, impound, take, divert, use and appropriate for the purposes of their water undertaking all such springs and waters as may be intercepted by the Hackenden Works or the new works or any supplemental or ancillary works in connection therewith or by the said well and waterworks on the estate known as "Place Land," or as may be found in, on or under any lands or property for the time being belonging or leased to the Company or in, through, under or over which they have acquired or may acquire rights or easements, and to vary or extinguish all or any rights, easements and privileges in any manner connected with any such springs and waters.

general purposes of their undertaking to raise further money by the creation and issue of new shares or stock (ordinary or preferential or both) and debenture stock and by borrowing on mortgage or otherwise upon such terms and conditions as the Company may determine or as may be prescribed by the Bill.

18. To incorporate with the Bill and apply to the new works proposed to be authorized by the Bill and to the Company in respect thereof and whether with or without modification all or some of the provisions of the Railways Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, with respect to the temporary occupation of lands near the works during the construction thereof, and the Bill will or may also incorporate with or without modification all or some of the provisions of the Lands Clauses Acts; the Waterworks Clauses Acts, 1847 and 1863; and the Companies Clauses Acts, 1845, 1863 and 1869, and will or may exempt the Company from all or some of the provisions of those Acts.

19. To vary or extinguish all or any rights or privileges inconsistent with or which would interfere with any of the objects or purposes or provisions of the Bill, and to confer other rights and privileges, and to amend or repeal all or some of the provisions of the East Grinstead Gas and Water Act, 1878, and any other Act or Acts relating to the Company or their undertaking.
