The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

Restriction on Movement of Swine out of Huntingdonshire.

1.-(1.) Notwithstanding anything in the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, swine shall not be moved from any premises in the administrative county of Huntingdon to any premises outside that county except a bacon factory or slaughterhouse, and only if accompanied by a licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the | in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regubacon factory or slaughterhouse is situate and specifying the bacon factory or slaughterhouse to which the swine may be moved.

(2.) Movement of swine with a licence under this Order shall be subject to the following conditions :-

(i.) The swine shall, before movement out of the administrative county of Huntingdon,

be marked by and at the expense of the owner by the painting with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each of the swine thus +, each line being not less than uine inches long;

(ii.) During the movement the swine shall, except while being moved by railway or vessel, be conveyed in a float, cart or van, and the swine shall not be permitted to come in contact with swine not marked in manner prescribed by this Article;

(iii.) Swine moved under this Order to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse shall after their arrival thereat be there detained until they are slaughtered ;

(iv.) The licence shall be available only for six days including the date thereof.

(3.) For the purposes of this Order licences in the Form D set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, may be used with the necessary adaptations.

(4.) Before a licence is granted by an Inspector under this Order the owner of the swine, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, shall sign, and deliver or send by post to the Inspector, a declaration in the Form E set forth lation of Movement) Order of 1908, or to the like effect, and such declaration shall be retained by the Inspector.

Provision for Movement by Railway through Huntingdonshire.

2. For the purposes of this Order, swine shall not be deemed to be moved from premises in the administrative county of Huntingdon, in any case where they are moved through that county by railway from a place outside that county to another place outside that county without unnecessary delay and without the swine being untrucked within that county.

Suspension of Existing Order.

3. The operation of the Order described in the Schedule hereto is hereby suspended during the operation of this Order.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

4. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

5.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2.) If a person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name

or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.




