The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated November 22nd, from His Majesty's Representative at The Hague, intimating that the Royal Decree of October 18th, 1907, enforcing certain extraordinary measures for the prevention of Asiatic cholera, having lapsed, a fresh Decree was issued on November 13th, 1909, enforcing the same measures for a further period of one year.

The only alteration made in the Decree as re-enacted is that in Article 25, by a Ministerial Decree, the ports of Hellevoetsluis and Neusen have been added to those already designated as ports and roadsteads at which vessels may call when coming from infected countries, or on board of which a case of cholera has occurred during the voyage, before they have undergone sanitary inspection.
