The KING has been pleased to grant unto William Herbert, of Stanhope-gardens, in the Royal Borough of Kensington, Licentiate of the Royal College of Physicians of London, and Member of the Royal College of Surgeons of England, His Royal licence and authority that he and his issue may take the surname of Simpson in lieu of that of Herbert, and that he and they may bear the arms of Simpson, with such distinction as may by the laws of arms be required, the said arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms, and recorded in His Majesty's College of Arms, otherwise the said Royal licence and permission to be void and of none effect.

Order under section 369 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, extending the provisions of sections 413, 414, 415 and 416 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, as amended by the Merchant Shipping Act, 1906 (which deal with the certification of the skippers and second hands of fishing boats, being trawlers of 25 tons tonnage or

upwards) to all fishing boats being liners and drifters of 50 tons gross tonnage and upwards propelled by steam or other mechanical power.

Whereas by section 369 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, it is amongst other things provided as follows that is to say:—

The Board of Trade may by Order published in the London Gazette—

(a) exempt from the date in the Order mentioned any class of such trawler or trawlers belonging to any port from the whole or any portion of Part IV of the said Act, and

(b) extend all or any of the provisions of Part IV of the said Act to any fishing boats referred to in the Order.

And whereas by sections 413 to 416 of the said Act, being provisions of Part IV aforesaid, it is provided as follows:—

413.—(1) A fishing boat, being a trawler of twenty-five tons tonnage or upwards, shall not go to sea from any port of England or Ireland unless provided with a duly certificated skipper and a duly certificated second hand.

(2) If a boat goes to sea contrary to this section, the owner thereof shall for each offence be liable to a fine not exceeding twenty pounds.

(3) If any person except in case of necessity—

(a) having been engaged to serve as skipper or second hand of a fishing boat, being a trawler of twenty-five tons tonnage and upwards, serves as skipper or second hand of that boat without being duly certificated; or

(b) employs any person as skipper or second hand of such a boat without ascertaining that he is duly certificated;

that person shall for each offence be liable to a fine not exceeding twenty pounds.

(4) A skipper or second hand shall not be deemed duly certificated for the purpose of this section unless he holds a certificate under this Part of this Act appropriate to his station in the boat or to a higher station.

(5) Where the skipper of such a boat is absent from his boat a superintendent may, on the request of the owner of the boat, and on being satisfied that the absence is due to an unavoidable cause, authorize the second hand of the boat to act, for a period not exceeding one month, as the skipper of the boat during the skipper's absence, and the second hand when acting under that authority shall for the purposes of this section be deemed to be a duly certificated skipper.

414.—(1) Certificates of competency as skipper or as second hand of fishing boats, or any particular class of fishing boats, may be granted by the Board of Trade in the same manner as certificates of competency as master or mate under the Second Part of this Act, and all the provisions of this Act with respect to or connected with the examination of applicants for certificates and the granting thereof, and the suspension and cancellation thereof, and inquiries and investigations into the conduct of the holders thereof and all other provisions of this Act relating to or connected with certificates of masters or mates, shall apply to the certificates as skipper or second hand of fishing boats, and the holders thereof, as if the certificates had been granted under Part II of this Act, and the holders thereof shall be entitled to such privileges, and subject to such liabilities as they would be if such certificates had been so granted.

(2) A certificate of competency as skipper of a fishing boat shall not be granted to any person unless he has previously held a certificate as second hand for at least twelve months.

415.—(1) If any person before the first day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three served as a skipper or before the first day of July one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight served as a second hand in fishing boats, being trawlers of twenty-five tons tonnage and upwards or such other fishing boats as the Board of Trade consider will have afforded that person sufficient experience, for a period amounting in all to not less than twelve months, that person shall be entitled to a certificate of service as skipper or second hand, as the case may be, of a fishing boat, limited, if he has been exclusively employed in a particular class of such fishing boats, to that particular class.

(2) If a person proves to the Board of Trade that he has served as required by this section and has been generally well conducted on board the boats in which he has served, the Board of Trade shall deliver a certificate of service to him.

(3) The certificate of service shall differ in form from a certificate of competency, and shall contain particulars of the name, place, and date of birth of the holder, and of the length and nature of his previous service.

(4) This Act shall apply to a certificate of service so granted and to the holder thereof in like manner as it applies to a certificate of competency granted under this Part of this Act and to the holder thereof.

416.—(1) The Board of Trade may cause a register of certificated skippers and second hands to be kept in such form and by such person, and containing such particulars, as the Board direct.

(2) Such register shall be admissible in evidence in manner provided by this Act, and the absence of an entry in the register of any person or matter shall be evidence of the non-registration of such person or matter, and if the question is whether the person has been certificated as a skipper or second hand, of his not being so certificated.

And whereas by section 81 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1906, it is provided as follows:—

81.—(1) Sections four hundred and thirteen to four hundred and sixteen of the principal Act (which relate to certificates of skippers and second hands on trawlers) shall apply to fishing boats being trawlers of twenty-five tons tonnage and upwards going to sea from any port of Scotland in like manner as they apply to such fishing boats going to sea from any port of England or Ireland, except that in section four hundred and fifteen the date of the commencement of this Act shall be substituted for the dates mentioned in that section, and Part IV. of the principal Act shall be construed accordingly.

(2) The sections aforesaid as hereby applied to Scotland shall, notwithstanding anything contained in Part IV. of the principal Act, be deemed to be portions or provisions of Part IV. referred to in section three hundred and sixty-nine of the principal Act (conferring power on the Board of Trade to make exempting or extending orders), and that section (with the substitution of the Edinburgh Gazette for the London Gazette) and Part IV. shall be construed accordingly: Provided that any Order to be published in the Edinburgh Gazette under that section shall be subject to the consent of the Secretary for Scotland.

And whereas it is desirable to extend the provisions of the above recited sections to fishing boats, being liners, and drifters of 50 tons gross tonnage and upwards, propelled by steam or other mechanical power.

Now therefore the Board of Trade, in pursuance of the power in them vested by the above recited provisions and of every other power thereunto them enabling do order and it is hereby ordered, that the provisions contained in the above recited sections 413, 414, 415 and 416 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, as amended by the Merchant Shipping Act, 1906, be as from the 1st day of July, 1910, extended and applied to all fishing boats being liners and drifters of 50 tons gross tonnage and upwards propelled by steam or other mechanical power subject to the exemption following that is to say:—as from the said date the provisions of sub-section (4) of section 413 and the penal provisions contained in the above mentioned sections shall not apply to such fishing boats as regards the skipper, nor shall they apply to such fishing boats as regards the second hand if such skipper and/or second hand is validly in possession of an authority issued by the Board of Trade authorizing them to act as skipper or second hand respectively of fishing boats being liners or drifters of 50 tons gross tonnage and upwards propelled by steam or other mechanical power.

BOROUGH OF MORECAMBE.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Morecambe, hereinafter called "the Corporation," have this day made Bye-laws and Regulations under the powers conferred on the Corporation by the Tramways Act, 1870, and the following is a copy of such Bye-laws and Regulations:—

BYE-LAWS AND REGULATIONS made by the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Morecambe, hereinafter called "the Corporation," under the powers conferred on the Corporation by the Tramways Act, 1870.

1. The Bye-laws and Regulations hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to all carriages of the Corporation and to all places with respect to which the Corporation have power to make Bye-laws and Regulations.

2. The expression "conductor" shall include any officer or servant in the employment of the Corporation and having charge of a carriage.

The expression "interior of a carriage" shall not include the upper deck of covered carriages.

3. Every passenger shall enter or depart from a carriage by the hindermost or conductor's platform, and not otherwise. When a carriage stops, no person shall board the carriage until all passengers desiring to alight therefrom shall have done so.

4. No person shall enter, or mount, or leave, or attempt to enter, mount, or leave, any carriage in motion.

5. No passenger shall smoke in the interior of any carriage, and no person shall spit in, on, from or against any carriage.

6. No passenger or other person shall, while travelling in or upon any carriage, play or perform upon any musical instrument.

7. A person in a state of intoxication shall not be allowed to enter or mount upon any carriage, and if found in or upon any carriage shall leave the carriage immediately on being requested to do so by the conductor.

8. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language whilst in or upon any carriage, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

9. No person shall commit any nuisance in, on, or against any carriage, tramway station, waiting room, or premises used in connection with the Corporation's tramways.

10. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the cushions or the linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice, in or on the carriage, or break or scratch any window of or otherwise wilfully damage any carriage. Any person acting in contravention of this regulation shall be liable to the

penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws and Regulations, in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.

11. A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor soil or injure the linings or cushions of the carriage, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or who, in the opinion of the conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall not mount, enter or remain on or in any carriage, and may be prevented from so doing, and, if found on or in any carriage, shall, on request of the conductor, leave the same upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned: Provided that on carriages specially run for artisans, mechanics and daily labourers no person shall be prevented from entering or remaining in or on a carriage under the provisions of this Bye-law, on the ground of the condition of his dress or clothing, if such condition is solely due to the nature of his employment.

12. Each passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the conductor or other duly authorised officer of the Corporation the fare legally demandable for the journey, and obtain a ticket therefor. Any person leaving a car shall be deemed to have completed his journey. No child under three years of age who is sitting on the lap of a passenger shall be liable to pay a fare provided that this provision shall apply only to one such child accompanying any one passenger; any additional child, irrespective of age, accompanying any such passenger shall pay the full ordinary fare.

13. Each passenger shall show his ticket (if any), when required so to do, to the conductor or any duly authorised servant of the Corporation, and shall also, when required so to do, either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

14. A passenger not being an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer, within the true intent and meaning of the statutory provisions relating to the Corporation, shall not use or attempt to use any ticket intended only for such artisans, mechanics, or daily labourers.

15. A passenger travelling in any carriage shall not be entitled to take with him personal luggage exceeding 28 pounds in weight. Personal luggage shall be carried by hand, and shall not occupy any part of a seat or be of a form or description to annoy or inconvenience other passengers.

16. No passenger or other person not being a servant of the Corporation shall travel on the steps or platforms of any carriage, or stand on the upper deck, or sit on the railing of any carriage, and any person so travelling, standing, or sitting shall cease to do so immediately on request by the conductor.

17. No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, shall enter or mount any carriage.

18. No person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of any carriage, or travel therein or thereon otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers, except in the interior of the carriage with the consent of the conductor.

19. When a carriage contains the full licensed number of passengers, a conspicuous notice to that effect shall be placed on the carriage.

20. When any carriage contains the full number of passengers which it is licensed to contain, no additional person shall enter, mount, or remain in or on any such carriage when warned by the conductor not to do so.

21. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or on any carriage, except by permission of the conductor, nor in any case in which the

conveyance of such dog or other animal might be offensive or an annoyance to passengers. No person shall take a dog or other animal into or on any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any carriage in breach of this Regulation shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the carriage immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

22. No person shall travel in or on any carriage of the Corporation with loaded fire-arms.

23. No passenger shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Corporation in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any carriage or tramway of the Corporation, and no person other than the conductor or driver shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards or interfere with the controllers, brakes, lights, ventilators, or any other part of a carriage or its equipment.

24. If at any time a carriage becomes disabled, or in any way damaged, or from any cause unable to proceed, the passengers shall, upon the request of the conductor, leave the same, and if such passengers have paid their fares, they shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of their fares so paid, but on production of their tickets shall be allowed to travel by the next available carriage the remainder of the distance in respect of which they have paid their fares. No person shall, except with the leave of the conductor, enter a disabled or damaged carriage.

25. No person except a tramway official of the Corporation shall travel upon a carriage which is proceeding from the boundary of the borough to the car shed in Heysham, or vice versa.

26. Any person who shall commit, whilst in or on any carriage, any breach of these Bye-laws and Regulations, shall, if the offence is continued, be liable, in addition to incurring the penalty hereinafter provided, to be immediately removed from the carriage by or under the direction of the conductor, and if such person shall have paid his fare, he shall not be entitled to claim its return.

27. The conductor shall enforce these Bye-laws and Regulations, and prevent the breach thereof to the best of his ability.

28. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Bye-laws and Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

29. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each carriage in use a printed copy of these Bye-laws and Regulations.

30. These Bye-laws and Regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of March, 1910.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Lord Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens of the city of Bradford (hereinafter called "the Corporation"), as the promoters and owners of the Bradford Tramways and the Bradford and Leeds Light Railway, at a Meeting of the City Council held on the fourteenth day of December, 1909, within the said city, did make the following Bye-laws and Regulations under the powers conferred on the Corporation by the Tramways Act, 1870, the Bradford Tramways and Improvement Act, 1897, the Bradford and Leeds Light Railway Order, 1899, and the Railway Clauses Act, 1845; and

Further take notice, that the Corporation intend to apply, in accordance with the provisions of the Tramways Act, 1870, to the Board of Trade for confirmation thereof at the end of two calendar months from and after the twenty-seventh day of December instant, being the date by which a true copy of such Bye-laws and Regulations will have been laid before the Board of Trade.

The said Bye-laws and Regulations are as follows:—

1. The heretofore existing Bye-law No. 17, made on the 10th day of June, 1902, relating to the conveyance on the cars of dogs and other animals, is hereby repealed.

2. Except as hereinafter mentioned, no person shall allow or permit any dog or other animal to be in or on any car, or on any part thereof: Provided that any person may allow a dog to accompany him on the floor of the top deck of a tramcar if he first obtain the consent of the conductor and pay on demand the prescribed charge for the dog.

Any person who shall be accompanied by a dog or other animal on any part of a tramcar shall, notwithstanding any consent as hereinbefore mentioned, on the request of the conductor, immediately remove such dog or other animal, and if he shall fail to comply with such request, the dog or other animal may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

Every person failing to comply with or acting in contravention of this bye-law shall be deemed to be guilty of an offence under and may be dealt with as prescribed in the now existing Bye-laws and Regulations made by the Local Authority on the 10th day of June, 1902.

These Bye-laws and Regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of March, 1910.
