Shropshire.—An Area in the administrative county of Salop comprising the petty sessional division of Oswestry, the borough of Oswestry, and the parishes of Ellesmere Rural (including its detached part), Ellesmere Urban, and Welshampton (30 October, 1909).

Suffolk, East.—An Area comprising the parishes of Felixstowe, Walton, Trimley St. Mary, Trimley St. Martin, Falkenham, Kirton, Stratton Hall, Levington, Bucklesham, Hemley Waldringfield, Newbourn, and Brightwell, in the administrative county of East Suffolk (4 December, 1909).
