PORT OF LONDON ACT, 1908.

Maximum Port Rates on Goods.

Notice is hereby given, that in compliance with section 13 of the Port of London Act, 1908, the Port of London Authority have submitted to the Board of Trade a Schedule of maximum port rates on goods and that a Provisional Order embodying the Schedule, with or without modifications, will be made by the Board of Trade and submitted to Parliament for confirmation.

The Provisional Order will authorise the Port Authority to levy port rates on goods not exceeding those set out in the Schedules thereto in respect of goods imported into or exported from the Port of London from or to parts beyond the seas or coastwise subject to such exemptions and rebates as may be specified in the Order and will or may contain provisions relating to the collection and recovery of such rates and matters incidental thereto, and to the making of special arrangements respecting the time and method of payment of the port rates by any persons who at frequent intervals become liable to pay such rates and for other purposes.

The draft Provisional Order will be open to public inspection at all reasonable hours at the offices of the Port of London Authority, 109, Leadenhall-street, E.C., the London Chamber of Commerce, Oxford-court, Cannon-street, E.C., and the Commercial Intelligence Branch of the Board of Trade, 73, Basinghall-street, E.C.

Copies of the draft Provisional Order may be purchased, either directly or through any bookseller, from Messrs. Wyman and Sons Limited, Fetter-lane, E.C., at the price of one shilling each.

Any representations or objections with regard to the draft Provisional Order may be made by letter addressed to the Assistant Secretary, Harbour Department, Board of Trade, 7, White-hall-gardens, S.W., on or before Friday, the 18th February, 1910, and a copy of such representations or objections must at the same time be sent to the Secretary of the Port of London Authority, 109, Leadenhall-street, E.C., and the Board of Trade must be informed that this has been done.

The Board of Trade have received a copy of the following Quarantine Notice, dated January 20th, issued by the Governor of Malta:—

GOVERNMENT NOTICE. No. 23.

It is hereby notified that His Excellency the Governor, acting upon the advice of the Council of Health, has been pleased to order that Government Notice No. 176 of the 14th September, 1909, shall be repealed, and that the following Regulations shall be observed as regards the importation of the articles hereinafter mentioned, until further notice:—

- 1. The importation of the following articles is prohibited:
 - (a) Coffee beans or ground coffee, coloured with substances injurious to health.
 - (b) Vines and fruit packed in vine leaves.
 - (c) Grapes, unless accompanied by an antiphylloxeric certificate signed by the proper authority, and unless subjected to examination by the Inspector of Agriculture on arrival.
- (d) Cotton-seed from the district of Terranova in Sicily.
- (e) Cotton seed from other places, unless accompanied by a certificate from the British Consular Authority, or, where there is no such authority, from the local Government

Authority, to the effect that anthrax is not prevalent in the district in which such cotton seed was grown.

- (f) Potatoes imported from the United Kingdom, unless accompanied by the following documents, viz.:
- (i) a Statutory Declaration by the shipper, naming the place of origin and stating that such potatoes were not grown on land infected with Black Scab;
- (ii) a Certificate from an Officer of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, in the case of potatoes imported from England and Scotland, or from an officer of the Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction, in the case of potatoes imported from Ireland, stating that the locality in which the potatoes were grown is free from that disease.

Consignments of potatoes not accompanied by the documents above mentioned shall, on importation, be liable to be inspected at the expense of the consignee, by the Inspector of Agriculture, who may give such directions and take such steps as he may consider necessary.

Paragraph (b) of this article does not apply to the United Kingdom.

- 2. The importation of cuttings or shoots of the American or other vines, except from the United Kingdom, is prohibited, unless the goods are accompanied by an antiphylloxeric certificate, in accordance with the Berne International Conference of 1881, signed before a British Consular Authority, or unless the goods be subjected to examination and disinfection by the Inspector of Agriculture.
- 3. The importation of plants, roots or garden soil from any port in the Mediterranean is prohibited, unless the goods be accompanied by an antiphylloxeric certificate signed by the proper authority.
- 4. Cereals imported in infected ships shall be kept for 21 days at the Lazaretto, or other place to be appointed by the Superintendent of Public Health, and shall be aired under the direction of the Quarantine Authorities.
- 5. The words "infected ships," in these regulations, have the same meaning as in the Regulations published by Government Notice No. 165 of the 28th August, 1908.
