TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Monday, the 14th instant, at one o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Acts 40 Vic., cap. 2, 52 Vic., cap. 6, and 9 Ed. VII, c. 5, to the amount of £3,500,000, of which £3,000,000 will be in replacement of Bills falling due on the 17th instant and £500,000 will be an additional issue.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £1,000, £5,000, or £10,000, and will be dated the 17th February, 1910. Bills for £1,500,000 will be payable at *six months* after date, viz.:—on the 17th August, 1910, and Bills for £2,000,000 will be payable at *one month* after date, viz.:—on the 17th March, 1910.
