TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Wednesday, the 23rd instant, at one o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Acts 40 Vic., cap. 2, 52 Vic., cap. 6, and 9 Ed. VII, c. 5, to the amount of £4,000,000.
2. The Bills will be in amounts of £1,000, £5,000, or £10,000. They will be dated the 28th February, 1910, and will be payable at one

month after date, viz. :—on the 28th March, 1910.

3. *The Tenders must specify the net amount per cent. which will be given for the amounts applied for, and the Tenders of private individuals must be made through a London Banker.*

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same on Thursday, the 24th instant, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England not later than three o'clock on Monday, the 28th February, 1910.

6. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

PORT OF LONDON ACT, 1908.

Whereas Bye-laws for the Regulation of the River Thames and the Navigation thereof, made by the Conservators of the River Thames in exercise of the powers and authority vested in them by the Thames Conservancy Act, 1894, were confirmed by the Board of Trade on the 27th day of April, 1898, and have not been repealed, altered or superseded :

And whereas by section 7 of the Port of London Act, 1908, it is enacted that, subject to the provisions of that Act, as from the appointed day there shall be transferred to the Port of
