London Authority all rights, powers, and duties of the Conservators of the River Thames in respect of the River Thames below the landward limit of the Port of London, and that all enactments relating to the Conservators (except those regulating the funds and accounts of and borrowing by the Conservators) shall, so far as not repealed by that Act and so far as they relate to the rights, powers, duties, property and liabilities transferred, have effect as if references to the Port of London Authority were substituted for references to the Conservators, provided, inter alia, that in the definition of "the Thames" in section 3 of the Thames Conservancy Act, 1894, for "an imaginary straight line drawn from the entrance to Yantlet Creek, in the county of Kent," there shall be substituted "the seaward limit of the Port of London":

And whereas by the fifth schedule to the said Act the seaward limit of the Port of London is declared to be an imaginary straight line drawn from the pilot mark at the entrance of Havengore Creek, in the county of Essex, to the Land's End at Warden Point, in the Isle of Sheppey, in the

county of Kent:

And whereas by section 49 of the Port of London Act, 1908, the expression "appointed day" means the thirty-first day of March, 1909, or such earlier or later day as the Board of Trade may appoint, and the Board of Trade have not appointed any such earlier or later day for the transfer to the Port of London Authority of the rights, powers, and duties of the Conservators of the River Thames:

And whereas by virtue of section 58 of the said Act, all Bye-laws, rules, and regulations made or enforceable by the Conservators of the River Thames shall, so far as they are not inconsistent with the provisions of the said Act and until repealed, altered, or superseded, remain in force in like manner and to the like extent as if the Act had not been passed, provided that any Bye-laws, rules or regulations made or imposed in pursuance of any power by the said Act transferred from the Conservators of the River Thames to the Port of London Authority shall, subject to any Order made by the Board of Trade, extend throughout the area within which the power in pursuance of which they were made or imposed is for the time being exerciseable by the Port of London Authority:

And whereas the Port of London Authority have made application to the Board of Trade for an Order limiting the operation of certain of the aforesaid Bye-laws to the area in which they were in force before the passing of the said Act:

were in force before the passing of the said Act:
Now therefore, the Board of Trade, in exercise
of the powers conferred on them by the said
Act, hereby order that Numbers 30, 34, and 36
to 53, both inclusive, of the said Bye-laws shall
be in force and have effect only within that part
of the Port of London which lies to the westward
of a line drawn from the Crowstone, Leigh, to
Yantlet Creek.
