#### PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter fifty, and of the Act of the twenty-third and twentyfourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and twenty-four, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the twentieth day of January, in the year one thousand nine hundred and ten, in the words and figures following, that is to

say:—
"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter fifty, and of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and twenty-four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting an exchange of the patronage of the benefice (being a perpetual curacy) of Saint James, Nottingham, situate in the city and county of the city of Nottingham and in the diocese of Southwell, for the patronage of the benefice (being a rectory) of Sandiacre, situate in the county of Dorby and in the diocese. situate in the county of Derby and in the diocese of Southwell.

"Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Saint James, Nottingham, is vested in Your Majesty, Your heirs and successors in right of the Crown, and such right of patronage and presentation is exercised on behalf of Your Majesty by the Lord High Chancellor for Great

Britain for the time being.
"And whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Sandiacre is vested in the Bishop of Southwell for the time being.

"And whereas the Right Honourable Robert Threshie, Baron Loreburn, now Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, acting on behalf of Your Majesty as aforesaid, and the Right Reverend Edwyn, now Bishop of Southwell, have respectively signified to us their desire that the patronage of the said two benefices of Saint James, Nottingham, and Sandiacre may be arranged by way of exchange in the manner which is hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"And whereas we have made due enquiry and calculation as to the circumstances and relative value of the said two benefices and of the patronage thereof respectively and we do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council that the circumstances and present values of the said two benefices are as set forth in the schedule hereunto annexed.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said Robert Threshie, Baron Loreburn, acting as Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) and with the consent of the said Edwyn, Bishop of Southwell, acting as such Bishop (in testimony whereof he has affixed his hand and his episcopal seal to this scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law. other than such duly gazetted Order the whole advowson or perpetual

right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Saint James, Nottingham, and the church thereof shall be assigned and transferred from Your Majesty, Your heirs and successors to the said Edwyn, Bishop of Southwell, and his successors in the same bishoprick, and shall become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time and at all times be exercised by the said Edwyn, Bishop of Southwell, and his successors in the same bishoprick for ever, and that in exchange for the same the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Sandiacre and the church thereof shall in like manner and upon and from the same date be assigned and transferred from the said Edwyn,

Bishop of Southwell and from his successors, and shall become and be absolutely vested in Your Majesty, Your heirs and successors for ever, and shall and may from time to time and at all times be exercised on behalf of Your Majesty by the said Robert Threshie, Baron Loreburn, as Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, or other the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain for the time being.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of

Parliament.

WHEREAS by treaty, grant, usage, sufferance, and other lawful means His Majesty the King has jurisdiction within Northern

Nigeria.

And whereas by section 5 of the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, it is provided that it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council if He thinks fit by Order to direct that all or any of the enactments described in the First Schedule to that Act or any enactments for the time being in force amending or substituted for the same, shall extend, with or without any exceptions, adaptations, or modifications in the Order mentioned, to any foreign country in which for the time being

His Majesty has jurisdiction, and that thereupon those enactments shall, to the extent of that jurisdiction, operate as if that country were a British possession, and as if His Majesty in Council were the Legislature of that possession.

And whereas the Admiralty Offences (Colonial) Act, 1849, sections seven and eleven of the Evidence Act, 1851, the Evidence by Commission Act, 1859, the British Law Ascertainment Act, 1859, the Foreign Law Ascertainment Act, 1861, and the Evidence by Commission Act, 1885, are enactments described in the First Schedule to the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, and it is expedient that the said Acts should be extended to Northern Nigeria.

And whereas the Foreign Tribunals Evidence Act, 1856, as amended by the Extradition Act, 1870, was extended to Northern Nigeria by an Order of His Majesty in Council bearing date the tenth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and nine.

Now, therefore, His Majesty by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order and it is hereby ordered as follows:-

I. This Order may be cited as the Northern Nigeria (Imperial Statutes Extensions) Order,

II. The above recited Order in Council bearing date the tenth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and nine, shall from henceforth be revoked without prejudice to anything duly or

lawfully done thereunder.

III. (1) The Admiralty Offences (Colonial) Act, 1849, sections seven and eleven of the Evidence Act, 1851, the Foreign Tribunals Evidence Act, 1856, as amended by the Extradition Act, 1870, the Evidence by Commission Act, 1859, the British Law Ascertainment Act, 1859, the Foreign Law Ascertainment Act, 1861, and the Evidence by Commission Act, 1885, shall extend and be applied for all purposes to Northern Nigeria as if it were a British Possession.

(2) In the said Acts the Supreme Court of Northern Nigeria and any Judge thereof are hereby substituted for a Supreme Court or a Judge of a Court in a Colony or a Superior Court

in a Colony, as the case may be.

removed:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to authorize us at our discretion to continue payment of Flag allowances notwithstanding the fact that the Flag Ship concerned may have passed beyond the limits of the station:

"We would further recommend that this provision should take effect as from the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and nine:

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice that on the 21st instant, he made an Order under section 6 of the Coal Mines Regulation Act, 1896, entitled "The Explosives in Coal Mines Order of the 21st February, 1910," which revokes and consolidates the existing Orders with the following alterations, viz.:—the addition to the List of Permitted Explosives of two explosives, viz.:—Arctic Carbonite and Stomonal; the omission from the List of six explosives, viz.:—Ammonal, Albionite, Permitite, Permonite, Thunderite and Titanite: and a change in the designation of the explosive Permonite II which has been altered to Permonite.

The Order comes into force on the 1st March, 1910.

# CINEMATOGRAPH, ENGLAND.

REGULATIONS, DATED FEBRUARY 18, 1910, MADE BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE UNDER THE CINEMATOGRAPH ACT, 1909 (9 Edw. 7, c. 30).

In pursuance of the power vested in me by the Cinematograph Act, 1909 (9 Edw. 7, c. 30), I hereby make the following regulations:-

# GENERAL.

1. In these regulations the word "building" shall be deemed to include any booth, tent, or similar structure.

2. No building shall be used for cinematograph or other similar exhibitions to which the Act applies, unless it be provided with an adequate number of clearly indicated exits so placed and maintained as readily to afford the audience ample means of safe egress.

The seating in the building shall be so arranged as not to interfere with free access to the exits; and the gangways and the staircases, and the passages leading to the exits shall, during the presence of the public in the building, be

kept clear of obstructions.

3. The cinematograph operator and all persons responsible for or employed in or in connection with the exhibition shall take all due precautions for the prevention of accidents, and shall abstain from any act whatever which tends to cause fire and is not reasonably necessary for the purpose of the exhibition.

### FIRE APPLIANCES.

4. Fire appliances adequate for the protection of the building shall be provided, and shall include at least the following, namely, a damp blanket, two buckets of water, and a bucket of dry sand. In a building used habitually for the purpose of cinematograph or other similar exhibitions they shall also include a sufficient number of hand grenades or other portable fireextinguishers.

The fire appliances shall be so disposed that there shall be sufficient means of dealing with fire readily available for use within the enclosure. Before the commencement of each performance the cinematograph operator shall satisfy himself that the fire appliances intended for use

within the enclosure are in working order, and during the peformance such appliances shall be in the charge of some person specially nominated for that purpose, who shall see that they are kept constantly available for use.

#### ENCLOSURES.

Regulations applying in all cases and to all classes of buildings.

5.—(1) (a.) The cinematograph apparatus shall be placed in an enclosure of substantial construction made of or lined internally with fire-resisting material and of sufficient dimensions to allow the operator to work freely.

(b.) The entrance to the enclosure shall be suitably placed and shall be fitted with a selfclosing close-fitting door constructed of fire-

resisting material.

(c.) The openings through which the necessary pipes and cables pass into the enclosure shall be

efficiently bushed.

(d.) The openings in the front face of the enclosure shall not be larger than is necessary for effective projection, and shall not exceed two Each such opening shall be for each lantern. fitted with a screen of fire-resisting material, which can be released both inside and outside the enclosure so that it automatically closes with a close-fitting joint.

(e.) The door of the enclosure and all openings, bushes and joints shall be so constructed and maintained as to prevent, so far as possible, the escape of any smoke into the auditorium. means of ventilation are provided, they shall not be allowed to communicate direct with the audi-

torium.

(f.) If the enclosure is inside the auditorium, either a suitable barrier shall be placed round the enclosure at a distance of not less than two feet from it, or other effectual means shall be taken to prevent the public from coming into contact with the enclosure.

 $\pi(g.)$  No unauthorised person shall go into the enclosure or be allowed to be within the

barrier.

(h.) No smoking shall at any time be permitted within the barrier or enclosure.

(i.) No inflammable article shall unnecessarily be taken into or allowed to remain in the enclosure.

# Regulations applying only to specified classes of buildings.

(2) In the case of buildings used habitually for cinematograph or other similar exhibitions, the enclosure shall be placed outside the auditorium; and in the case of permanent buildings used habitually as aforesaid the enclosure shall also be permanent.

Provided, with regard to the foregoing requirements, that, if the licensing authority is of opinion that compliance with either or both of them is impracticable or in the circumstances unnecessary for securing safety, and shall have stated such opinion by express words in the licence, the requirement or requirements so specified shall not apply.

# LANTERNS, PROJECTORS AND FILMS.

6. Lanterns shall be placed on firm supports constructed of fire-resisting material, and shall be provided with a metal shutter which can be readily inserted between the source of light and the film-gate.

The film-gate shall be of massive construction and shall be provided with ample heat-radiating surface. The passage for the film shall be sufficiently narrow to prevent flame travelling upwards or downwards from the light-opening.

7. Cinematograph projectors shall be fitted with two metal film-boxes of substantial construction, and not more than fourteen inches in diameter, inside measurement, and to and from these the films shall be made to travel. The film-boxes shall be made to close in such a manner, and shall be fitted with a film-slot so constructed, as to prevent the passage of flame to the interior of the box.

8. Spools shall be chain or gear driven and films shall be wound upon spools so that the wound film shall not at any time reach or project beyond the edges of the flanges of the

spool.

9. During the exhibition all films when not in use shall be kept in closed metal boxes.

#### LIGHTING.

10. Where the general lighting of the auditorium and exits can be controlled from within the enclosure, there shall also be separate and independent means of control outside and away from the enclosure.

11. No illuminant other than electric light or limelight shall be used within the lantern.

#### Electric Light.

12.—(a.) Within the enclosure the insulating material of all electric cables, including "leads" to lamps, shall be covered with fire-resisting material.

(b.) There shall be no unnecessary slack electric cable within the enclosure. The "leads" to the cinematograph lamp shall, unless conveyed within a metal pipe, or other suitable casing, be kept well apart both within and without the enclosure, and shall run so that the course of

each may be readily traced.

(c.) Cables for cinematograph lamps shall be taken as separate circuits from the source of supply and from the supply side of the main fuses in the general lighting circuit, and there shall be efficient switches and fuses inserted at the point where the supply is taken, and in addition, an efficient double-pole switch shall be fitted in the cinematograph lamp circuit inside the enclosure. When the cinematograph lamp is working, the pressure of the current across the terminals of the double-pole switch inside the enclosure shall not exceed 110 volts.

(d.) Resistances shall be made entirely of fireresisting material, and shall be so constructed and maintained that no coil or other part shall at any time become unduly heated.\* All resistances, with the exception of a resistance for regulating purposes, shall be placed outside the enclosure and, if reasonably practicable, outside the auditorium. If inside the auditorium, they shall be adequately protected by a wire guard or other efficient means of preventing accidental contact.

efficient means of preventing accidental contact.

The operator shall satisfy himself before the commencement of each performance that all cables, leads, connections, and resistances are in proper working order. The resistances, if not under constant observation, shall be inspected at least once during each performance. If any fault is detected, current shall be immediately switched off, and shall remain switched off until the fault has been remedied.

Limelight.

. 13.—(a) If limelight be used in the lantern the gas cylinders shall be tested and filled in conformity with the requirements set out in the Appendix hereto. The tubing shall be of sufficient strength to resist pressure from without and shall be properly connected up.

(b.) No gas shall be stored or used save in containers constructed in accordance with the requirements contained in the Appendix.

#### LICENCES.

14. Every licence granted under the Act shall contain specific conditions for the carrying out of regulations 2 and 5 (1) (a), (b), (c), (d), (e), (f) in the building for which the licence is granted, and may, in accordance with regulation 5 (2), contain an expression of opinion on the matters referred to in the proviso thereto.

15. Subject to the provisions of No. 16 of these regulations, every licence granted under the Act shall contain a clause providing for its lapse, or, alternatively, for its revocation by the licensing authority, if any alteration is made in the building or the enclosure without the sanction

of the said authority.

16. Where a licence has been granted under the Act in respect of a moveable building, a plan and description of the building, certified with the approval of the licensing authority, shall be attached to the licence. Such a licence may provide that any of the conditions or restrictions contained therein may be modified either by the licensing authority or by the licensing authority of the district where an exhibition is about to be given. The licence and plan and description or any of them shall be produced on demand to any police constable or to any person authorised by the licensing authority or by the authority in whose district the building is being or is about to be used for the purpose of an exhibition.

17. The regulations dated December 20th, 1909, made under the Cinematograph Act, 1909, are hereby repealed, provided, nevertheless, that any licence granted prior to such repeal shall remain valid for the period for which it was granted without the imposition of any more stringent condition than may have been imposed at the

time of the grant.

# Appendix.

# LIMELIGHT.

The gas cylinders shall be tested and filled in conformity with the requirements set out below, which follow the recommendations of the Departmental Committee of the Home Office on the Manufacture of Compressed Gas Cylinders [C. 7952 of 1896]:—

Cylinders of Compressed Gas (Oxygen, Hydrogen, or Coal Gas).

(a) Lap-welded wrought iron.—Greatest working pressure, 120 atmospheres, or 1,800 lbs. per square inch.

Stress due to working pressure not to

exceed 61 tons per square inch.

Proof pressure in hydraulic test, after annealing, 224 atmospheres, or 3,360 lbs. per square inch.

Permanent stretch in hydraulic test not to exceed 10 per cent. of the elastic stretch.

One cylinder in 50 to be subjected to a statical bending test, and to stand crushing nearly flat between two rounded knife-edges without cracking.

(b) Lap-welded or seamless steel.—Greatest working pressure, 120 atmospheres, or 1,800

lbs. per square inch.

<sup>\*</sup> e.g., they should not become so heated that a piece of newspaper placed in contact with any part of the resistance would readily ignite.

Stress due to working pressure not to exceed 7 tons per square inch in lap-welded, or 8 tons per square inch in seamless cylinders.

Carbon in steel not to exceed 0.25 per cent.

or iron to be less than 99 per cent.

Tenacity of steel not to be less than 26 or more than 33 tons per square inch. Ultimate elongation not less than 1.2 inches in 8 inches. Test-bar to be cut from finished annealed cylinder.

Proof pressure in hydraulic test, after annealing, 224 atmospheres, or 3,360 lbs. per

square inch.

Permanent stretch shown by water jacket not to exceed 10 per cent. of elastic stretch.

One cylinder in 50 to be subjected to a statical bending test, and to stand crushing nearly flat between rounded knife-edges without cracking.

# Regulations applicable to all Cylinders.

Cylinders to be marked with a rotation number, a manufacturer's or owner's mark, an annealing mark with date, a test mark with date. The marks to be permanent and easily visible.

Testing to be repeated at least every two years, and annealing at least every four years.

A record to be kept of all tests.

Cylinders which fail in testing to be destroyed or rendered useless.

Hydrogen and coal gas cylinders to have left-handed threads for attaching connections and to be painted red.

The compressing apparatus to have two pressure gauges, and an automatic arrangement for preventing overcharging. The comment for preventing overcharging. The compressing apparatus for oxygen to be wholly distinct and unconnected with the compressing apparatus for hydrogen and coal gas.

Cylinders not to be refilled till they have

been emptied.

If cylinders are sent out unpacked the valve fittings should be protected by a steel cap.

A minimum weight to be fixed for each size of cylinder in accordance with its required thickness. Cylinders of less weight to be rejected.

HERTFORDSHIRE (PARASITIC MANGE) ORDER OF 1910.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1909, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

# Definition of Parasitic Mange.

1. The expression "parasitic mange" in this Order means sarcoptic mange or psoroptic mange.

# Separation of Diseased and Suspected Animals and Notice of Disease.

2.—(1.) Every person having in his possession or under his charge a horse, ass, or mule affected with or suspected of parasitic mange shall (a) as far as practicable keep that animal separate from animals not so affected or suspected; and (b) with all practicable speed give notice of the fact of the horse, ass, or mule being so affected or suspected to a constable of the police force for the police area in which the horse, ass, or mule so affected or suspected is.

(2.) The constable receiving such notice shall forthwith give information of the receipt by him of the notice to an Inspector of the Local Authority, who shall forthwith report the same

to the Local Authority.

# Veterinary Inquiry by Local Authority as to existence of Parasitic Mange.

3.—(1.) The Local Authority on receiving information of the existence, or supposed existence, of parasitic mange shall forthwith cause inquiry to be instituted as to the correctness of such information with the assistance and advice of a Veterinary Inspector, or of a veterinary practitioner qualified according to the Act of 1894 to be a Veterinary Inspector.

(2.) The owner and occupier of any premises on which there is a horse, ass or mule affected with, or suspected of, parasitic mange, shall give all reasonable facilities for the inquiry by the Local Authority under this Article, and any person failing to give such facilities shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

# Detention of Animals.

4.—(1.) A Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority may serve a Notice (in the Form A set forth in the First Schedule to this Order, or to the like effect) on the occupier of any stable, shed, field or other premises in which there is a horse, ass, or mule, which in his opinion is affected with parasitic mange, and thereupon the following restrictions shall take effect :-

(i.) The horse, ass, or mule so affected shall not be moved out of the stable, shed, field or other premises specified in the Notice, except with the written authority, and under the supervision, of an Inspector of the Local Authority, and only to some other place of detention; and during the detention it shall from time to time, as often as may be necessary, be treated by the owner thereof with some dressing or other remedy for parasitic mange approved for that purpose by a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority;

(ii.) No other horse, ass, or mule shall be. moved out of the stable, shed, field, or other premises, unless on each occasion immediately

before the movement it is treated with some dressing or other remedy for parasitic mange approved for that purpose by a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority.

(2.) A Notice under this Order shall remain in force until it is withdrawn by a Notice in writing served on the occupier of the premises by an Inspector of the Local Authority.

Regulations of Local Authority as to Cleansing and Disinfection.

5.—(1.) The Local Authority may, for the purpose of preventing the spreading of parasitic mange, make Regulations for the following pur-

poses, or any of them:

(i.) For providing for the cleansing and disinfection of any place used by, and of utensils, mangers, feeding-troughs, pens, hurdles, harness, or other things used for or about, any horse, ass, or mule affected with or suspected of parasitic mange:

(ii.) For prescribing the mode in which such cleansing and disinfection are to be

effected:

(iii.) For requiring the owner, lessee, or occupier of any such place to cleanse and disinfect any such place, utensils, mangers, feedingtroughs, pens, hurdles, harness, or other things, at the expense of the Local Authority, or at the expense of such owner, lessee, or occupier:

(iv.) For requiring the removal by the owner from contact with horses, asses, or mules, of litter used for or about any horse, ass, or mule affected with or suspected of para-

(2.) The mode of disinfection shall be one of those prescribed by the Diseases of Animals (Dis-

infection) Order of 1906.

sitic mange.

(3.) If any person fail to cleanse and disinfect any place or any utensil, manger, feeding-trough, pen, hurdle, harness, or other thing, or to remove any litter, in accordance with any such Regulation, it shall be lawful for the Local Authority, without prejudice to the recovery of any penalty for the infringement of such Regulation, to cause such place or such utensil, manger, feeding-trough, pen, hurdle, harness, or other thing, to be cleansed and disinfected, or to remove such litter, and to recover summarily the expenses thereby incurred from such person.

(4.) Where the power conferred by the preceding provisions of this Article is exercised by the Local Authority, the owner, lessee, or occupier of the place to be cleansed and disinfected shall give all reasonable facilities for that

purpose.

Provisions as to Regulations of Local Authority.
6.—(1.) The Local Authority shall forthwith send to the Board two copies of every Regula-

tion made by them under this Order.

(2.) If the Board are satisfied on inquiry, with respect to any Regulation made by the Local Authority under this Order, that the same is for any reason objectionable, and direct the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate.

#### Extension of certain Sections of Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

7. Horses, asses, and mules shall be animals, and parasitic mange of horses, asses, and mules (in this Order called parasitic mange) shall be a disease for the purposes of this Order and of the following sections of the Act of 1894 (namely):

Section forty-three (Police);
Section forty-four (General Administrative

Provisions);

and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or

consequent on the provisions of those sections and this Order, including such sections as relate to offences or procedure.

# Exemption of Army Veterinary Service and Veterinary Colleges.

8. Nothing in this Order applies to any horse, ass, or mule kept in stables of military barracks or camps under the care and supervision of the Army Veterinary Service, or in stables of any Veterinary College affiliated to the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons.

# Offences.

9.—(1.) If a horse, ass, or mule is moved in contravention of this Order, or of a Notice under this Order, the owner of the horse, ass, or mule, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the horse, ass, or mule is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If anything is omitted to be done as regards cleansing or disinfection in contravention of this Order, or of any Regulation made thereunder, the owner and the lessee and the occupier and the person in charge of any place or thing in or in respect of which the same is omitted, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence

against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If any owner, occupier, or person in charge of premises requiring to be cleansed and disinfected fails to give the facilities to a Local Authority required under this Order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
