WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Oxford) Order, 1910.

Dated 28th February, 1910.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of the Administrative County of Oxford, I hereby make the following Order:-

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as the Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Oxford) Order, 1910.

BIRDS.

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

II. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, does not extend, the killing or taking of the Goldfinch, the Kingfisher and the Owl (all species) is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Oxford.

The Eggs of the Goldfineh, Kingfisher and Owl protected.

III. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of the Goldfinch, the Kingfisher and the Owl (all species) is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Oxford.

Repeal of former Order.

IV. The Order of the 19th day of February, 1909, is hereby repealed.
