The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the first and second years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and seven; of the Act of the second and third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the twentieth day of January, in the year one thousand nine hundred and ten, in the words following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the first and second years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and seven; of the Act of the second and third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Peter, situate at Shipley, in the district parish of Shipley-cum-Heaton, in the county of York and in the diocese of Ripon.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint Peter, situate at Shipley, as aforesaid.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend William Boyd, Bishop of Ripon, as such Bishop, and with the consent of the Reverend Arthur William Cribb, Clerk in Holy Orders, the Vicar or Incumbent of the vicarage of the said district parish of Shipley-cum-Heaton (testified by their having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said district parish of Shipley-cum-Heaton, which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint Peter, situate at Shipley, as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Peter, Shipley.'

"And with the like consent of the said William Boyd, Bishop of Ripon, and of the said Arthur William Cribb (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church of Saint Peter, situate at Shipley, as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the Minister of the same church for the time being: Provided

always, that so long as the said Arthur William Cribb, the present Vicar or Incumbent of the vicarage of the said district parish of Shipleycum-Heaton shall continue to be such Vicar or Incumbent, all the fees which may be received in respect of such publication, solemnization, or performance at the said church of Saint Peter, situate at Shipley, as aforesaid, shall be paid over by the Minister thereof to the said Arthur William Cribb, and provided also that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us, the said Commissioners, to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal wisdom, shall seem

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint Peter, Shipley,

"All that part of the district parish of Shipley-cum-Heaton in the county of York and in the diocese of Ripon, which is bounded upon the south by the new parish of Saint Barnabas, Heaton, upon the west partly by the new parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Cottingley, and partly by the new parish of the Holy Trinity, Bingley, upon the north partly by the last named new parish and partly by the new parish of Saint John, Baildon, all in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint John, Baildon, from the said district parish of Shipley-cum-Heaton at the centre of the bridge which carries Victoria-road across the River Aire, and extending thence southward along the middle of Victoria-road for a distance of twenty-nine chains or thereabouts to its junction with Bingley-road, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Bingley-road for a distance of three chains or thereabouts to its junction with Clifton-road, and extending thence southward along the middle of Cliftonroad for a distance of eleven chains or thereabouts to its junction with Fern Hill-road, and continuing thence southward in precisely the same direction and in a straight line for a distance of sixteen chains or thereabouts to a point on the northern side of Old Spring Wood in the middle of the footpath which runs from Bradford-road into High Bank-lane, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of twenty-two chains or thereabouts to its junction with High Bank-lane, and extending thence southward along the middle of High Bank-lane for a distance of two chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with the footpath leading to the house called Heaton Shay, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of such footpath for a distance of nine chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said district parish of Shipley-cum-Heaton from the said new parish of Saint Barnabas, Heaton: Provided always that the territory known as 'The Hirst Wood Burial Ground' shall be excepted from the said part of the district parish of Shipley-cum-Heaton and shall not be included in the said proposed district chapelry of Saint Peter, Shipley.

And whereas the said representation has been

approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Ripon.

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted inter alia that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, seaman or marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Order in Council of Her late Majesty, bearing date the fifteenth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, it is provided that, when Officers on the Reserved, Retired or Pension Lists of the Navy are called out for service in time of war or emergency, they shall count such service for increase of retired pay or pension, subject to the limitations of the maximum rates assigned to their ranks:

"And whereas it is found that the re-assessment on this basis of the retired pay or pension of Officers in respect of such service would give rise to difficulties and anomalies which would be obviated by granting them a bonus on the amount of full pay earned in lieu of increase of

retired pay or pension:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the payment to Officers on the Retired or Pension Lists of the Royal Navy, when called out for service in time of war or emergency, of a bonus of twenty-five per cent for every pound of the full pay of their rank, earned by them, exclusive of allowances; the Order in Council of Her late Majesty above quoted being repealed accordingly.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have expressed their concurrence in this proposal."

HEREAS the Local Government Board. after giving to the Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the parish of Nether Wasdale, in the county of Cumberland, ten days' previous notice of their intention to make such representation have, under the provisions of the Burial Act, 1853, made a representation stating that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial ground in the civil parish of Nether Wasdale aforesaid, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, and that burials should be discontinued therein, as follows, viz.:—

NETHER WASDALE, CUMBERLAND.—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Nether Wasdale; and in the churchyard,

except as follows:

(a) In the walled graves now existing in the said churchyard and belonging or reputed to belong to the Musgrave and Paitson families, burial of the body of one member of the family to which the grave belongs or is reputed to belong, may be allowed subject to the condition that the coffin be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented:

(b) In the said churchyard, in grave spaces in which no interment has heretofore taken place, the burial may be allowed of the bodies of Hannah Wilson and William Tyson, at their decease, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall in either case, be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council on the eighteenth day of April next.

And His Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the parish affected by such representation one month before the said eighteenth day of April.

GENERAL REGULATIONS respecting Open Competitive Examinations for Situations in the Civil Service, included in Schedule A of the Order in Council of 10th January, 1910.

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration at any time.

1. Competitive Examinations of Candidates for situations in the different public Departments will be held at such times and at such places as

may be deemed expedient. Before every such examination Special Regulations will be issued, in which the particular conditions of the competition will be specified.

- 2. These examinations will have reference either to the vacancies existing at the time of the examination, or to the number which may be estimated as likely to occur within any period not exceeding six months after the commencement of the examination, or to vacancies occurring within any period not exceeding six months from the date of the announcement of the result of the examination.
- 3. These examinations are open to all naturalborn or naturalized British subjects, being of the requisite age, health, and character, subject to such restrictions as are herein contained, and to Special Regulations affecting the particular situations:
 - (i.) The following persons are ineligible, viz. :-Members of the Royal Irish Constabulary of less than five years' service.
 - (ii.) The following classes of persons are eligible under certain conditions only, that is to say:
 - (a) Persons actually serving in the Army. (b) Persons actually serving in the Navy.
 - (c) Persons holding situations in the Civil Service.
 - (d) Members of the Royal Irish Constabulary, of more than five years' service.
 - (e) Probationary Engineer Cadets in the Navy, and Apprentices in His Majesty's Dockyards.
 - (f) Persons who have entered upon or completed a course of education or training for the occupation of teacher, on account of which grants are payable from the Exchequer.

(g) Persons who have been trained in the Customs and Excise Branch of the Govern-

ment Laboratory.

No person actually serving in the Army will be eligible unless he produces to the Civil Service Commissioners, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to attend the examination, dated before the commencement of the competition and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued by or under the authority of the Army Council.

No person actually serving in the Navy will be eligible unless he produces to the Civil Service Commissioners, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to attend the examination, dated before the commencement of the competition and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued by or under the authority of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty.

Persons comprised in the classes (c), (d), (e) must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the examination, before the commencement of

the competition. Persons comprised in class (f) will not be qualified to receive appointments until the consent of the Board of Education in England, the Committee of Council on Education for Scotland, or the Commissioners of National Education, Ireland, as the case may be, given in conformity with rules sanctioned by the Lords of the Treasury, has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

Persons comprised in class (g) will not be qualified for appointment until the consent

- of the Commissioners of Customs and Excise, given with the like sanction, has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.
- In reckoning age for competition the following allowances will be made, viz.:-
 - (i.) Persons who have served or are serving in the Army or Navy may deduct from their actual age any time during which they have served:
 - (ii.) Persons who may be serving or who may have served in the Militia, the Imperial Yeomanry, the Honourable Artillery Company, or the Volunteers, may deduct from their actual age any time spent on actual military service, such time being reckoned by the number of days for which they received Army pay;
 - (iii.) Persons who have served for two full consecutive years-
 - (A) In the Royal Irish Constabulary,
 - (B) In any Civil situation other than that of Registered Boy Clerk to which they were admitted with the Certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners,
 - (C) As Registered Boy Clerks (if appointed on the results of the competition of September 22, 1908, or any previous competition), may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding five years which they may have spent in such service, with the proviso that persons comprised in Classes (A), (B), (C) will not be allowed to deduct from their actual age more than the following, viz.:-

Two years when competing for Clerkships in the Second Division of the Civil Service; One year when competing for the situation

TEMPORARY ORDER of the Local Government Board: Relief to able-bodied Men, their Wives and Families:-

DARTFORD UNION.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Dartford Union ;-

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by a General Order dated the 21st day of December, 1844, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of certain Unions and Parishes, including the Dartford Union, the Poor Law Commissioners prescribed Regulations with regard to the administration of relief;

And whereas it is expedient that further provision should be made temporarily with regard to the administration of relief to certain classes

of poor persons in the said Union:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order as follows :-

Article L.—Notwithstanding anything in the said Order dated the twenty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, the following Regulations shall have effect in the Dartford Union, namely:-

(1) The Guardians of the Poor of the said Union may, after not less than three clear days' notice of the proposal has been sent by their Clerk to each Guardian, pass a Resolution (hereinafter referred to as "the Resolution") to the effect that the powers conferred by this Order shall be exercised by them, and a copy of the Resolution shall be forwarded to Us by i premises upon service on the occupier thereof of

the Clerk within one week after the passing of the Resolution.

(2) The Guardians may, from and after the passing of the Resolution, and during the operation of this Order, relieve out of the Workhouse the wife and family of any ablebodied male person who is relieved in the ${f Workhouse}.$

(3) An able-bodied male person who is relieved in the Workhouse, while his wife and family are relieved by the Guardians out of the Workhouse, shall not be absent from the Workhouse more than once in any one week, nor for a period exceeding twelve hours, nor without the consent of the Guardians. Article II.—This Order shall operate and

have effect until the thirtieth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and ten.

RAINOW DISTRICT (MOVEMENT OF SHEEP) ORDER OF 1910.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1909, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Application of Order.

1.—(1.) This Order shall apply to the area described in the First Schedule hereto, which is hereinafter referred to as "the Scheduled Area," and shall also apply to any premises in the neighbourhood of the Scheduled Area to which the Order may be applied by a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Board or of the Local Authority and served upon the occupier of the premises described in such Notice.

(2.) This Order shall cease to apply to any

a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Board.

(3.) A copy of every Notice served under this Article shall forthwith be sent to the Board by the Inspector signing the same.

Restriction of Movement of Sheep.

2.—(1.) Notwithstanding anything contained in any other Order of the Board or in any Notice served thereunder, sheep shall not (except as hereinafter provided) be moved out of the Scheduled Area, or from any premises to which this Order is applied by Notice under the preceding Article, unless-

(i.) they are accompanied by a licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination

specified in the licence is situate; or

(ii.) they are moved direct to a slaughterhouse having previous to such movement been marked by the painting or stamping with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each sheep, thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.

(2.) A licence for movement under this Article

shall be granted only

(i.) if the Inspector is satisfied that the sheep have been dipped by a thorough immersion in an efficient sheep-dip in the presence, and to the satisfaction, of an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District within twentyeight days before the date on which the application for a licence is made and that since such dipping the sheep have been kept separate from sheep not so dipped, and upon production of a declaration in the Form A set forth in the Second Schedule to this Order or to the like effect signed by the owner of the sheep or his agent authorised for this purpose; or
(ii.) upon production to the Inspector of

(a) a certificate by a duly qualified veterinary surgeon to the effect that he has within ten days before the application for a licence is made examined each of the sheep to be moved, and found it to be free from sheep-scab; and

(b) a declaration signed by the owner of the sheep, or his agent authorised for this purpose, to the effect that since such examination the sheep have been kept separate from other sheep, and have not been exposed in any market, fairground,

saleyard or exhibition; or

(iii.) upon the conditions, to be inserted in the licence, that the sheep shall be moved to the place of destination specified in the licence and not be moved therefrom or be allowed to come in contact with any other sheep until they shall have been dipped by a thorough immersion in an efficient sheep-dip in the presence, and to the satisfaction, of an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District.

A licence under paragraph (ii.) or (iii.) shall only be granted where, in the opinion of the Inspector granting it, compliance with paragraph (i.) is impracticable or inexpedient.

- (3.) A declaration shall be retained by the Inspector granting a licence thereon.
- (4.) The licence shall be in force for six days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall be in the Form B set forth in the Second Schedule to this Order or to the like effect.
- (5.) Sheep moved under this Article to a slaughter-house shall after their arrival thereat be there detained until they are slaughtered.

Provisions as to farms on borders of Scheduled Area.

3. Where any farm or holding is situate partly within and partly without the Scheduled Area the provisions of this Order shall apply to the farm or holding and the sheep thereon as if the whole farm or holding were in the Area.

Licences after Completion of Movement.

4. Where sheep are moved with a licence under this Order, the licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same District by the person in charge of the sheep at the time of completing the said movement.

General Provisions as to Movement.

Sheep, while being moved under this Order, shall as far as practicable be kept separate from all other sheep, and, if moved with a licence, shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the place of destination specified in the licence, and not elsewhere.

Provision for Movement through Scheduled Area.

For the purposes of this Order, sheep shall not be deemed to be moved out of the Scheduled Area in any case where they are moved through such Area by road through such Area from a place outside such Area to another place outside such Area, provided such movement is authorised by a licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District of the place where the sheep enter the Area.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

-(1.) Any person in charge of a sheep being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the licence, if any, authorising the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

8. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

- -(1.) If a sheep is moved in contravention of this Order, or of a licence granted there-under, the owner of the sheep, and the person in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the sheep, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the sheep is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (2.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by clipping, or washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted or stamped on any sheep, as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the sheep, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and

defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If a person in charge of a sheep being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(4.) If a sheep is not isolated as required by this Order, or by a licence thereunder, the owner of the sheep, and the person in charge thereof, and the occupier of the place where the sheep is detained, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

- 10. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires-
 - "Efficient sheep-dip" means a sheep-dip approved by the Board for sheep-scab, or purporting to be so approved:

- "Inspector" includes Veterinary Inspector:
 "The Board" means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:
- "The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Commencement.

11. This Order shall come into operation on the fourteenth day of March, nineteen hundred and ten.
