Whereas by section 134 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, it is enacted as follows:—

"Where the age of any young person under the age of sixteen years or child is required to be ascertained or proved for the purposes of this Act, or for any purpose connected with the employment in labour or elementary education of the young person or child, any person shall on presenting a written requisition in such form and containing such particulars as may be from time to time prescribed by the Local Government Board, and on payment of a fee of sixpence, be entitled to obtain a certified copy under the hand of a registrar or superintendent registrar of the entry in the register, under the Births and Deaths Registration Acts, 1836 to 1874,

of the birth of that young person or child; and such form of requisition shall, on request, be supplied without charge by every superintendent registrar and registrar of births, deaths and marriages."

And whereas by an Order dated the 23rd day of December, 1901, We, the Local Government Board, prescribed the form in which the requisition referred to in the above-cited enactment should be made, and it is expedient that such further provision as is hereinafter contained be made in that behalf:

ORDER of the Local Government Board: Motor Car Act, 1903: Regulations under Section 9 (1).

COUNTY OF HERTFORD.

Urban District of Bushey.

To the County Council of Hertford;

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that, within any limits or place referred to in Regulations made by Us, the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;

And whereas the County Council of Hertford having applied to Us to make Regulations in pursuance of the said sub-section putting the above-mentioned provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising part of a main road situate within the urban district of Bushey, in the county of Hertford, We caused a Local Inquiry to be made by one of Our Inspectors into the subject-matter of that application, and the Report of the Inspector has been received and considered by Us:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, We do, by this Our Order, make the following Regulations:—

ARTICLE I.—The provisions of sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Act with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour shall apply and have effect within the limits comprising so much of Londonroad, within the urban district of Bushey, as extends from a point situate ten yards to the west of its junction with Falconer-road to a point situate ten yards to the east of its junction with Bournehall-road.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the twenty-eighth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and ten.

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by a General Order, dated the 24th day of July, 1847, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of the Dudley Union (amongst others) the Poor Law Commissioners made certain regulations for the government of the Workhouse of that Union;

And whereas by Article 153 of the said Order provision was made for the appointment by the

said Guardians of persons to hold certain offices in the said Workhouse, including the office of nurse, and by Articles 155 and 172 of that Order it was further directed that every such appointment should be reported to the Poor Law Commissioners, and that the Guardians should pay to the officers so appointed such salaries or remuneration as the said Commissioners might from time to time direct or approve;

And whereas it is expedient that further provision should be made with regard to the appointment of persons to hold the office of nurse at the said Workhouse;

New, therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby order and direct that, notwithstanding anything contained in the above-cited Order, if the Guardians of the Poor of the said Union shall submit to Us for Our approval a statement showing the total number of persons which the said Guardians consider it necessary to appoint to hold the office of nurse at the said Workhouse, and the salaries or scale of salaries to be assigned to those nurses, and We approve that statement, it shall not be necessary for the said Guardians to report to Us each appointment under the said Order of a person to hold the office of nurse in the said Workhouse, nor to obtain Our approval to the remuneration of any person so appointed, so long as the number of persons so appointed and their salaries do not exceed the number of persons and the scale of salaries shown in the said statement and approved by Us:

Provided as follows:-

- (1.) This Order shall not apply to the appointment of any superintendent nurse appointed subject to the provisions of the Nursing in Workhouses Order, 1897.
- (2.) A person who has not reached the age of twenty-one years shall not be employed in the capacity of probationary nurse.

And the person in charge of such locomotive shall, upon receiving any such signal as aforesaid, immediately stop such locomotive and waggons, or draw it and them to the side of the highway, as the case may require.

Provided always that nothing herein contained shall apply to a steam roller not drawing more than three loaded or unloaded waggons.
