The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, copy of a Decree, dated March 12th, from His Majesty's Representative at Brussels, stating that in view of the existence of plague at Kobé and Osaka (Japan) and Guayaquil (Ecuador) the provisions of Articles 1 to 6 of the Royal Decree of September 26th, 1907 (published in the London Gazette of October 25th, 1907), regarding the sanitary measures to be imposed on arrivals from contaminated countries have been

8. French (Ditto) 9. German (Ditto)

10. Elementary Mathematics.

11. Inorganic Chemistry, with Elements of Physics.

N.B.—Not more than four of the subjects numbered 4 to 11 may be offered.

3. Service marks for each full period of three calendar months of actual approved service, subject to a maximum of twelve of such periods, may be allowed to Candidates attending an Examination who are serving or have served as Registered Boy Clerks or Boy Copyists, and have entered the service by the Competition of September 22nd, 1908, or any previous competition. To Candidates who shall have been registered as Temporary Boy Clerks on the result of any Competition subsequent to that of September 22nd, 1908, and shall have rendered not less than six months' approved service in that capacity, service marks may be allowed for each full period of three calendar months subject to a maximum of eight such periods.

4. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such time and in such manner as the Civil Service Commissioners


