WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (County Borough of Hastings) Order, 1910.

Dated 31st March, 1910.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of the County Borough of Hastings, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as the Wild Birds Protection (County Borough of Hastings) Order, 1910.

BIRDS.

Close Time extended.

II. The period during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall be extended throughout the County Borough of Hastings, except with respect to the following Birds, so as to be between the last day of February and the 1st day of September in any year:—

Curlew, Godwit, Lapwing, Mallard, Plover, Redshank and other Sandpipers, Snipe, Teal and other Wild Ducks, Wild Geese, Wild Swan, Whimbrel, Widgeon, Woodcock.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the County Borough of Hastings to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the schedule to the Act:—

Black-headed Bunting, Cirl Bunting, Corn Bunting, Reed Bunting, Snow Bunting, Yellow Bunting (Yellow Hammer), Bustard, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Chiffchaff, Corn Crake (Land Rail), Peregrine Falcon, Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Hobby, Kestrel, Martin, Merlin, Nuthatch, Osprey, Kentish Plover, Raven, Redstart, Red Backed Strike, Stonechat, Swallow, Swift, Bearded Tit, Blue Tit, Coal Tit, Crested Tit, Great Tit, Long-tailed Tit, Marsh Tit, Wagtails (all species), Blackcap Warbler, Dartford Warbler, Garden Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler, Wheatear, Whinchat, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Fire-crested Wren, Golden-crested Wren, Wryneck.

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

IV. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as varied by Clause II of this Order, does not extend, the killing or taking of any of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County Borough of Hastings:—

Avocet, Common Bittern, Little Bittern, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Chough, Crossbill, Peregrine Falcon, Pied Flycatcher, Goldfinch, Great Crested Grebe, Hen Harrier (Ring-tailed Hawk), Marsh Harrier (Moor Buzzard), Moutagu's Harrier, Hoopoe, Kingfisher, Common Kite, Wood Lark, Nightjar or Goatsucker, Oriole, Osprey, Owl (all species), Kentish Plover, Ringed Plover (Stonehatch). Redpole, Raven, Siskin, Spoonbill, Stone Curlew (Great Plover, Thick Knee), Tern or Sea Swallow (all species), Bearded Tit, Dartford Warbler, Wheatear, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker.

All Birds protected on Sundays.

V. During those periods of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, and by Clause II of this Order does not extend, namely:—Between the 31st day of July in any year and the 2nd day of March following as regards the Birds named in Clause II, and between the 31st day of August in any year and the 1st day of March following as regards all other birds, the killing or taking of Wild Birds on Sundays is prohibited throughout the County Borough ot Hastings.

Eggs.

All Eggs protected within certain Areas.

VI. The taking or destroying of Wild Birds' Eggs is prohibited for a period of three years from the date of this Order within the following areas in the County Borough of Hastings, namely, the line of Cliffs and the Alexandra Park.

The above areas are shown in pink on a map deposited with the Town Clerk, sealed with the Home Office seal, and dated the 31st March, 1910.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the County Borough.

VII. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County Borough of Hastings:—

Avocet, Common Bittern, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Crossbill, Peregrine Falcon, Goldfinch, Great Crested Grebe, Hobby, Hoopoe, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Common Kite, Wood Lark, Nightiugale, Nightjar, Oriole, Owl (all species), Kentish Plover, Ringed Plover (Stonehatch), Red-backed Shrike, Spoonbill, Stone Curlew (Great Plover, Thick Knee), Bearded Tit, Dartford Warbler, Wheatear, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker, Golden-crested Wren, Wryneck.

Repeal of former Order.

VIII. The Order of the 9th March, 1907, is hereby repealed.

The provisions of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Order) shall apply to the Scheduled Area described in the Schedule hereto, but subject to the modifications hereinafter contained. Provided that the provisions of the principal Order relating to an Infected Area shall not apply to any part of the Scheduled Area, unless such part is for the time being declared by Order of the Board to be, or form part of, a Swine-Fever Infected Area.

Regulation of Movement of Swine from Markets.

(1.) The movement of swine from any

Area shall be subject to the following provisions of this Order.

- (2.) In the case of swine moved into the market, fairground or saleyard from premises outside the Scheduled Area with a licence (Form A) the principal Order shall apply to the subsequent movement of the swine.
- (3.) If the market or saleyard is specially authorised by the Local Authority under the principal Order or under the Swine-Fever (Movement from Ireland) Order of 1904, the movement of the swine exposed at the market or saleyard shall be subject to the provisions of the Order under which the market or saleyard is so authorised.
- (4.) In the case of any other movement of swine from a market, fairground or saleyard the movement shall be subject to the following conditions:-
 - (i.) The swine shall be accompanied by a licence (Form C) granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the market, fairground or saleyard is situate.
 - (ii.) If the place of destination is outside the Scheduled Area it must be a bacon factory or slaughterhouse.
 - (iii.) The swine shall not, for a period of twenty-eight days after arrival at the place of destination specified in the licence, be moved from such place of destination except to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse, and only if accompanied by a licence (Form C) authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the swine are detained.
 - (iv.) Swine moved with a licence under this Article to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse shall be there detained until they are slaughtered.
 - (v.) Swine while detained under this Article shall be kept separate from all other swine.

Regulation of Markets, &c., in Scheduled Area.

- 4.-(1.) No sale of swine shall be held in any market, fairground or saleyard in the Scheduled Area unless it is authorised by the Local Authority of the District (which authority the Local Authority are hereby empowered to grant).
- (2.) An authority granted under an Order hereby revoked shall continue in force and have effect as if granted under this Order.

Effect of Licences granted under this Order.

5. No licence shall be required under the principal Order for the movement into a Scheduled Area of swine which are being moved under and in accordance with a licence granted under this Order.

Saving of certain existing Local Orders.

6. Nothing in this Order shall affect the operation of the existing local Orders not hereby market, fairground or saleyard in the Scheduled I revoked which nodify the provisions of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 in relation to certain boroughs within the Scheduled Area.

Commencement.

7. This Order shall come into operation on the eleventh day of April, uineteen hundred and ten.

Short Title.

8. This Order may be cited as the Shropshire and Staffordshire (Swine-Fever) Order of 1910, and shall in relation to the Scheduled Area be read as part of the principal Order.

- 7. To empower the Council to levy and recover rates, rents and charges for the supply of gas and for the sale and hire of meters, pipes, fittings,

engines, lamps, stoves, cookers and other apparatus and if thought fit to alter the existing rates, rents and charges for the same.

- 8. To empower the Council and any local authority, company or person within or beyond the limits of the intended Act to enter into and fulfil contracts and agreements in relation to the supply by the Council of gas in bulk or otherwise to such local authority, company or person.


