Such last-mentioned person shall signal to the driver of such locomotive to stop or drive to the side of the highway when it shall be necessary to do so in order to enable overtaking pedestrians, vehicles, horses, or cattle to pass by. And the person in charge of such locomotive shall, upon receiving any such signal as aforesaid, immediately stop such locomotive and waggons, or draw it and them to the side of the highway as the case may require.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall apply to a steam roller not drawing more than three loaded or unloaded waggons."

#### BOROUGH OF SOUTHEND-ON-SEA.

SCHEME for the alteration of Ward Boundaries and the apportioning of Councillors among the New Wards made in pursuance of the Southend-on-Sea Corporation Act, 1909.

Article I. This Scheme shall except so far as is otherwise herein expressly provided or as there may be anything in the subject matter or context inconsistent therewith come into operation for the purpose of all proceedings preliminary to the ordinary Municipal Elections of the year 1910 on the date of its publication in the London Gazette and for all other purposes on the first day of November, one thousand nine hundred and ten.

Article II. Subject as regards any future alteration of the wards hereby constituted to the provisions of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, and any Act amending the same as to the alteration of wards the following provisions shall have effect:—

(1.) Whereas heretofore the borough has been divided for the purpose of the election of Councillors into three wards, termed respectively the Prittlewell or North Ward, the East Ward and the West Ward (hereinafter called the old wards); from and after the coming into operation of this Scheme the borough shall be divided into eight wards, termed respectively the Westborough Ward, the Prittlewell Ward, the Southchurch Ward, the Victoria Ward, the Chalkwell Ward, the Milton Ward, the Pier Ward and the Thorpe Ward (hereinafter called the new wards).

(2.) The boundaries of the said eight wards which shall in every case follow the centre line of the roads hereinafter named shall be

as follows :-

(a) Westborough Ward: on the north and west the boundaries of the borough;
on the east, North-street and the main Rochford-road; on the south, Hadleigh-road, Leigh-road, and West-road;
(b) Prittlewell Ward: on the north the

(b) Prittlewell Ward: on the north the boundaries of the borough; on the east, Sutton-road, North-avenue and Bournemouth Park-road; on the south, Southchurch-road;

on the west, Victoria-avenue, the aforesaid eastern boundary of the Westborough Ward, and the boundaries of the borough;

(c) Southchurch Ward: on the north and east the boundaries of the borough; on the south, the London, Tilbury and Southend Railway, Chase-road, and Southchurch-road; on the west the aforesaid eastern boundary of the Prittlewell Ward;

(d) Victoria Ward: West-road, Victoria-avenue, London-road, and Leigh-road;

(e) Chalkwell Ward: on the north, Hadleigh-road and Leigh-road; on the east, Valkyrie-road and Palmerston-road; on the south, the sea; on the west the boundaries of the borough;

(f) Milton Ward: on the north, Leighroad and London-road; on the east, Princesstreet, Milton-place, Runwell-terrace, and
the west side of Prittlewell-square; on the
south, the sea; on the west the aforesaid
eastern boundary of the Chalkwell Ward;

(g) Pier Ward: on the north, Londonroad and Southchurch-road; on the east, Lancaster Gardens West, Hastings-road, Albert-road, and Pleasant-road; on the south, the sea; on the west the aforesaid eastern boundary of the Milton Ward;

(h) Thorpe Ward: On the north, South-church-road, Chase-road, and the London, Tilbury and Southend Railway; on the east, the boundaries of the borough; on the south, the sea; on the west, the aforesaid eastern boundary of the Pier Ward.

(3). Each of the said wards shall comprise the portion of the borough indicated by a separate colour and distinguished by the name of the ward on the maps, each marked "Map of the Wards of the Borough of Southend-on-Sea as altered, 1910," one of which shall be sent herewith to the Secretary of State, to be submitted by him to His Majesty in Council for approval, and the other shall be deposited by the Town Clerk of the Borough at his office within fourteen days after the date of this scheme.

Article III. Whereas heretofore each of the old wards returned six Councillors to the Borough Council, and whereas it is enacted by subsection 1 of section 7 of the Southend-on-Sea Corporation Act, 1909, that each of the new wards shall return three Councillors, and by subsection 2 of the said section that such of the existing Councillors as shall remain in office after the first day of November, nineteen hundred and ten, shall be apportioned by this scheme among the new wards, so as to provide (as far as practicable) for each Councillor continuing to represent as large a number as possible of his former constituents, and by sub-section 3 of the said section that there shall not be assigned to any ward more than one Councillor whose term of office expires on the first day of November, nineteen hundred and eleven, nor more than one Councillor whose term of office expires on the first day of November, nineteen hundred and twelve, and whereas at the date of this scheme the old wards are represented respectively by the Councillors next hereinafter named, whose terms of office expire respectively at the dates hereinafter stated, that is to say, the Prittlewell or North Ward by Herbert Arthur Dowsett and Chalton Hubbard, whose term of office expires on the 1st November, 1911, and by Harry Thomas Garon and Richard Henry Nerney, whose term of office expires on 1st November, 1912, the East Ward, by George Allen and William Cardy Bluck, whose term of office expires on 1st November, 1911, and by
