ADE by the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the county borough of Bournemouth, acting by the Council as the promoters of the Corporation Tramways in the county borough of Bournemouth under section 46 of the Tramways Act, 1870.

Interpretation of Terms.

1. Throughout this Bye-law the several words referred to in Bye-law No. 1 of the Bye-laws made by the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the county borough of Bournemouth on the 7th day of April, 1903, shall have the same meanings respectively as are in such Bye-law assigned to them.

Stopping Places for Cars.

2. No person shall be entitled to have a car stopped for the purpose of his cutering, mounting, or leaving the car at any place other than a recognised stopping place fixed by the Corporation for that purpose and indicated upon a tramway pole, lamp-post, or some other conspicuous position on the line of route.

3. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each car in use a

printed copy of this Bye-law.

This Bye-law shall come into force on the 1st day of July, 1910.
