ORDER of the Local Government Board: Extending Temporary Order: Relief to able-bodied Men, their Wives and Families.

#### PRESTON UNION.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Preston Union;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by a General Order, dated the 14th day of December, 1852, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of certain Unions and Parishes, including the Preston Union, the Poor Law Board prescribed Regulations with regard to the administration of out-door relief to poor persons in the said Union;

And whereas by an Order, dated the 20th day of August, 1909 (hereinafter referred to as "the Order"), we, the Local Government Board, made temporary provision with regard to the administration of relief to certain classes of poor persons in the said Union, and by Article III of the Order provided that the Order should operate and have effect until the 25th day of March, 1910;

And whereas it is expedient that such further provision as is hereinafter set forth should be

made in relation to the subject-matter of the Order:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We do hereby Order that, notwithstanding anything in the Order, the provisions thereof shall be in force and shall have effect until the twenty-fifth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and eleven.

ORDER of the Local Government Board: Order making certain Orders applicable to new Union.

#### CANTERBURY UNION.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Canterbury Union:—

To the Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes, Precincts and Vills comprised in the said Union;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by an Order dated the 25th day of January, 1910, We, the Local Government Board, ordered that, from and after the 25th day of March, 1910, the Precinct of Archbishop's Palace, the Precinct of Christchurch, the Parish of Saint Dunstan Within, the Vill of Saint Gregory, the Vill of Staplegate, the Parish of Thannington Within, the Parish of Westgate Without, and the Parish of Canterbury, should be united for the administration of the laws for the relief of the Poor, and form a Union to be termed the Canterbury Union;

**HIGH STREET AND GARDENER'S LANE, PUTNEY, WIDENING, IMPROVEMENT CHARGE.**

To all to whom these presents shall come, I, ALEXANDER GLEN, of New Court, Temple, London, Esquire, one of His Majesty's Counsel, send greeting.

**WHEREAS** by the London County Council (Improvements) Act, 1900, 63 and 64 Vict., cap. CCLXIX (hereinafter referred to as the said Act), after incorporating the Lands Clauses Acts, with certain exceptions and variations not material to these presents, and after reciting amongst other things that certain improvements by the said Act authorised to be carried out by the London County Council (hereinafter referred to as the Council), including the widening as pro-

vided by section 5 of the said Act, of High-street and Gardener's-lane, in the parish of Putney, in the county of London, would or might substantially and permanently increase in value lands in the neighbourhood of those improvements respectively which would not be required for the purpose thereof, and that it was reasonable that provision should be made under which in respect or in consideration of such increased value a charge should be placed on such lands; it was amongst other things enacted that all lands within the improvement area, by the said Act defined as the areas shown on the deposited plans within the line thereon indicating the limits within which an improvement charge might be imposed (exclusive of certain lands to which these presents do not relate) but which should not be purchased and taken by the Council under the powers of the said Act, should be liable to have an improvement charge placed on such lands or some of them (in accordance with the provisions thereafter in the said Act set forth), in respect or in consideration of any substantial permanent increase in value which it might be clearly shown had been derived from the improvement. And whereas by the said Act after providing for the making of a specification of all the lands within the improvement area upon which the Council might propose to place such an improvement charge as aforesaid, and which they might desire to include in the assessment hereinafter mentioned, and for the making of an initial valuation of such lands without taking into consideration any increased value accruing or supposed to accrue to such lands or any buildings thereon from or in consequence of the improvement, it was further enacted that the Council should cause to be framed an assessment describing such lands, specifying the respective names of the owners, lessees, and occupiers thereof, the amounts by way of charge which the Council might allege ought to be charged upon such lands respectively, and containing a statement of the amount which they might allege to be the enhanced market value derived by the lands respectively from the improvement and it was further enacted that such assessment should be submitted to and considered by the Council, and that the Council might by resolution approve the same with or without modification or addition, and that if the owner or lessee of any lands described in the assessment, or the occupier thereof for the time being should by written notice object to the assessment in the manner and on any of the grounds in the said Act mentioned, the Local Government Board should, on the application of the Council, appoint an arbitrator for the purposes of Part III of the said Act to determine the matter of all such objections. And whereas after a specification and initial valuation with respect (amongst others) to the lands and premises hereinafter particularly described and situate within the improvement area of the said High-street and Gardener's-lane, Putney, Widening Improvement had been duly made in pursuance of the hereinbefore recited enactments, certain portions of the said lands and premises were thrown into the street known as Cooper's Arms-lane for the purpose of widening such street. And whereas the Council, after causing an assessment of the enhanced market value derived by the lands described in such assessment respectively from the improvement and of the amounts by way of charge to be charged upon such lands respectively to be framed and submitted to them, and after having duly considered such assessment, did, by resolution passed on the 21st day of July, 1908, duly approve the same in

the following terms (so far as is material to these presents), that is to say:—

"The Council, having considered the assessment framed and submitted by the Improvements Committee of lands situate within the improvement area of the High-street, Putney,

and Gardener's-lane Improvement, and liable, under the London County Council (Improvements) Act, 1900, to have an improvement charge placed upon them in respect of such improvement, which assessment is as follows:—

And whereas notices were duly served on the Council of objection to the said assessment (1) by Brandon's Putney Brewery Limited as owners and occupiers of a certain portion of the said lands and premises described in such assessment, namely, the portion described in the said initial valuation as "Brewery office stores yard and outbuildings, Gardener's - lane, Brandon's freehold" (hereinafter called "Brandon's freehold"), (2) by Mary Doris Read as owner of the portion described in the said initial valuation as "Brewery office stores yard and outbuildings, Gardener's-lane, Read's Trustees" (hereinafter called Brandon's leasehold), and by Edmund Joseph Bellord, as the surviving executor and one of the trustees of the will of the predecessor in title of the said Mary Doris Read to Brandon's leasehold or part thereof; and (3) by the said Brandon's Putney Brewery Limited, as lessees and occupiers of part of Brandon's leasehold, for the residue of a term of 85 years expiring at Christmas, 1979, and as lessees and occupiers of the remainder of Brandon's leasehold for the residue of a term of 76 years, also expiring at Christmas, 1979. And the grounds of such objections were that the said lands and premises ought to be excluded from the said assessment by reason that it had not been and could not be clearly shown that the market value of the said lands and premises was substantially and permanently increased by the improvement; that the amount of the charge proposed to be placed upon the said lands and premises ought to be varied, and that the assessment was incorrect (a) in describing the enhanced value of the said lands and premises from the improvement as £6,909, and (b) in including, for the purpose of arriving at such enhanced value, lands of which the said objectors respectively were not the owners, lessees, or occupiers. Gardener's-lane, Putney, Widening authorised by the said Act; and whereas I, the said Alexander Glen, have taken upon myself the burden of the reference, and did before entering upon the inquiry into the matter referred to me duly make and subscribe in the presence of a Justice of the Peace the Declaration hereto annexed. And whereas on the application of the Council I, the said Alexander Glen, appointed Thursday, the 17th day of February, 1910, at four of the clock in the afternoon, at New Court, Temple aforesaid, for hearing and determining the matter of all objections to the said assessment, and the notices prescribed by the said Act of the time and place so appointed, were duly published and served in accordance with the provisions of such Act, and I duly held an inquiry into the said matter at the said time and place and heard the Council and the said objectors by their respective Solicitors, Agents and witnesses, and duly considered their respective allegations, proofs and admissions. Now, therefore, I, the said Alexander Glen, do hereby make this my award in writing of and concerning the premises, that is to say:—

1. I declare and award that the market values of Brandon's freehold and Brandon's leasehold respectively are substantially and permanently increased by the aforesaid improvement.

2. I declare and award that the amount of the enhanced market value derived from the said improvement by Brandon's freehold is £2,666 13s. 4d.

3. I declare and award that the amount of the enhanced value derived from the said improvement by Brandon's leasehold is £1,083 6d. 8d., whereof £866 13s. 4d. is the amount of the enhanced value derived by so much of Brandon's leasehold as is held by the lessees for the residue of the said term of 85 years, and £216 13s. 4d. is the amount of the enhanced value derived by the remainder thereof, which is held for the residue of the said term for 76 years.

4. I declare and award that the amount by way of charge which shall be placed upon Brandon's freehold is £40, and that such charge shall be payable by the owner or owners for the time being of the fee simple of the said Brandon's freehold.

5. I declare and award that the amount by way of charge which shall be placed upon such part of Brandon's leasehold as is held by the lessees for the residue of the said term of

85 years is £18, and that such charge shall be payable by the owner or owners for the time being of the said term of 85 years, until the expiration or sooner determination of such term, and thereafter by the owner or owners for the time being of the fee simple of the said part of the said Brandon's leasehold.

6. I declare and award that the amount by way of charge which shall be placed upon such part of Brandon's leasehold as is held by the lessees for the residue of the said term of 76 years is £3 5s. 0d., and that such charge shall be payable by the owner or owners for the time being of the said term of 76 years, until the expiration or sooner determination of such term, and thereafter by the owner or owners for the time being of the fee simple of the said part of the said Brandon's leasehold.

7. And I declare and award that the said assessment shall be and is hereby amended in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this my award.
