The following Statute duly passed on the twelfth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and nine, and sealed on the twenty-sixth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and nine, by the Governing Body of Corpus Christi College, Oxford, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877":—

A STATUTE making alterations in the Statutes made for Corpus Christi College, Oxford, by the University of Oxford Commissioners and approved by Her late Majesty Queen Victoria in Council on the third day of May, one thousand

sand eight hundred and eighty-two.
In Clause 22 (a) instead of the words "Extraordinary Fellowships, not exceeding three," the following words shall be substituted "Extraordinary Fellowships, not exceeding seven."

In Clause 23 (a) instead of the words "the number of Ordinary Fellowships shall be not less than ten, and shall be increased to fourteen as soon as the revenues of the College will admit," the following words shall be substituted "the number of Ordinary Fellowships shall be increased

Clause 23 (c) containing the words "Of the full number of fourteen Fellowships authorized by this clause one at least shall be assigned to Mathematics; one at least shall be assigned to Natural Science or Medicine; one at least shall be assigned to Theology; one at least shall be assigned to Law; one at least shall be assigned to Modern History. Until the full number of fourteen Fellowships is completed,

one Fellowship in every three shall be assigned from time to time to any one of the five subjects enumerated above as the President and Fellows may on each occasion determine," shall be repealed so that Clause 23 (d) shall become Clause 23 (c), Clause 23 (e) shall become Clause 23 (d), Clause 23 (f) shall become Clause 23 (e).

In the substituted Clause 77 (3) β approved by His Majesty the King in Council on the twenty-fifth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and three, instead of the words "The filling up from time to time of ordinary or extraordinary Fellowships to the number of three," the following words shall be substituted, "The filling up from time to time of one Extraordinary Fellowship under Clause 22."

In Clause 77 (4) (b) β after the words "The augmentation of the number of Ordinary Fellowships to seven," the following words shall be added, "provided that before proceeding to election the College may at its discretion in the place of Ordinary Fellowships substitute Extraordinary Fellowships under Clause 22 or Senior ordinary Fellowships under Clause 22 or Senior Scholarships under Clause 35, but without ever-exceeding the value of seven Ordinary Fellow-ships on the whole."

Clause 77 (4) (b) γ containing the words "The filling up of one Extraordinary Fellowship under Clause 22" shall be repealed.

After Clause 77 (4) concluding with the words "a sum of £100 shall be assigned to those included under a," the following additional paragraph shall be inserted "(5) The establishment of the Professorship of the Romance or Neo-Latin Languages" Latin Languages."

In Clause 77 in the last paragraph of the Clause instead of the words "The establishment.

of the Professorship of the Romance or Neo-Latin Languages, the augmentation of the number of Ordinary Fellowships to fourteen, the establishment of two other Extraordinary Fellow-ships and of the Senior Scholarships," the follow-ing words shall be substituted, "The establishment of Extraordinary Fellowships up to the full number of seven under Clause 22, the augmentation of Ordinary Fellowships up to the full number of seven under Clause 23, and the establishment of Senior Scholarships up to the full number of four under Clause 35."

F The following Statute, made on the third day of March, one thousand nine hundred and ten (and sealed on the eighth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and ten), by the Governing Body of Wadham College, Oxford, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877":

STATUTE to alter and amend the Statutes framed by the Commissioners appointed under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, 40 and 41 Victoria, cap. 48, and approved by the Queen in Council in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, in relation to Wadham College in the University of Oxford in the matter of the office of Bursar, such amending Statute being duly made at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College specially summoned for this purpose, held on the third day of March, one thousand nine hundred and ten, and passed by the unanimous votes of those present and woting.

For Statute VI, Clause 2, from the words, 4 The Bursar shall be entitled," to the words "not exceeding £300," to substitute the words following:

"The Bursar shall, in ordinary cases, be entitled to receive out of the Corporate revenue of the College a stipend of £200, but the Warden and Fellows shall have power to assign to him a higher stipend if they think fit, provided that in no case shall the stipend exceed £300. shall also have power from time to time to divide between two persons the office of Bursar, and to distribute between these a stipend not exceeding £300."

The following Statutes made by the Governing Body of Trinity College, Cambridge, on the fifth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and ten, and sealed on the fifteenth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and ten, have been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877":

STATUTES to alter and amend the Statutes of Trinity College in the University of Cambridge which amending Statutes were duly made at a College Meeting being a meeting of the Governing Body of the College specially summoned for this purpose and held on the 5th day of March 1910 and having been passed at such meeting by the votes of more than two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting are now submitted for the approval of His Majesty the King in Council.

We the Master Fellows and Scholars of Trinity College in the University of Cambridge in exercise of the powers given to us by the 54th section of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1877 do hereby alter and amend the existing Statutes of our said College in the manner following:

By repealing section 1 of Statute X intituled "The Fellows" and substituting therefor the following Statute X:section to form section

1. The Fellows of the College shall be elected either under title (a) at the annual election as hereinafter provided or under one of the hereinafter mentioned titles (β) (γ) (δ) (ϵ) and (ζ) .

By inserting between section 5 and section 6 in the said Statute X the following section to form section 5a of the same Statute:

5a. (ξ) The Council may at a meeting to be held for that purpose and by a resolution in which at least nine votes (the Master's vote being reckoned as two) shall have concurred elect to a fellowship any person concerning whom they are satisfied that he is bona fide engaged in the systematic pursuit of some important branch of University studies and that he either has made or is likely to make valuable contributions to the knowledge of the subject which he is studying

By repealing section 6 of Statute XI intituled "Vacancies to be filled up" and substituting therefor the following section to form section 6

of the same Statute:

6. Every fellowship suspended under either of the powers hereinbefore contained at any annual election of Fellows may be afterwards filled up by election under any of the titles $(\beta)(\gamma)(\delta)(\epsilon)(\zeta)$, and shall be suspended from such annual election of Fellows until it is so filled up or until the next annual election of Fellows whichever shall first happen

By repealing section 4 of Statute XV intituled "Tenure and vacating of Fellowships" and substituting therefor the following section to form section 4 of the same Statute:—

4. A Fellow elected under any of the titles (β) (γ) or (δ) who shall cease to hold the office in respect whereof he was elected Fellow or any other of the qualifying offices aforesaid to which he may have been subsequently appointed shall vacate his fellowship one year or ten days after so ceasing to hold office according as he has or has not held such office or offices for at least five years in all, unless he shall then hold some other of the qualifying offices aforesaid or be under any other of the provisions of these Statutes entitled to retain his fellowship.

By inserting between the said section 4 and section 5 of the said Statute XV the following section to form section 4a of the same Statute:

4a. A Fellow elected under the title (ζ) shall be bound to reside for the greater part of each term unless leave of absence be granted for a limited time by the Council; and the Council

shall have the power of requiring him to deliver a course of lectures upon the subject which he is studying during one term in each He shall vacate his fellowship at the end of five years from the date of his election unless he shall then hold one of the qualifying offices aforesaid or be under any other of the provisions of these Statutes entitled to retain his fellowship. If at such time he shall hold any such qualifying office he shall vacate his fellowship one year or ten days after ceasing to hold any qualifying office according as he has or has not held such office or more than one of such offices for at least five years in all unless he shall then hold some qualifying office or be under any other of the provisions of these Statutes entitled to retain his fellowship.

By repealing section 10 of the said Statute XV and substituting therefor the following section to form section 10 of the same Statute:—

10. The Council may permit any Fellow to retain his fellowship after the period at the end of which it would otherwise be vacated if they shall be satisfied that he is bonâ fide engaged in the systematic pursuit of some important branch of University studies, and that he either has made or is likely to make valuable contributions to the knowledge of the subject which he is studying. This permission shall only be given at a special meeting of the Council exclusive of such Fellow if a member of Council and by a resolution in which at least nine votes shall have concurred; and it shall require to be renewed in the same form at least once in every five years unless such l'ellow shall have retained his fellowship for twenty-five years under the provisions of Until such period of twenty-five years shall have elapsed any Fellow who retains his fellowship under the provisions of this section shall be bound to reside for the greater part of each term, unless leave of absence be granted for a limited time by the Council; and the Council shall have the power of requiring him to deliver a course of lectures upon the subject he is studying during one term in each year. Provided always that if any Fellow shall have retained his fellowship for twenty-five years under the provisions of this section he shall retain it as a pension fellowship discharged from the obligations and conditions hereinbefore mentioned. Provided also that if any Fellow who has been permitted to retain his fellowship under the provisions of this section shall have previously held any of the qualifying offices aforesaid or the office of Assistant Lecturer in the College the time during which he shall have held any such office or offices shall be reckoned as part of such period of twenty-five years.

By repealing section 2 of Statute XXXVIII intituled "Residence in College" and substituting therefor the following section to form section 2 of the same Statute:—

2. The following obligations shall subsist as to residence in College (that is to say) during full term the Tutors and the two Deans shall reside in College. During the Christmas and Easter vacations and such part of the long vacation as may from time to time be determined by the Council one Dean shall reside in College, but with permission for him in lieu of personal residence to provide from time to time a substitute to be approved by the Master or in his absence by the Vice-Master; and during such part of the long vacation as shall be determined by the Council one Tutor shall reside in College.

By repealing section 19 of Statute XLIX intituled "Distribution of Revenues" and substituting therefor the following section to form section 19 of the same Statute:—

In addition to their dividends, the Fellows the Chaplains and the Librarian (but without prejudice to the provisions of these Statutes in regard to married Fellows and officers) shall be entitled to rooms and commons during residence: but the Council by a majority of two-thirds of those present and voting on the question and a College Meeting by a majority of two-thirds of those present and voting on the question, provided always that twenty-five Fellows be then present, shall jointly have power to determine that the allowances above mentioned or either of them shall be commutable into an allowance in money; and it shall be thenceforth competent for the Council and a College Meeting jointly by a simple majority in each case in regard to the allowance made commutable as aforesaid to fix from time to time whether the same shall be enjoyed in kind or whether the same shall be commuted into an allowance in money as aforesaid and to fix the amount of such allowance in money (if any). The resolutions fixing such commutation may determine whether, and if so to what extent, Fellows resident in the University but not resident in College are to be entitled to allowances in lieu of commons but no person not occupying rooms in College shall be entitled to an allowance in lieu of rooms.

THE following Statutes, made on the fourteenth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and ten, by the Governing Body of Jesus College, Cambridge, altering and amending certain Statutes of the College, have been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877":—

Statutes to alter and amend the Statutes of Jesus College in the University of Cambridge which amending Statutes were duly made at a College Meeting being a meeting of the Governing Body of the College specially summoned for this purpose and held on the fourteenth day of March one thousand nine hundred and ten and having been passed at such meeting by the votes of more than two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting are now submitted for the approval of His Majesty the King in Council.

We the Master or Keeper and Fellows and Scholars of Jesus College in the University of Cambridge in exercise of the powers given to us by the fifty-fourth section of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877" do hereby alter and amend the existing Statutes of our said College in the manner following:—

College in the manner following:—
By repealing Statute VI intituled "Of the election of Fellows and the form thereof" and substituting therefor the following Statute to form Statute VI:—

Statute VI. "Of the election of Fellows."

1. Every vacant Fellowship other than the Professorial Fellowship shall be filled within one

year from the date of vacancy unless the Visitor for special reasons shall express his approval in writing of a delay in filling up the vacancy for an additional period of not more than two years. The Visitor shall have the power of suspending elections to Fellowships for periods not exceeding thirty years for purposes which come under the borrowing powers conferred on the College by the Universities and College Estates Acts 1858 to 1898. Provided that the number, of Fellowships the elections to which are thus suspended shall never exceed two at any one

2. All vacancies shall be filled up from among graduates of the Universities of Cambridge or Oxford except as otherwise specially provided

under these Statutes.

3. If any of the said vacancies be not filled up within the prescribed period then the Visitor shall for that turn nominate a person duly qualified who shall be admitted to the Fellowship in the

3a. No Fellow shall be elected for any term exceeding six years but the Master and Fellows shall at the time of election to a Fellowship have the power to limit the tenure thereof to any term of years less than six subject to the provisions of sections 4, 4A and 8 of this Statute.

4. The Master and Fellows at a meeting to be held for the purpose and by a vote in which not less than two-thirds of the votes of the whole body of the Master and Fellows shall concur may elect to a Fellowship any person who is eminent for science or learning. But not more than one Fellowship shall be held under the provisions of this section at the same time. The term of tenure of such Fellowship shall be six years. No person shall be deemed to be ineligible under this section on the ground that he is not a graduate of the University or that he has already vacated a Fellowship of the College.

4A. The Master and Fellows at a meeting to be held for the purpose and by a vote in which not less than two-thirds of the whole body of the Master and Fellows shall concur may elect to a Fellowship on account of marked service to learning or for services to be rendered as an Officer of the College any person who has vacated a Fellowship of the College provided always that the term of tenure of the Fellowship to which he is elected be decided at the same time and by the

same vote.

5. The intellectual qualifications candidates and their proficiency in any branch or branches of the University studies shall be ascertained in such mode as the Master and Fellows shall determine; and the electors shall choose in each case that candidate (being duly qualified according to these Statutes) whom they shall deem to be most fit to be a Fellow of the College as a place of education religion learning and research.

6. No person shall be eligible as a Fellow who if in possession of a Fellowship would be

disqualified from continuing to hold it.

7. The electors shall be the Master and Fellows but no election shall take place unless at least half the whole number of existing Fellows be

8. Except in the case of an election made under the provisions of section 4 or section 4A of this Statute that person shall be held to be elected who has received the votes of a majority of those present provided always that the term of tenure of the Fellowship to which he is elected be decided at the same time and by the same vote. In case of an equality of votes the Master or in his absence the senior Fellow present shall have a second or casting vote.

- 9. Every person elected to a Fellowship under any, of the provisions of this Statute shall be admitted to that Fellowship within seven days after his election unless prevented by illness or other grave cause and shall enjoy the advantages of a Fellow from the date of his admission.
- 10. The Master and Fellows shall have power at the time of any election to a Fellowship to attach to the tenure of the Fellowship any special condition which may seem to them desirable. If in their opinion such condition has not been fulfilled a majority of the Master and all the Fellows at a meeting specially summoned for the purpose shall have power to declare the Fellowship vacant subject to an appeal to the Visitor of the College.
- 11. Notwithstanding any provision contained in these Statutes no Fellow in statu pupillari shall be entitled to vote upon any College business except the election of a Master till the expiration of one year from the date of his election.
- 12. Any Fellow who being summoned by the Master or in his absence the President to a meeting of the College at which a majority of the whole Society is requisite for the transaction of the business for which the meeting is summoned shall neglect to attend shall be fined ten pounds unless the Master and Fellows expressly permit his absence.

By repealing Section 1 of Statute VII intituled "Of the vacating of Fellowships" and substituting therefor the following section to form section

1 of the same Statute:

1. The conditions of tenure of a Fellowship by any person elected to the same before the approval of these Statutes by the King in Council shall be regulated by the Statutes of the College in force on the day immediately preceding the day of approval of these Statutes by the King in Council.

The term of tenure of any Fellowship shall be deemed to commence at the date of admission to

that Fellowship.

Every Fellow except as hereinafter provided shall vacate his Fellowship at the expiration of the term of years for which he was elected and he shall not be again eligible to a Fellowship except for such special reasons as would render him eligible under Statute VI 4, or Statute VI 4A, or Statute XXX.

Provided always

- (a) That if a person elected under the provisions of Statute VI 4 be or become a Professor of the University he shall retain his Fellowship so long as he holds his Professorship; but in all other respects the tenure of the Fellowship of every Fellow elected under the provisions of Statute VI 4 shall be subject to the same rules as apply to the case of other Fellows.
- (b) That if any Fellow hold any one of the offices of Bursar Dean Tutor Assistant Tutor or Lecturer in the College then provided he shall have served for ten years in one or more of such offices he shall hold his Fellowship for six years clear and independent of those during which he held any of the said offices and then vacate his Fellowship; provided always that if he shall have held one or more of such offices for twenty years in all he shall retain his Fellowship for life unless he become otherwise disqualified under the provisions of these Statutes; and provided that so long as a Fellow continues to hold any of the above offices he shall not be required to vacate his Fellowship.

(c) That any Fellow who is appointed to a Professorship or Readership in the University shall hold his Fellowship as long as he holds a Professorship or Readership.

By repealing section 3 of Statute XXIII intituled "Of Fellows proceeding to Degrees," and substituting therefor the following section to form section 3 of the same Statute:—

Every Fellow shall preserve his seniority in the order of Fellows according to the priority of admission to the Fellowship which he holds.

THE LEE CONSERVANCY BOARD.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Lee Con-servancy Board propose to make the following Bye-laws (that is to say):-

Loading and Unloading of Petrol and other Dangerous Goods upon the River Lee.

The Lee Conservancy Board in exercise of the powers and authority vested in them by "The Lee Conservancy Acts (1868 to 1900)" and "The Lee Navigation Improvement Acts" and of every other authority them hereunto in anywise enabling order and direct as follows that is

1. Bye-law Number 56 of The River Lee General Bye-laws made by the Board and allowed by His Majesty in Council on the 21st day of December 1908 shall after these present Byelaws have been allowed by His Majesty in Council be and the same is hereby repealed.

2. These Bye-laws may be cited as "The River Lee Petrol and other Dangerous Goods and shall come into operation on the Bye-laws"

1st day of June 1910.

3. In these Bye-laws the following words and expressions shall have the several meanings hereinafter assigned to them unless there be something in the subject or context repugnant to such construction viz. :-

"The Board" means the Lee Conservancy

Board.

"The Navigation" means and includes all the navigable portions of the River Lee as defined by the 3rd section of "The Lee Conservancy Act, 1868."

"Petrol" includes any rock oil Rangoon oil

Burmah oil oil made from petroleum coal schist shale peat or other bituminous substance and any products of petroleum also naphtha wood spirit and any other liquid or substance or any product of or mixture with any liquid or substance which when tested in the manner set forth in Schedule I to the Petroleum Act 1879 or in the Schedule to the Order in Council as to mixtures of petroleum made on the 7th day of May 1907 gives off an inflammable vapour at a temperature of less than *73 degrees of Fabrenheit's thermometer.

"Barge" includes any dumb barge or other craft for carrying goods or any sailing barge.

"Petrol tank barge" means any tank barge or barge fitted with a tank or tanks which is used for the conveyance on the Navigation of

petrol as defined in these Bye-laws.

"Dangerous goods" includes carbide of calcium and other carbides and all goods (other than explosives as defined by the Explosives Act 1875 and petrol as defined in these Byelaws) which are or may be specified from time to time in the "Special Classification of Explosives and other Dangerous Goods by Merchandise Trains" issued annually by the Railway Clearing House.
"Person" includes a firm or a body cor-

porate.

"Owner" means master owner consignee

consignor broker or agent.

"Master" means any person having or taking the command charge or management of a barge or a petrol tank barge for the time being.

"Engineer" means the person for the time being acting in that capacity for the Board or,

some person deputed by him.

"Wharf" means any quay landing place siding or other place upon the Navigation at which goods are landed loaded or unloaded.

"Horse" includes all draught animals. Words importing the masculine gender include females and words importing the

singular include the plural.

4. All barges or petrol tank barges conveying petrol shall when moored or anchored lie singly and there shall be a clear space of not less than 100 feet of waterway kept between any such barges or petrol tank barges. Provided that this Bye-law shall not apply in the case of a barge or petrol tank barge conveying petrol when passing through a lock or when lying alongside a wharf and actually loading or discharging nor to a tug and barges or petrol tank barges conveying petrol moored or anchored on account of fog or other exceptional causes.

5. There shall be displayed at the stern of every barge or petrol tank barge conveying petrol and every empty petrol tank barge on entering the Navigation and during the time that such barge or petrol tank barge remains on the Navigation a red metal flag not less than eighteen inches square with a white circular centre six inches in diameter and no tug shall tow such a barge or petrol tank barge without also exhibiting a similar flag in a conspicuous position above the deck.

6. The following Bye-laws in respect of the loading or discharge of petrol within the Navigation shall in every case be complied with :-

(A) From the time when the holds or tanks of a barge or a petrol tank barge are first opened for the purpose of loading or discharging petrol until the loading of such petrol shall have been completed and the holds or tanks securely fastened or until such time as all petrol shall have been discharged from such barge or petrol tank barge and the holds or tanks shall have been thoroughly ventilated and cleansed there shall be no fire or artificial light on board such barge or petrol tank

(B) When the loading or discharge of petrol has been commenced such loading or discharge shall be proceeded with with all due speed and diligence and should it be impracticable to complete the loading or discharge of any barge or petrol tank barge conveying petrol before one hour after sunset on any day all tanks and holds shall be securely fastened immediately

such loading or discharge is discontinued and all the same precautions taken as if the loading had been completed or as though bulk had not been broken.

(c) Petrol shall not be loaded or discharged later than one hour after sunset or earlier than

one hour before sunrise.

(D) No petrol shall be discharged at any of the Board's public wharves until the means of transport by which the same is to be removed therefrom shall be at the wharf in readiness to receive the same and all petrol so discharged shall be forthwith removed from the wharf to some place beyond the limits of the jurisdiction of the Board.

7. No petrol shall be conveyed upon the Navigation in any other barges except petrol tank barges unless it is safely stowed in metal barrels drums or other similar receptacles of metal.

8. No person owner or master shall convey petrol upon the Navigation in any metal barrels drums or other similar receptacles which are not staunch and free from leakage.

· 9. The following Bye-laws shall always be observed in respect to barges or petrol tank barges conveying petrol and empty petrol tank barges:—

- (a) No. barge or petrol tank barge laden with petrol or any empty petrol tank barge shall be navigated on the Navigation later than one hour after sunset or earlier than one hour before sunrise.
- (B) No barge or petrol tank barge conveying petrol or any empty petrol tank barge shall be navigated above Bow Locks or in the Limehouse Cut except in tow of a horse and not more than one such barge petrol tank barge or empty petrol tank barge shall be towed at one time.
- (c) No other barge or petrol tank barge shall be towed at the same time with any barge or petrol tank barge conveying petrol or with any empty petrol tank barge.
- (D) No lights shall be lighted or extinguished on board a barge or petrol tank barge conveying petrol or any empty petrol tank barge and no such barge or petrol tank barge or any empty petrol tank barge shall when under way have on board any lights or lamps under any circumstances whatever.
- (E) No fire or artificial light or matches or other means of producing ignition shall be caused or permitted to be upon a barge or petrol tank barge conveying petrol or on any empty petrol tank barge nor shall any person smoke nor shall smoking be permitted to take place on board such barge or petrol tank barge or on any empty petrol tank barge at any time.

(F) No person when on board a barge or petrol tank barge conveying petrol or on any empty petrol tank barge shall have on his person any matches or other means of pro-

ducing ignition.

(G) Every barge or petrol tank barge conveying petrol and every empty petrol tank barge shall at all times during the navigation loading or discharge thereof be under the control and personal supervision of the master thereof whose duty it shall be to prevent the access of any unauthorised person and to take all possible precautions against fire.

(H) Immediately after the discharge of the petrol and before the barge or petrol tank barge conveying petrol is removed or the horse or tug approaches for the purpose of such removal the master shall after first cleansing the holds and tanks securely close

or cause to be securely closed all manholes valves and ventilators.

- 10. The following Bye-laws in addition to those contained in Bye-law No. 9 shall always be observed in respect to petrol tank barges:—
 - (A) Immediately after any petrol tank barge is loaded and before it is removed from the wharf at which it has been loaded all manholes shall be screwed down gas tight all valves on suction pipes closed and all ventilator openings securely stopped or covered with wire gauze.

(B) No manholes valves or ventilators shall be opened whilst any petrol tank barge is in tow of a horse or a tug or before it has been made fast to the wharf at which the petrol is

to be discharged.

11. No barge or petrol tank barge conveying petrol or empty petrol tank barge shall be navigated on the Navigation unless it has two competent men in constant attendance on board.

- 12. No barge or petrol tank barge conveying petrol shall be moored in or lie in the Navigation except the same be constantly in charge of a competent person on board such barge or petrol tank barge until all petrol on board shall have been discharged and the barge properly ventilated and every empty petrol tank barge moored or lying in the Navigation shall be constantly in charge of a competent person on board.
- 18. No petrol or dangerous goods shall be discharged or allowed to escape into the Navigation.
- 14. The owner and master shall take all due and proper precautions for the prevention of accident either by fire or otherwise in the loading or discharge of petrol or dangerous goods within the Navigation.
- 15. The bilges of a petrol tank barge or of a barge used for the conveyance of petrol or dangerous goods shall not be pumped when such petrol tank barge or barge is on the Navigation.
- 16. Every barge or petrol tank barge on the Navigation containing petrol or carrying petrol or dangerous goods shall proceed to its destination without unnecessary delay and all petrol or dangerous goods contained therein shall be discharged forthwith after arrival at the destination.
- 17. The master shall when so required by the Engineer or by any officer of the Board show to such Engineer or officer all petrol or dangerous goods under his control upon the barge or petrol tank barge and shall afford every reasonable facility to enable such Engineer or officer to inspect and examine such petrol or dangerous goods and such barge or petrol tank barge so that he may ascertain whether the provisions of these Bye-laws are duly observed.

18. Numbers 1, 2, 3 (so far as applicable) 6 (B) (C) and (D) 9 (A) (C) and (G) 11 and 12 of these Bye-laws shall also apply to carbide of calcium and other carbides and in addition the following Bye-laws shall be observed viz.:—

(a) Carbide of calcium and other carbides shall only be brought into or carried on the Navigation in hermetically closed metal receptacles containing each not more than 224 lbs. of such strength and construction or so protected as not to be liable to be broken or to become defective or insecure in conveyance otherwise than by gross negligence or extraordinary accident.

(B) No receptacle containing carbide of calcium or other carbides shall be opened. within the jurisdiction of the Board except in some duly licensed place of storage.

(c) Every precaution shall be taken to

prevent the contact of water or moisture with

the carbide of calcium or other carbides and where such contact may have occurred to prevent the gas evolved from being ignited.

(D) Every receptable containing carbide of calcium or other carbides shall be labelled and such label shall bear in conspicuous characters the words "Carbide. Dangerous if not kept dry" and with the following caution:—"The contents of this package are liable if brought into contact with moisture to give off a highly inflammable gas" and with the addition of the name and address of the sender.

19. When any barge or petrol tank barge conveying petrol or dangerous goods or any empty petrol tank barge or any such petrol or dangerous goods is or are navigated moored loaded discharged or otherwise dealt with in contravention of any of the above Bye-laws the owner and master of such barge or petrol tank barge or empty petrol tank barge or the owner of such petrol or dangerous goods shall each incur a penalty not exceeding £5 for each day on which such contravention continues and it shall be lawful for the Engineer to cause such barge or petrol tank barge or any such petrol or dangerous goods to be removed at the expense of the owner thereof to some place of safety and all expenses of or incident to such removal may be recovered in the same manner in which penalties are by "The Lee Conservancy Acts 1868 to 1900" made recoverable.
