#### Whitehall, April 25, 1910.

The KING has been pleased to confer the Albert Medal of the First Class upon Mr. Thomas Reynolds, Railway Conductor, of North Bay, Ontario, Canada, for conspicuous gallantry in saving the lives of eleven persons on the occasion of the disaster on the Canadian Pacific Railway at the Spanish River Bridge, near Webbwood, Ontario, on the 21st January last, as detailed below:—

The ill-fated express train left Sudbury, Ontario, for Minneapolis, at noon on the day in question in charge of Conductor Thomas Reynolds. It consisted of the engine, a mail and baggage car, an express-package car, a second class coach, a colonist car, a first class coach, a dining car, and a Pullman sleeping car and, as it approached the bridge crossing the Spanish River at a point where the stream is 250 feet wide and 30 feet deep, Conductor Reynolds and several passengers were seated at dinner in the dining car. On reaching the bridge a part of the train left the track and plunged down the embankment.

Two of the vehicles, a first class car and the dining car, crashed through the ice, which is said to have been 18 inches thick, and sank to the river bed. The first class car falling into some 15 feet of water, it is not likely that any of the occupants escaped. The dining car was almost completely submerged, and but for the resource-fulness and heroic conduct of the conductor the

disaster would have resulted in a much heavier death roll.

The fore part of the car rapidly filled with water and the occupants, hurled to the end of the car, were in danger of drowning in 10 feet of water, their situation being made more perilous by the accumulation of débris. Reynolds, on coming to the surface, found daylight entering from the top of a window some 6 inches above the level of the water, and, grasping a hat rack, he smashed with his feet the heavy plate glass windows. He then turned his attention to the imprisoned passengers, rescuing those in danger of drowning, and urging all to make use of the only means of support, namely, hat racks, lamps, &c. The passengers having been assisted in this way, he turned to effect an exit; only to find that the car had settled down, and that the opening made was submerged. After swimming about and locating the broken window with his feet, he dived and cautiously pushed himself through the window, using his feet to keep a hold on the window frame, in order that his body might not be swept away by the strong

With great difficulty he brought his body between the broken ice and the submerged car and succeeded in gaining a foothold on the top of the car. He at once commenced wrenching the fan lights from the roof and succeeded in rescuing a lad and still another passenger through the small opening thus made. When, shortly after, an axe was brought to him, in response to his cries for help, he enlarged the opening sufficiently to allow of the rescue of the other imprisoned passengers.

Reynolds was badly cut and injured and was for some time under medical care.

The presentation of the medal, in the name of His Majesty, was performed by His Excellency the Governor-General of Canada at Montreal, on the 16th ultimo. At the Court at Saint James's, the 22nd day of April, 1910.

HEREAS His Majesty was pleased, by His Commission dated the fifth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and ten, to nominate and appoint His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales in His Majesty's absence from His Realm in Foreign Parts to hold on His Majesty's behalf His Privy Council, and to signify thereat His approval of any matter or thing whereunto His Royal Highness should be authorised by writing under His Majesty's Sign Manual, and to do further on His Majesty's behalf any matter or thing for the purposes of the said Commission whereunto His Royal Highness should be authorised in manner aforesaid:

And whereas by section one of the Motor Car (International Circulation) Act, 1909, it is enacted as follows:—

"1. (1) His Majesty may, by Order in Council for the purpose of giving effect to any convention for facilitating the international circulation of

motor cars, provide—

"(a) for the grant and authentication of any travelling passes, certificates, or authorities which may be of use to persons resident in the United Kingdom when temporarily taking their motor cars abroad, or to drivers when proceeding abroad for the purpose of driving

motor cars; and

"(b) for modifying the provisions of the Motor Car Act, 1903, relating to the registration of motor cars and the licensing of motor car drivers in the case of motor cars brought temporarily into the United Kingdom by persons resident abroad, and intending to make only a temporary stay in the United Kingdom, and of drivers entering the United Kingdom for the purpose of driving any such cars.

"(2) Any modifications of the Motor Car Act, 1903, made by an Order in Council under this section shall have effect as if they were contained

in that Act."

And whereas on the eleventh day of October, one thousand nine hundred and nine, a Convention (hereinafter referred to as "the Convention") with respect to the international circulation of motor cars was concluded at Paris between the foreign countries following, that is to say:—Germany, Belgium, France, Italy, Monaco, Roumania, and Servia, and since that date His Majesty and the foreign countries following, namely:—Austria and Hungary, Bulgaria, Spain, Greece, Montenegro, the Netherlands, Portugal and Russia have acceded to the Convention:

And whereas His Majesty and certain of the aforesaid foreign countries have ratified the Convention:

And whereas Articles 1 and 2, part of Article 3, Article 4 and part of Article 6 of the Convention and Annexe C appended to the Convention are in the terms set forth in the First Schedule to this Order:

. Now, therefore, His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, being authorised thereto by writing under His Majesty's Sign Manual, doth hereby by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, and by virtue of the authority committed to His Majesty by the Motor Car (International Circulation) Act, 1909, for the purpose of giving effect to the Convention, order and it is hereby ordered as follows

PART I.—BRITISH CARS GOING ABROAD.

Article I.—(1). The Local Government Board shall be the competent authority and they are hereby empowered to carry out in accordance with, and subject to the provisions of, this Order, the following duties, that is to say:—

(a) To examine any motor car registered in any part of the United Kingdom under the provisions of the Motor Car Act, 1903, which is submitted for examination and, if satisfied,

after such examination

(i) that the motor car is suitable for use on the highway in a foreign country, and that it fulfils the conditions specified in subdivisions (1) (2) (3) and (4) of Article I of the First Schedule to this Order or, in the case of a motor cycle, the said conditions as modified by the paragraph numbered (1) in Article 6 of that Schedule; or

(ii) that the motor car is of a type which is suitable for the purpose aforesaid, and which complies with the specified conditions; to issue a Certificate of Fitness in the Form A in the Second Schedule to this Order or in a

form to the like effect;

(b) To examine any person submitting himself for examination and, if upon examination he is found to be competent, to issue to him a Driver's Certificate of Competence in the Form B in the Second Schedule to this Order, or in a form to the like effect: Provided that a Certificate of Competence shall not be granted to any person who is under eighteen years of age, or who does not hold a licence to drive issued in pursuance of the Motor Car Act, 1903;

(c) To issue, subject to the conditions of Article II of this Order, to the owner of any motor car registered as aforesaid, an International Travelling Pass under the Seal of the

Local Government Board;

(d) To prescribe the type or types of motor cars for the purposes of sub-division (ii) in paragraph (a) of sub-division (1) of this Article.

(2) (i.) The Local Government Board may, under such conditions as they think fit, authorise by Order one or more Associations to perform all or any of the duties specified in subdivision (1) of this Article and may at any time revoke all or any part of such authorisation.

(ii.) An Association authorised as aforesaid shall keep in a form or forms to be approved by the Local Government Board a Register or Registers of all Certificates and International Travelling Passes issued by them under such authorisation, and the Register or Registers shall be open to inspection by the Local Government Board or by any person authorised by the Board.

Article II.—(1) The following conditions shall be fulfilled before an International Travelling Pass is issued:—

(a) The motor car for which an International Travelling Pass is issued shall be a motor car in respect of which a Certificate of Fitness shall have been issued in pursuance of Article I of this Order; and

(b) Particulars as to the driver or drivers of the motor car shall be indicated on the International Travelling Pass in the place provided for the purpose, and every such driver shall possess a Certificate of Competence issued in pursuance of Article I of this Order.

(2) Every Certificate of Fitness or of Competence and every International Travelling Pass issued under the foregoing provisions shall be valid for a period of one year from the dute of

issue.

Article III.—The following fees shall be chargeable on the issue of a Certificate or an International Travelling Pass under the foregoing provisions of this Order:—

Certificate of Fitness of motor

car . . . . seven shillings.

Driver's Certificate of Com-

petence ... seven shillings.
International Travelling Pass seven shillings.
In the case of a motor cycle one half only of the foregoing fees shall be chargeable.

### PART II.—FOREIGN CARS ARRIVING IN THE UNITED KINGDOM.

Article IV.—(1) Any person in charge of a motor car not registered in any part of the United Kingdom under the provisions of the Motor Car Act, 1903, and landed at a port in the United Kingdom may, on production of the International Travelling Pass issued in respect of such car, make application to the Chief. Customs and Excise Officer of the port (hereinafter referred to as "the Customs Officer") for the registration of such car, and for the issue to the person or persons whose name or names appear on the Pass as a driver of such car of a licence to drive such car.

(2) The Customs Officer, if satisfied that the period for which the Pass is valid has not expired and that the car corresponds with the car described in the Pass and has affixed to it the plates required to be carried on the car by Article 4 of the First Schedule to this Order, as modified in the case of a motor cycle by the paragraph numbered (3) in Article 6 of that Schedule, shall, on payment of a fee of twenty shillings (or in the case of a motor-cycle, ten shillings), register the car in the Register referred to in sub-division (3) of this Article, and shall issue a licence or licences to drive such car to the person or persons whose name or names appear in the Pass as driver of the car; he shall also insert in the part of the Pass set aside for the purpose the name of the port and the date, and shall append his signature and the Customs stamp. Such licence shall be in the Form C in the Second Schedule to this Order or in a form to the like effect. He shall at the same time give to the person or persons to whom he shall have issued such licence or licences an extract from the statutory enactments and regulations relating to motor cars.

(3) The Customs Officer shall keep a copy of every licence issued under the provisions of this Article, and shall also keep a Register (hereinafter referred to as "the Register of Foreign Motor Cars") of the motor cars registered under the provisions of this Article. The Register of Foreign Motor Cars shall be in the Form D in the Second Schedule to this Order or in a form to the like effect.

(4) The Customs Officer, on the registration of a motor car and on the issue of a licence to drive, shall immediately forward to the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis (hereinafter referred to as "the Commissioner") at Scotland Yard a copy of the entry in the Register of Foreign

Motor Cars and a copy of the licence.

(5) Any person whose motor car has been registered in accordance with the foregoing provisions shall, on the departure of the car from any port in the United Kingdom for a foreign country, cause the International Travelling Pass issued in respect of such car to be produced to the Customs Officer at the port, who shall insert in the Pass the name of the port and the date of departure of the car and shall sign the Pass. The Officer shall notify to the Commissioner the departure from the port of any such car.

Article V.—The Commissioner shall cause to be kept at Scotland Yard (i.) a Register of foreign motor cars registered in the United Kingdom in pursuance of Article IV. of this Order, in which shall be entered the particulars as to the registration and departure of cars required to be furnished by the Customs Officer in pursuance of sub-divisions (4) and (5) of that Article, and (ii.) a Register of licences issued to drivers of motor cars in pursuance of Article IV. of this Order in which shall be entered the particulars of licences furnished by the Customs Officer in pursuance of sub-division (4) of that Article and the particulars required to be sent to the Commissioner by paragraph (c) of sub-section (1) of Section 4 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, as applied by sub-division (4) of Article VI of this Order. The said Register of licences shall be in the Form E in the Second Schedule to this Order or in a form to the like effect.

#### Part III.—Modification of the Motor Car Act, 1903.

Article VI.—In the application of the Motor Car Act, 1903, to any motor car registered, and to any person licensed to drive a motor car, in pursuance of Article IV of this Order the following modifications of the Act shall have effect:—

- (1) In sub-section (2) of Section I of the Act (a) there shall be added after the words "or "produce his licence on demand," the words "or produce on demand the Licence issued to him in pursuance of Article IV of the Motor Car "(International Circulation) Order, 1910, and "the International Travelling Pass issued in "respect of such car"; and (b) there shall be substituted for the words "mark or marks of "identification," the words "plates required to "be carried by Article 4 of the First Schedule to "that Order as modified in the case of a motor "cycle by the paragraph numbered (3) in Article "6 of that Schedule."
- (2) The requirements of Section 2 of the Act shall be deemed to be satisfied as regards any motor car registered in pursuance of Article IV of this Order and exhibiting the plates required to be carried by Article 4 of the First Schedule to this Order as modified in the case of a motor cycle by the paragraph numbered (3) in Article 6 of that Schedule: Provided that in the case of proceedings under sub-section (4) of that section any plate or plates required to be carried as aforesaid shall be deemed to be the mark referred to in the sub-section: Provided further that whenever during the period between one hour after sunset and one hour before sunrise any such motor car is used on a public highway, or on a roadway to which the public are granted access, a lamp is kept burning on the car, so contrived as to illuminate by means of reflection, transparency, or otherwise, and render easily distinguishable every letter or figure on the plates required to be carried as aforesaid.
- (3) Any person to whom a licence to drive a motor car has been issued by a Customs Officer in pursuance of Article IV. of this Order shall be deemed to be licensed under section 3 of the Act, and a person driving a motor car registered in accordance with this Order who produces such licence shall be deemed to have complied with the requirements of sub-section (4) of the section.
- (4) Paragraphs (a) and (c) of sub-section (1) and sub-sections (2) (3) and (5) of Section 4 of the Act shall apply to any licence issued by a Customs Officer in pursuance of Article IV of this Order as if such licence were a licence granted

under the Act: Provided that the Commissioner shall be substituted for the Council referred to in the said paragraph (c) as the authority to whom a copy of the particulars therein mentioned shall be sent.

(5) In Section 5 of the Act there shall be substituted for the words "any mark for "identifying a car or any licence under this Act" the words "any plate required to be carried by "Article 4 of the First Schedule to the Motor "Car (International Circulation) Order, 1910, as "modified in the case of a motor cycle by the "paragraph numbered (3) in Article 6 of that "Schedule or any licence issued by a Customs "Officer in pursuance of Article IV of that Order."

PART IV.—APPLICATION TO SCOTLAND AND IRELAND.

Article VII.—In the application of this Order to Scotland and Ireland there shall be substituted for a reference to the Local Government Board a reference to the Secretary for Scotland and a reference to the Local Government Board for Ireland respectively.

Article VIII.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Motor Car (International Circulation) Order,

1910.

(2) This Order shall come into operation on the first day of May, one thousand nine hundred and ten.

#### FIRST SCHEDULE.

#### ARTICLE 1.

Conditions to be fulfilled by Motor Cars in order to be allowed to be driven on the highway.

Every motor car, in order to be allowed to be driven on the highway in a foreign country, must either have been recognised as suitable for use on the highway after an examination before the competent Authority or before an association authorised by that Authority, or must belong to a type approved in the same manner.

The examination must be directed specially to

the following points:-

- (1) The machinery must be such as can be trusted to work efficiently and must be so designed as to prevent, as far as possible, all danger of fire or explosion, as not to frighten by its noise animals, whether ridden or driven, and as not to give rise to any other cause of danger to traffic or seriously to inconvenience by the emission of smoke or vapour any persons using the road.
- using the road.
  (2) The motor car must be provided with the following:—
  - (a) A strong steering apparatus which will allow the car to be turned readily and with certainty;
  - (b) Two brakes, each independent of the other and adequate for its purpose. One at least of these brakes must be capable of acting rapidly and directly upon the wheels or upon brake-drums immovably fixed thereto;
  - (c) A mechanism which is capable of preventing even on steep gradients any backward movement, if one of the brakes is not of itself sufficient for the purpose.

Every motor car whose weight unladen exceeds 350 kilogrammes must be so constructed that the driver can, from his seat, reverse the movement of the car by means of the driving power.

(3) All the driving and steering apparatus must be so arranged that the driver can manipulate it with certainty and at the same time

have a clear view of the road.

(4) Every motor car must be provided with plates showing the name of the manufacturer of the chassis and the manufacturer's number, the horse-power of the engine or the number and bore of its cylinders, and also the weight of the car unladen.

Conditions à remplir par les Automobiles pour être admis à circuler sur la voie publique.

Tout automobile, pour être admis internationalement à circuler sur la voie publique, doit, ou bien avoir été reconnu apte à être mis en circulation après examen devant l'autorité compétente ou devant une Association habilitée par celle-ci, ou bien appartenir à un type agréé de la même manière.

L'examen doit porter notamment sur les pointssuivants:—

- (1) Les appareils doivent être d'un fonctionnement sûr et disposés de façon à écarter dans la mesure du possible, tout danger d'incendie ou d'explosion; à ne pas effrayer par le bruit les bêtes de selle ou de trait, à ne constituer aucune autre cause de danger pour la circulation et à ne pas incommoder sérieusement les passants par la fumée ou la vapeur.
- (2) L'automobile doit être pourvu des appareils suivants:—
  - (a) D'un robuste appareil de direction qui permette d'effectuer facilement et sûrement les virages;
  - (b) De deux systèmes de freinage, indépendants l'un de l'autre et suffisament efficaces. L'un au moins de ces systèmes doit être à action rapide, agir directement sur les roues ou sur des couronnes immédiatement solidaires de celles-ci;
  - (c) D'un mécanisme qui puisse empêcher, même sur les côtes raides, tout mouvement en arrière, si l'un des systèmes de freins ne remplit pas cette condition.

Tout automobile dont le poids à vide excède 350 kilogrammes doit être muni d'un dispositif tel que l'on puisse, du siège du conducteur, lui imprimer un mouvement, de recul au moyen du moteur.

- (3) Les organes de manœuvre doivent êtregroupés de façon que le conducteur puisse les actionner d'une manière sûre sans cesser de surveiller la route.
- (4) Tout automobile doit être pourvu de plaques indiquant la maison qui a construit le châssis et le numéro de fabrication du châssis, la puissauce en chevaux-vapeur du moteur ou le nombre et l'alésage des cylindres, et le poids à vide de la voiture.

#### ARTICLE 2.

### Conditions to be fulfilled by Drivers of Motor Cars.

The driver of a motor car must possess qualifications which provide a sufficient guarantee of public safety.

## Conditions à remplir pour les Conducteurs d'Automobiles.

Le conducteur d'un automobile doit avoir les qualités qui donnent une garantie suffisante pour la sécurité publique. In so far as the driving of motor cars in foreign countries is concerned, no one may drive a motor car without having received for that purpose an authorisation given by a competent Authority or by an Association authorised by that Authority after having shown himself on examination to be competent.

Such an authorisation must not be given to a person less than 18 years of age.

En ce qui concerne la circulation internationale, nul ne peut conduire un automobile sans avoir reçu, à cet effet, une autorisation délivrée par une autorité compétente ou par une association habilitée par celle-ci, après qu'il aura fait la preuve de son aptitude.

L'autorisation ne peut être accordée à des personnes âgées de moins de 18 ans.

#### ARTICLE 3.

Issue and Recognition of International Travelling Passes.

In order to secure as regards the driving of Motor Cars in foreign countries that the conditions mentioned in Articles 1 and 2 are fulfilled, International Travelling Passes shall be issued.

These passes shall be valid for one year from the date of issue. The manuscript entries therein shall always be written in Latin characters or in ordinary English handwriting.

#### Délivrance et Reconnaissance des Certificats Internationaux de Route.

En vue de certifier pour la circulation internationale que les conditions prévues dans les Articles 1 et 2 sont remplies, des certificats internationaux de route seront délivrés.

Ces certificats seront valables pendant un an à partir de la date de leur délivrance. Les indications manuscrites qu'ils contiendront seront toujours écrites en caractères latins ou cursives anglaises.

#### ARTICLE 4.

Arrangement of Identification Marks on Motor Cars.

No motor car shall be allowed to pass from one country into another unless it carries fixed in a visible position on the back of the car, in addition to the number plate of its own nationality, a distinctive plate displaying letters indicating that nationality. The size of this plate and the method and size of the lettering are prescribed in a note appended to the present Convention (Annexe C).

### Disposition des Numéros d'Immatriculation sur les Automobiles.

Aucun automobile ne sera admis à passer d'un pays dans un autre s'il ne porte en évidence, à l'arrière, outre une plaque nationale numérotée, une plaque distinctive munie de lettres établissant sa nationalité. Les dimensions de cette plaque, les lettres ainsi que leurs dimensions sont fixées dans un tableau annexé à la présente Convention (Annexe C).

#### ARTICLE 6.

Special Provisions with Regard to Motor Cycles.

The provisions of this Convention apply to motor tricycles and motor bicycles, subject to the following modifications:—

- (1) The machinery intended to prevent a car from slipping backwards referred to in paragraph (c) of sub-division (2) of Article 1 is not required, nor is the reversing gear.
- (3) The distinctive nationality plate of motor cycles shall measure only 18 centimetres in width and 12 centimetres in height. The letters shall measure 8 centimetres in height, the breadth of each line being 10 millimetres.

Dispositions Particulières aux Motocycles et aux Motocyclettes.

Les stipulations de la présente Convention sont applicables aux motocycles à trois roues et aux motocyclettes, sous réserve des modifications suivantes:—

- Le mécanisme destiné à empêcher la dérive en arrière, visé au (2) de l'Article 1 sous la lettre (c) n'est pas exigé, non plus que le mécanisme de marche arrière.
- (3) En ce qui touche les motocycles et les motocyclettes, la plaque distinctive de la nationalité mesurera seulement 18 centimètres dans le sens horizontal et 12 centimètres dans le sens vertical; les lettres mesureront 8 centimètres de hauteur, la largeur de leurs traits étant de 10 millimètres.

#### ANNEXE C.

The distinctive mark of the country of origin shall consist of an oval plate 30 centimetres in width and 18 centimetres in height, bearing one or two letters painted in black upon a white ground. The letters shall be formed of capital letters in Latin characters, and shall measure at least 10 centimetres in height, the breadth of each line being 15 millimetres. The distinctive letters for the different countries shall be the following:—

Germany, D; Austria, A; Belgium, B; Spain, E; United States of America, US; France, F; Great Britain and Ireland, GB; Greece, GR; Hungary, H; Italy, I; Montenegro, MN; Monaco, MC; the Netherlands, NL; Portugal, P; Russia, R; Roumania, RM; Servia, SB; Sweden, S; Switzerland, CH; Bulgaria, BG.

La marque distinctive du pays d'origine est constituée par une plaque ovale de 30 centimètres de largeur sur 18 centimètres de hauteur, portant une ou deux lettres peintes en noir sur fond blanc. Les lettres sont formées de caractères latins majuscules. Elles ont, au minimum, 10 centimètres de hauteur; leurs traits ont 15 millimètres d'épaisseur. Les lettres distinctives pour les différents pays sont les suivantes:—

Allemagne, D; Autriche, A; Belgique, B; Espagne, E; Etats-Unis, US; France, F; Grande-Bretagne, GB; Grèce, GR; Hongrie, H; Italie, I; Monténégro, MN; Monaco, MC; Pays-Bas, NL; Portugal, P; Russie, R; Roumanie, RM; Serbie, SB; Suède, S; Suisse, CH; Bulgarie, BG.

#### BOROUGH OF EALING.

Scheme for the alteration of ward boundaries made in pursuance of section thirty of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, and section two of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1893.

ARTICLE I.—This scheme shall, except so far as is otherwise herein expressly provided, or as there may be anything in the subject-matter or context inconsistent therewith, come into operation on the first day of November, one thousand nine hundred and ten.

ARTICLE II.—Subject as regards any future alteration of the wards hereby constituted to the provisions of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, and any Act amending the same as to the alterations of wards, the following provisions shall have effect:—

- (1) For the purposes of the election of councillors the borough shall continue to be divided into six wards, which shall continue to be termed respectively the Drayton Ward, the Castlebar Ward, the Mount Park Ward, the Lammas Ward, the Manor Ward, and the Grange Ward.
- (2) The boundaries of the Drayton, Castlebar and Mount Park Wards shall continue to be those described in Part 2 of the First Schedule to the Charter of Incorporation of the said borough, dated the third day of June, one thousand nine hundred and one.

The boundaries of the Lammas, Manor and Grange Wards shall be as follows:—

Lammas Ward.—On the north, the southern boundary of the Drayton Ward. On the west and south, the boundaries of the borough. On the east, a line commencing in the Uxbridge-road at the junction of Northfield-lane therewith, passing along the centre of Northfield-lane from north to south to the junction therewith of Little Ealing-lane. Thence along the centre of Little Ealing-lane to the junction therewith of Radbourne-avenue, and thence along the centre of Radbourne-avenue and Junction-road to the boundary of the borough.

Manor Ward.—On the north, the centre line of the Uxbridge-road, and on the south the boundary of the borough. On the west, the aforesaid eastern boundary of the Lammas Ward. On the east, a line commencing in the Uxbridge-road at the junction of the High-street therewith, passing along the centre of High-street, St. Mary's-road and Ealing-road from north to south to the boundary of the borough.

Grange Ward.—On the north, the centre line of the Uxbridge-road, and on the south and east, the boundaries of the borough. On the west, the aforesaid eastern boundary of the Manor Ward.

- (3) Each of the said wards shall comprise the portion of the borough indicated by a separate colour and distinguished by the name of the ward on the maps each marked "Map of the Wards of the Borough of Ealing as altered, 1910," one of which shall be sent herewith to the Secretary of State to be submitted by him to His Majesty in Council for approval, and the other shall be deposited by the Town Clerk of the borough at his office within fourteen days after the date of this scheme.
- (4) Nothing herein contained shall affect the existing distribution of Councillors among the said wards.
