#### THE FAIRS ACT, 1873.

##### LLANDOVERY FAIRS.

Whereas on the 9th February, 1910, a representation was made to me, as Secretary of State for the Home Department, by the Llandoverly Town Council to the effect that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that the Fair which has been held annually at Llandoverly on the 16th day of May should in future be held on the 15th day of May; provided that if the 15th be a Sunday the Fair be held on the Monday following unless that Monday be Whit-Monday: and in the event of the 15th or the 16th day of May being Whit-Monday the Fair to be held on the preceding Thursday:

And whereas notice of the said representation and of the time when the same would be taken into consideration has been duly published in pursuance of the Fairs Act, 1873:

And whereas on such representation and consideration it appears to me that the alteration of the date of the Fair as proposed would be for the convenience and advantage of the public:

Now therefore I, as Secretary of State for the Home Department, in exercise of the powers vested in me by the Fairs Act, 1873, do hereby order that the Fair which has been held annually at Llandoverly on the 16th day of May shall in future be held on the 15th day of May; provided that if the 15th be a Sunday the Fair be held on the Monday following unless that Monday be Whit-Monday: and in the event of the 15th or the 16th day of May being Whit-Monday the Fair to be held on the preceding Thursday.
