MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

County of Middlesex.

Whereas by sub-section 1 of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is enacted that within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by the Local Government Board with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour:

And whereas the County Council of Middlesex have made application to the Local Government Board for a regulation to be made in pursuance of the said sub-section putting the above-mentioned provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising the following roads or parts of roads within the urban district of Staines, in the county of Middlesex, that is to say:—

Clarence-street, from its junction with High-street to the boundary of the urban district at Staines Bridge;

High-street and so much of London-road as extends from its junction with High-street to the milestone near the Crooked Billet Public-House, indicating 16 miles from Hyde Park Corner;

So much of Kingston-road as extends from its junction with High-street to its junction with Gresham-road;

Gresham-road, so much of Laleham-road as extends from its junction with Thames-street, and Thames-street;

Church-street, extending from its junction with High-street to a point opposite the south-eastern corner of St. Mary's Cemetery.

And whereas notice of the said application and of the time and manner in which objections should be made to any such regulation appeared in the London Gazette of the 17th day of December, 1909, and in the "Surrey Comet" and the "West Middlesex Times" of the 18th day of December, 1909:

And whereas certain objections to the making of any regulation in pursuance of the said provisions have been received by the Local Government Board, and it is expedient that further inquiry should be made in the matter of the said application:

Notice is hereby given that R. C. Maxwell, Esquire, Barrister-at-Law, one of the Inspectors of the Local Government Board, will attend at the Town Hall, Staines, on Friday, the thirteenth day of May, 1910, at eleven o'clock in the forenoon, to hold a Local Inquiry into the subject-matter of the said application.

And notice is hereby further given that any person interested may attend at such inquiry, and be heard with reference to the said application.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 2ND MAY 1910.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1909, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

The Narberth (Markets and Sales) Order of 1907 shall not apply to the holding of a market, fair, or sale of animals on any of the following days, namely, the eleventh day of May, the second and twenty-ninth days of June, the thirteenth day of July, the tenth day of August, and the twenty-first day of September, in the current year, or to the exposure for sale of animals on any of those dates in or upon any road or street within the urban district of Narberth.
