We, considering that it is desirable that Friday, the 20th day of May instant, should be observed as mentioned in the 4th section of the statute passed in the 34th year of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter 17, and as a day of General Mourning throughout the United Kingdom, do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Act aforesaid, appoint Friday, the 20th day of May instant, as a special day to be observed in manner provided by the said section, and as a day on which business shall be suspended in terms of the said section. And We do hereby appoint and direct that the said Friday, the 20th day of May instant, shall be observed as a day of General Mourning throughout the United Kingdom and every part thereof. And We do, by this Our Royal Proclamation, command the said day to be so observed, and all Our loving subjects to order themselves accordingly.
