IN obedience to His Majesty's Order in Council of the 7th instant that the Kings, Heralds, and Pursuivants of Arms do attend at the Court at St. James's to proceed with the usual Ceremonies to proclaim His Majesty King George V. the Officers of Arms this day made Proclamation accordingly.

At nine o'clock in the forenoon the Officers of Arms, habited in their tabards, assembled at St. James's Palace, and, attended by the Serjeants-at-Arms, proceeded to the balcony in Friary Court, where, after the trumpets had sounded a

fanfare, the Proclamation was read by Sir Alfred Scott-Gatty, Garter Principal King of Arms, in the presence of the Earl Marshal and several of His Majesty's Ministers.

A Procession was then formed in the following order:—

In Royal Carriages.

The Procession, flanked by the Life Guards, and led, as far as Temple Bar, by the High Bailiff of Westminster in his carriage, moved on

to Charing Cross, where the Proclamation was again read by Windsor Herald. The Procession then moved on to the site of Temple Bar, where a temporary barrier was placed across the street to mark the boundary of the City of London. Bluemantle Pursuivant of Arms advanced between two trumpeters, preceded by two of the Life Guards, and demanded in the usual form admission into the city. On being admitted he was conducted by the City Marshal to the Lord Mayor, who was in attendance in his state carriage, together with the Aldermen, Recorder, Sheriffs, and other Officers of the City. The Order in Council having been delivered to his Lordship, the barrier was directed to be removed, and Bluemantle Pursuivant was conducted to his place in the Procession which then entered the City.

At the corner of Chancery-lane the Proclamation was read a third time by Norroy King of Arms. The Lord Mayor, Aldermen, Recorder, Sheriffs and Officers of the City then followed the Procession to the Royal Exchange, where the Proclamation was read the fourth and last time by Somerset Herald.

Royal Salutes were fired at St. James's Park and the Tower of London.

The streets through which the Procession passed were filled with spectators, and the acclamations were general.

The Officers of Arms and the Serjeants-at-Arms were afterwards entertained by the Lord Mayor at the Mansion House, and returned in the same order to St. James's Palace.

WHEREAS by the late Act of Uniformity which establishes the Liturgy, and enacts, that no Form or Order of Common Prayers be openly used other than what is prescribed and appointed to be used in and by the said Book, it is notwithstanding provided, that in all those Prayers, Litanies, and Collects which do anyway relate to the King, Queen, or Royal Progeny, the Names be altered and changed from Time to Time, and fitted to the present Occasion, according to Direction of lawful Authority: His Majesty was pleased this day in Council to declare His Royal Will and Pleasure, That in all the Prayers, Liturgies, and Collects for the King, instead of the Word "Edward" the Word "George," and in the Prayers for the Royal Family, instead of the Words "Our Gracious Queen Alexandra, George Prince of Wales, the Princess of Wales," the Words "Our Gracious Queen Mary, Alexandra the Queen Mother, Edward Duke of Cornwall," be inserted.

AND His Majesty doth strictly charge and command, That no Edition of the Common Prayer be from henceforth printed but with this Amendment; and that in the meantime, till Copies of such Edition may be had, all Parsons, Vicars, and Curates within this Realm, do (for the

preventing of Mistakes), with the Pen, correct and amend all such prayers in their Church Books, according to the foregoing Direction: And for the better Notice hereof, that this Order be forthwith printed and published, and sent to the several Parishes; and that the Right Reverend the Bishops do take care that Obedience be paid to the same accordingly.

His late Majesty King Edward the Seventh was pleased to signify His pleasure that the Albert Medal of the Second Class be awarded to Major Hugh Lancaster Lithgow, R.F.A., and to Sergeant-Major Charles Stephens, R.F.A., for gallantry in endeavouring to save life as detailed below:—

On the 25th February, 1908, a violent explosion of blank gun cartridges occurred in the store of the 44th Battery, Royal Field Artillery, at Kirkee, India, and while the building was full of smoke, and it was impossible to tell whether a further explosion might follow, Major Lithgow and Sergeant-Major Stephens, hearing that Battery Quarter-Master Sergeant Dennis was in the burning building, at once went to his rescue through the dense smoke, and succeeded in bringing him out, though unhappily he was so seriously hurt that he succumbed to the injuries sustained.

The Medals have now been presented—Major Lithgow's Decoration by Major-General E. A. H. Alderson, C.B., Commanding the 6th (Poona) Division, at a Parade held at Poona on the 1st January, and Sergeant-Major Stephens' Decoration at Cahir, on the 18th April, by the Major-General Commanding the 6th Division, Irish Command.
