I hereby order and direct that, for the purposes of inspection under the Coal Mines Regulation Acts, 1887 to 1908, the Metalliferous Mines Regulation Acts, 1872 and 1875, and the Quarries Act, 1894, the United Kingdom shall be divided into the following districts:—

No. 2 or Newcastle District consisting of the counties of Northumberland and Cumberland, and the northern portion of the county of Durham (namely so much of the county as lies north of a line commencing at the mouth of the River Wear, and following its course westward to the point near the township of Painshaw, where the North Eastern Railway crosses the said river, thence following the said line of the railway north-westward to the Washington Railway Station, and thence the line of the Pontop and South Shields Railway westward to the point where the latter line strikes the boundary line of the township of Medomsley, near Leadgate, thence following the eastern boundary line of the said township of Medomsley northward as far as the River Derwent, and thence proceeding westward along the said River Derwent to the boundary of the county of Northumberland), the detached part of the county of Lancaster, north of Morecambe Bay, and the Isle of Man, No. 3 or Durham District, consisting of the southern portion of the county of Durham (namely, so much of the county as is not included in No. 2 District), Westmorland, and the North Riding of the county of York. No. 4 or York and North Midland District,

No. 4 or York and North Midland District, consisting of the East and West Ridings of the county of York (except that portion of the West Riding which was transferred for administrative purposes from the county of Lancaster by the Local Government Act, 1888), and the counties of Lincoln, Nottingham, and Derby (except that part of the county of Derby which lies south of the River Trent).

No. 5 or Manchester and Ireland District, consisting of so much of the county of Lancaster as is not included in Nos. 2 and 6 Districts; the area which was transferred for administrative purposes from the county of Lancaster to the West Riding of the county of York by the Local Government Act, 1888; and Ireland.

No. 6 or Liverpool and North Wales District, consisting of the south-western portion of the county of Lancaster (namely the parishes of Hesketh-with-Becconsall, Tarleton, Croston, Eccleston, Standish, Wigav, Winwick, and Warrington, and all parishes to the west thereof), and the counties of Chester (except that portion which includes the parishes of Church Lawton, Odd Rode, and Wildboarclough, and the portion situated on east side of North Staffordshire Railway, from Mow Cop Station to North Rode Station, and south of the North Staffordshire Railway from North Rode Station to Rushton Station), Flint, Denbigh, Montgomery, Merioneth, Carnarvon, and Anglesey.

No. 7 or South Wales District, consisting of the counties of Glamorgan, Brecon, Radnor, Cardigan, Carmarthen, Pembroke, and Monmouth.

No. 8 or the Midland and Southern District, consisting of so much of the county of Cheshire as includes the parishes of Church Lawton, Odd Rode, and Wildboarclough, and the portion situated on east side of North Staffordshire Railway from Mow Cop Station to North Rode Station, and south of the North Staffordshire Railway from North Rode Station to Rushton Station, so much of the county of Derby as is not included in No. 4 District, and the counties of Stafford, Salop, Worcester, Leicester, Warwick, Hereford, Gloucester, Northampton, Rutland, Huntingdon, Cambridge, Oxford, Berkshire, Buckingham, Bedford. Hertford, Middlesex, Norfolk, Suffolk, Essex, Somerset, Devon, Cornwall, Dorset, Wiltshire, Hampshire, London, Surrey, Sussex, and Kent.
