WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the eleventh day of May, one thousand nine hundred and ten, in the words following, viz. :—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, seaman or marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas under Chapter XXXVIII of the Regulations for the government of Your Majesty's Naval Service extra pay at various rates is authorized to be paid to Officers, Petty Officers, Men and Boys of Your Majesty's Navy when employed on extra duty:

"And whereas we are of opinion that the rates of extra pay therein laid down are in some instances unnecessarily high when the extra duty is performed by the native ratings (Kroomen, Seedies, Goanese, &c.) employed in Your Majesty's ships on foreign stations:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to authorize us to pay such rates of extra pay in the case of native ratings, within the limits laid down in the above mentioned Regulations for European ratings, as we may from time to time determine.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed, and the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the twenty-first day of May, one thousand nine hundred and ten, in the words following, viz. :—

"Whereas by section three of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted,

inter alia, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, seaman or marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Orders in Council bearing date the twenty-sixth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, and the fifth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and eight, sanction was given to the payment of allowances at the rate of sixteen pounds and twelve pounds per annum respectively to persons employed as Printers and Assistant Printers in the offices of Commanders-in-Chief in Your Majesty's Fleet:

"And whereas it has been found necessary in certain instances to employ persons as Printers and Assistant Printers in the offices of Flag Officers in Your Majesty's Fleet other than those holding appointments as Commanders-in-Chief:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the payment at our discretion of allowances at the rate of sixteen pounds and twelve pounds per annum respectively to persons employed in the offices of any Flag Officer, subject to the concurrence of the Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury in each instance, and with retrospective effect to meet the case of persons who may have been already so employed:

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
