The following Address was presented to His Majesty at Frogmore, on Friday, the 17th instant:—

To His Most Excellent Majesty King George V.

May it please Your Majesty,

We, the Mayor, Aldermen and Councillors of the Ancient and Royal Borough of New Windsor, on behalf of the inhabitants, humbly beg to offer to Your Majesty our profound sympathy, and to give expression to the deep grief which we feel at the loss which the nation has sustained by the death of our late beloved Sovereign King Edward VII.

His reign has been characterized by His desire to maintain the peace of the world, His kind thoughtfulness and care for the sick and the afflicted, and His never ceasing good works for the general welfare of His people.

We mourn the loss, but with every confidence we feel that with Your Majesty's great experience of the vast Dominions over which You rule, the future commercial and political relationship with Foreign Powers and the prosperity of Great Britain and her Colonies will be well maintained.

We desire to humbly offer our loyal congratulations to Your Majesty upon Your accession to the Throne of our glorious Empire.

We especially esteem the privilege which Your Majesty has graciously extended to the Burgesses of Windsor by personally accepting our dutiful Address, and we humbly pray that Your Majesty and Your Gracious Queen may long be spared by Almighty God to fill the exalted position to which You have been called.

To which Address His Majesty was please I to return the following gracious Answer:—

"It gives Me great pleasure to receive your loyal and dutiful Address, and I am particularly glad to have this opportunity of testifying My esteem for the Burgesses of Windsor. We have been neighbours already for many years, and we shall now be drawn together in that still closer association which has for centuries united your Ancient and Royal Borough to the Sovereigns of this realm.

"I thank you for your generous expression of sympathy in My great loss, and for your appreciation of the many good works which marked My beloved Father's Reign.

"I value the assurance of your confidence that I shall maintain Ilis endeavours to secure prosperity at home and peace abroad, and I am deeply sensible of the sincerity of your good wishes for the Queen and Myself."

"thenceforward such last mentioned benefice or: "benefices shall be and be deemed and taken to "be a separate and distinct benefice or benefices "to all intents and purposes whatever as if "no such union had taken place, and the patron " or patrons thereof shall and may according to "the terms of such Order present or nominate "thereto respectively, and so from time to time upon each and every avoidance of the same: " Provided always, that no benefices which have "been united for more than sixty years before "the passing of this Act shall be disunited with-out the consent in writing of the patron or "patrons thereof:"

And whereas by section twenty-three of the said Act it is further enacted "That when-"ever two or more benefices which have at any "time been united into one benefice shall be "disunited and become separate benefices under "the provisions of this Act . "be lawful for His Majesty in Council, on the." recommendation of the Archbishop of the "province, with the consent of the patron or "patrons of such benefices respectively "to assign and attach such portion of the "glebe lands, tithes, moduses, rent charges or "other endowments or emoluments belonging to-"or arising or accruing within the limits of such "united benefice to each of such benefices respec-" tively as to His Majesty in Council shall seem fit, " notwithstanding such proportion of glebe lands, "tithes, rent charges, moduses or other endow-"ments or emoluments, or any part thereof, may not arise or accrue within the limits of the " benefice to which the same shall be so assigned "and attached as aforesaid, or may not have " belonged thereto, and also to divide and appor-"tion between such benefices all such charges " and outgoings as before the disunion thereof "were imposed upon the whole united benefice."

And whereas on the thirteenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and nine, the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury caused a statement of the facts respecting a proposed disunion of the benefices of Sibertswold and Coldred, both situate in the county of Kent and diocese of Canterbury, to be affixed to the principal outer doors of the churches of the said benefices, such statement being in the words and figures following: - .

"A statement in writing of the facts respecting the proposed disunion of the united benefice, consisting of the vicarage of Sibertswold and the rectory of Coldred, both in the county of Kent, within the diocese and province of Canterbury, by the separation of the rectory of Coldred from the vicarage of Sibertswold under the provisions of the Pluralities Act, 1838, -1 and 2 Victoria, chapter one hundred and six.

"Whereas, it having appeared to us, Raudall Thomas, Archbishop of the province of Canterbury, that the united benefice, consisting of the vicarage of Sibertswold and the rectory of Coldred in our diocese of Canterbury, might with advantage to the interests of religion be disunited by the separation of the rectory of Coldred from the vicarage of Sibertswold under the Plaralities Act, 1838, we have made enquiry into the circumstances of the case, and on such enquiry it having appeared to us that such union may be usefully dissolved, we do hereby in pursuance of the said Act of Parliament make the following statement of facts:-

"That the aggregate population of the parishes of Sibertswold and Coldred according to the

hundred and ten persons, the population of the parish of Sibertswold being four hundred and seventy and that of Coldred one hundred and forty.

"That there is a church belonging to each of the said benefices. The church of Sibertswold has accommodation for one hundred and ninety people and that at Coldred for eighty people.

"That there is a sufficient house of residence belonging to Sibertswold, but there is no house of residence belonging to Coldred.

"That the gross annual value, taking the tithe at par, of the united benefice, including the payment of seventy pounds by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England bereinafter referred to, is four hundred and fifty-one pounds sixteen shillings and twopence or thereabouts, and the net annual value is three hundred and forty-five pounds six shillings or thereabouts.

That the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England intend on this disunion taking effect to permanently annex to the benefice of Sibertswold the said sum of seventy pounds per annum hitherto granted by them to the united benefices of Sibertswold with Coldred.

"That the patronage of the united benefice of Sibertswold with Coldred belongs to myself by virtue of my Archbishoprick, and as such patron I consent to the disunion of the said united benefice.

"That the endowment to be appropriated to the vicarage of Sibertswold will consist of the tithe rent-charges arising in that parish of the commuted value of one hundred and thirty-six pounds nine shillings and eightpence-halfpenny, of an annual payment of six pounds thirteen shillings and seven ence tithe in lieu of hops, the rent of the glebe farm and of the land received on exchange with the Earl of Guildford's trustees, now forty-one pounds per annum, and the permanent endowment by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England of the said sum of séventy pounds per annum.

"That the endowment of the rectory of Coldred shall be the tithe rent charge arising in that parish of the commuted value of one hundred and ninety-seven pounds twelve shillings and elevenpence; net, one hundred and thirty-six pounds eighteen shillings and fivepence-halfpenny.

"That, with the exception of the annual payment due to the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty in respect of the mortgage made to them by an instrument bearing date the fifth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventyseven, which annual payment shall be borne and paid by the benefice of Sibertswold, the said vicarage of Sibertswold and rectory of Coldred shall respectively bear, pay, and discharge all the outgoings which are charged upon the income which they shall respectively hold and enjoy.

"The chief reason for the disunion is that it will be to the advantage of the interests of religion to proceed to attach the said benefice or rectory of Coldred (when disunited as aforesaid) to the adjoining benefice of Waldershare.

"That there is a sufficient house of residence belonging to Sibertswold but there is no house of residence belonging to Coldred.

"That the gross annual value taking the tithe at par of the said united benefice including the payment of seventy pounds by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England hereinafter referred to is four hundred and fifty-one pounds sixteen shillings and two pence or thereabouts and the net annual value is three hundred and forty-five pounds six shillings or thereabouts.

"That the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners intend on this disunion taking effect to permanently annex to the benefice of Sibertswold bishop, as patron of the said united benefice, and I the said sum of seventy pounds per annum

hitherto granted by them to the united benefices of Sibertswold with Coldred.

- "That the patronage of the said united benefice belongs to us by virtue of our Archbishopric and as such patron we consent to the disunion of the said united benefice.
- "That six weeks and upwards before certifying such enquiry and consent to Your Majesty in Council, we caused a statement in writing of the facts to be affixed to the principal outer door of each of the parish churches of Sibertswold and Coldred with notice to any person or persons interested that he, she, or they might within such six weeks show cause in writing under his, her, or their hand or hands to us the said Archbishop against such disunion and no such cause has been shown.
- "The copies of the statement of facts and notice before mentioned together with our consent in writing as patron of the said united benefice are hereunto annexed.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the ninth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and ten, in the words following, viz.:—

- "Whereas by section three of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted inter alia that all pay, pensions and other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, seaman, or marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:
- "And whereas we consider it desirable that Naval Officers who may be placed on the Retired List whilst holding the appointment of Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent of the Torpedo Factory which is now situated at Woolwich, and is shortly to be established at Greenock, should be granted the benefit of the provisions of His late Majesty's Order in Council dated the twelfth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and seven, relative to increase of Retired Pay to Naval Officers serving on the Staff of the Inspection and Experimental Departments or in posts at the Admiralty connected with those Departments:
- "We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction as from the first day of June, one thousand nine hundred and ten, the following regulations for increases of Retired Pay of Officers of Your Majesty's Navy

who are placed on the Retired List whilst serving as Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent of the Torpedo Factory:

- (1) If an Officer is discharged to retired pay at his own request or on completion of any period for which he may have been appointed, or as unfit for further employment from other cause than age, medical unfitness or misconduct, his retired pay should be increased by one-sixtieth of the pay and allowances of the appointment for each complete year of service subsequent to retirement from the Active List of Your Majesty's Navy.
- (2) If discharged to retired pay on account of age, medical unfitness, abolition of office, or reduction or reorganization of establishment:—
 - (a) With ten or more years' service after date of retirement from Your Majesty's Navy, his retired pay should be increased by one-sixtieth of the pay and allowances of the appointment for each complete year of such service:
 - (b) With less than ten years' service after such date, the increase should be at the rate of one-fiftieth of the pay and allowances of the appointment, provided that the total addition shall not exceed ten-sixtieths of such pay and allowances.

The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

His Majesty having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed; and the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in such Order, and so from time to time as circumstances may require; Provided always that notice of such representation, and of the time when it shall please His Majesty to order the same to be taken into consideration by the Privy Council, shall be published in the London Gazette, and shall be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representation, one month before such representation is so considered; Provided also that no such representation shall be made in relation to the burial-ground of any parish until ten days' previous notice of the intention to make such representation shall have been given to the Incumbent and the vestry clerk or churchwardens of such parish:

And whereas the Local Government Board, after giving to the Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the parish of Narborough, in the county of Leicester, ten days' previous notice of their intention in that behalf have made a representation to His Majesty in Council that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial-ground in the civil parish of Narborough aforesaid, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, and that burials should be discontinued in the said parish as hereinafter directed:

And whereas, by an Order in Council dated the twenty-second day of April last, notice of such representation was given, and it was ordered that the same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council, on the first day of June, one thousand nine hundred and ten, and that the said Order in Council should be forthwith published in the London Gazette, and that copies thereof should be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some other conspicuous places within the parish affected by such representation one month before the said first day of June, one thousand nine hundred and ten:

And whereas the said Order in Council of the twenty-second day of April, one thousand nine hundred and ten, has been duly published in the London Gazette and copies thereof have been affixed in the manner directed by the said Order:

Now therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the opening of any new burial-ground in the said civil parish of Narborough, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, be and the same is hereby prohibited, and that burials in the said parish be discontinued as follows, viz.:

- NARBOROUGH.—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of All Saints, Narborough, and the churchyard attached thereto, and in the Narborough Congregational Chapel and the graveyard attached thereto, with the following exceptions, that is to say:—
 - (a) In any vault or walled grave now existing in the said churchyard or the said graveyard burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented;
 - (b) In any earthen grave now existing in the said churchyard or the said graveyard, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave;

subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall in any case be at a depth less than three feet from the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.
