

hitherto granted by them to the united benefices of Sibertswold with Coldred.

"That the patronage of the said united benefice belongs to us by virtue of our Archbishopric and as such patron we consent to the disunion of the said united benefice.

"That six weeks and upwards before certifying such enquiry and consent to Your Majesty in Council, we caused a statement in writing of the facts to be affixed to the principal outer door of each of the parish churches of Sibertswold and Coldred with notice to any person or persons interested that he, she, or they might within such six weeks show cause in writing under his, her, or their hand or hands to us the said Archbishop against such disunion and no such cause has been shown.

"The copies of the statement of facts and notice before mentioned together with our consent in writing as patron of the said united benefice are hereunto annexed.

"And we do hereby certify the enquiry, consent and matters aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do, make and issue an Order for the disunion of the said united benefice by the separation of the rectory of Coldred from the vicarage of Sibertswold, and we recommend that after the said disunion shall have been carried into effect that (with the exception of the annual payment due to the governors of Queen Anne's Bounty in respect of the mortgage made to them by an instrument bearing date the fifth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, which annual payment shall be borne and paid by the benefice of Sibertswold) the said vicarage of Sibertswold and rectory of Coldred shall respectively bear, pay, and discharge all the outgoings which are charged upon the income which they shall respectively hold and enjoy and that the endowment to be appropriated to the vicarage of Sibertswold shall consist of the tithe rent-charges arising in that parish of the commuted value of one hundred and thirty-six pounds nine shillings and eightpence-halfpenny, of an annual payment of six pounds thirteen shillings and sevenpence tithe in lieu of hops, the rent of the glebe farm and of the land received in exchange with the Earl of Guildford's trustees now forty-one pounds per annum and the aforementioned permanent endowment by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England of seventy pounds per annum and that the endowment to be appropriated to the rectory of Coldred shall consist of the tithe rent-charge arising in that parish of the commuted value of one hundred and ninety-seven pounds twelve shillings and eleven pence.

"As witness our hand this fourth day of February, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and ten.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the said united benefice consisting of the vicarage of Sibertswold and the rectory of Coldred, situate in the county of Kent and diocese of Canterbury, shall be disunited by separating the said rectory of Coldred from the said vicarage of Sibertswold.

And His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is further pleased, on the recommendation of the said Archbishop, to order, as it is hereby ordered, that (with the

exception of the annual payment due to the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty in respect of the mortgage made to them by an instrument bearing date the fifth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, which annual payment shall be borne and paid by the benefice of Sibertswold) the said vicarage of Sibertswold and the said rectory of Coldred shall respectively bear, pay and discharge all the outgoings which are charged upon the income which they shall respectively hold and enjoy; and that the endowment hereby assigned and attached to the said vicarage of Sibertswold shall consist of the tithe rent-charges arising in that parish of the commuted value of one hundred and thirty-six pounds nine shillings and eightpence-halfpenny, of an annual payment of six pounds thirteen shillings and sevenpence tithe in lieu of hops, the rent of the glebe farm and of the land received in exchange with the Earl of Guildford's trustees, now forty-one pounds per annum, and the aforementioned permanent endowment by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England of seventy pounds per annum, and that the endowment hereby assigned and attached to the said rectory of Coldred shall consist of the tithe rent-charge arising in that parish of the commuted value of one hundred and ninety-seven pounds twelve shillings and elevenpence.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the ninth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and ten, in the words following, viz. :—

"Whereas by section three of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted *inter alia* that all pay, pensions and other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, seaman, or marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council :

"And whereas we consider it desirable that Naval Officers who may be placed on the Retired List whilst holding the appointment of Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent of the Torpedo Factory which is now situated at Woolwich, and is shortly to be established at Greenock, should be granted the benefit of the provisions of His late Majesty's Order in Council dated the twelfth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and seven, relative to increase of Retired Pay to Naval Officers serving on the Staff of the Inspection and Experimental Departments or in posts at the Admiralty connected with those Departments :

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction as from the first day of June, one thousand nine hundred and ten, the following regulations for increases of Retired Pay of Officers of Your Majesty's Navy
