the pen, correct and amend all such prayers in
their Church Books, according to the foregoing
direction: And for the better notice hereof, that
this Order be forthwith printed and published,
and sent to the several parishes; and that the
Right Reverend the Bishops do take care that

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by section twenty-one of the Pluralities Act, 1838, after reciting that, "Whereas from the increase of population, "or from other circumstances, it may be expe-"dient that two or more benefices which have "been heretofore united or which may be here-"after united under the provisions of this Act "should be disunited," it is amongst other things enacted, "that when two or more benefices shall " have been united, or may be hereafter united "into one benefice, and with respect to his own "diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop of the "Province, or the Bishop of any diocese shall "represent to the said Archbishop of the Pro-"vince, that one or more of the benefices within "his diocese, of which such united benefice shall "consist, may be separated therefrom with " advantage to the interests of religion, the said "Archbishop shall inquire into the circumstances "of the case, and if on such inquiry it shall "appear to him that such union may be usefully "dissolved, so far as respects such benefice or he shall, six weeks at " benefices, "before certifying such inquiry to His Majesty "as hereinafter directed, cause, with respect to "his own diocese, a statement in writing of the "facts, and in all other cases a copy in writing "of the aforesaid representation to be affixed on "or near the principal outer door of the church or in some public and conspicuous place in each "of the benefices forming part of the united "benefice, with notice to any person or persons interested that he, she, or they may within such six weeks show cause in writing under his, "her, or their hands to the said Archbishop "against any such disunion; and if no sufficient -"cause be shown within such time, the Arch"bishop shall certify the inquiry and consent, "when the patron's consent is necessary, to His "Majesty in Council, and thereupon it shall be "lawful for His Majesty to issue an Order for "separating such last-mentioned benefice or benefices from such united benefice, and for "declaring the rights of patronage of the several "patrons, if there be more than one patron, and "such Order shall be registered in the registry "of the diocese to which such united benefice "shall belong, which Order the Registrar of such "diocese, immediately on the receipt thereof, is "hereby required to register accordingly, and "thereupon immediately if such united benefice "shall be then vacant, otherwise on the first avoidance thereof, such union shall be ipso facto "dissolved, so far only as regards such benefice " or benefices so proposed to be separated from "such united benefice, but in all other respects " shall remain in full force and effect, and thence-"forward such last-mentioned benefice or bene-"fices shall be and be deemed and taken to be a "separate and distinct benefice or benefices to "all intents and purposes whatever as if no such "union had taken place, and the patron or patrons thereof shall and may according to the "terms of such Order present or nominate thereto "respectively, and so from time to time upon "each and every avoidance of the same: Pro"vided always, that no benefices which have
been united for more than sixty years before "the passing of this Act shall be disunited with-"out the consent in writing of the patron or " patrons thereof."

And whereas by section twenty-three of the said Act it is further enacted "that when-

whereas on the thirteenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and nine, the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, caused a statement of facts respecting a proposed disunion of the benefices of Waldershare and Beauxfield (otherwise Whitfield) with the Beauxfield (otherwise Whitfield) with the vicarage of West Langdon, all situate in the county of Kent and diocese of Canterbury, to be affixed to the principal outer doors of the churches of the said benefices, such statement being in the words and figures following:—

"A statement in writing of the facts respecting the proposed disunion of the united benefice consisting of the rectory of Waldershare and the vicarage of Beauxfield, otherwise Whitfield, with the vicarage of West Langdon, all in the county of Kent, within the diocese and province of Canterbury, by the separation of the vicarage of Beauxfield, otherwise Whitfield, with the vicarage of West Langdon from the rectory of otherwise Waldershare under the provisions of the Pluralities Act, 1838 (1 and 2 Victoria, chapter one hundred and six.)

"Whereas it having appeared to us, Randall Thomas, Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury, that the united benefice consisting of the rectory of Waldershare and the vicarage of Beauxfield, otherwise Whitfield, with the vicarage of West Langdon in our diocese of Canterbury, might with advantage to interests of religion be disunited by the separation of the vicarage of Beauxfield, otherwise Whitfield, with the vicarage of West Langdon from the rectory of Waldershare under the Pluralities Act, 1838, we have made enquiries into the circumstances of the case, and on such enquiry it having appeared to us that such union might be usefully dissolved, we do hereby in pursuance of the said Act of Parliament make the following statement of facts:-

"That the aggregate population of the parishes of Waldershare. Beauxfield, otherwise Whitfield, and West Langdon according to the latest returns of population does not exceed six hundred and thirty persons, the population of the parish of Waldershare being two hundred and fortythree, that of Beauxfield, otherwise Whitfield, two hundred and ninety-one, and that of West Langdon ninety-six.

"That there is a church belonging to each of the said benefices. The church at Waldershare has accommodation for two hundred and fifty "ever two or more benefices which have at any | people, that at Beauxfield, otherwise Whitfield,

for one hundred and fifty, and that at West |

Langdon for seventy.

"That there is a sufficient house of residence at Waldershare, but there is no house of residence belonging to either Beauxfield, otherwise Whit-field, or West Langdon.

"That the gross annual value of the united benefice, including the payment of one hundred and twenty pounds by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England for the maintenance of a curate hereinafter referred to is four hundred and thirty-five pounds fifteen shillings and sixpence or thereabouts, and the net annual value is three hundred and seventy-one pounds seven shillings and twopence or thereabouts.

"That the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England intend on this disunion taking effect to permanently annex to the said benefice of Beauxfield, otherwise Whitfield, with West Langdon the said sum of one hundred and twenty pounds per annum hitherto granted by them to the united benefice of Waldershare and Beauxfield, otherwise

Whitfield, with West Langdon.

"That the patronage of the united benefice of Waldershare and Beauxfield, otherwise Whitfield, with West Langdon belongs to myself by virtue of my archbishopric as respects every four turns out of five turns when the benefice shall become vacant and to the Dean and Chapter of Canterbury as respects every fifth turn and as such patrons we and they both consent to the disunion of the said united benefice.

"That on this disunion taking effect the patronage of Waldershare shall belong to and be exercised by the Archbishop of Canterbury for the time being, and the patronage of Beaux-field, otherwise Whitfield, with West Langdon shall belong to and be exercised by the Archbishop of Canterbury for the time being and by the Dean and Chapter of Canterbury alternately, the first turn of presentation being made by the Archbishop of Canterbury for the time being.

"That the endowment to be appropriated to the rectory of Waldershare will consist of the tithe rent charges arising in that parish of the commuted value of one hundred and fifty-five pounds twelve shillings and twopence, of an annual sum of two pounds eight shillings and ten-pence from the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne, and of the rent of glebe belonging to the benefice situate in the parish of Elham,

now fifteen pounds per annum.

"That the endowment to be appropriated to the united benefice of Beauxfield, otherwise Whitfield, with West Langdon will consist of the rent of glebe situate in the parish of Nonington now ten pounds per annum, tithe rent charges arising in the parish of Beauxfield, otherwise Whitfield, of the commuted value of seventy pounds ten shillings and sixpence, the rent of glebe, fifteen pounds eight shillings, situate in the parishes of West Langdon and Little Mongeham, tithe rent charges arising in the parish of West Langdon of the commuted value of forty-six pounds sixteen shillings, and the permanent endowment of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England of the said sum of one hundred and twenty pounds per annum.

"That the said rectory of Waldershare and the said benefice of Beauxfield, otherwise Whitfield with West Langdon, shall respectively bear pay and discharge all the outgoings which are charged upon the income which they shall

respectively hold and enjoy.
"The chief reason for the disunion is that it will be to the advantage of the interests of religion when the said united benefice of Waldershare and Beauxfield, otherwise Whitfield, with West Langdon, shall have been disunited by the separation of the vicarage of Beauxfield, otherwise Whitfield, with the vicarage of West Langdon from the rectory of Waldershare, to proceed to attach the contiguous rectory of Coldred to the said rectory of Waldershare.

"Dated this twenty-ninth day of November, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and nine.

And whereas the consents of the said Archbishop and of the Dean and Chapter of Canterbury, as patrons of the said united benefice, are as follows:-

"We, the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, by Divine Providence Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, Primate of all England and Metropolitan, being the patron or person entitled to present to the united benefice of Waldershare and Beauxfield, otherwise Whit-field, with West Langdon, by virtue of my archbishopric as respects every four turns out of five turns when the benefice falls vacant, and we, the Very Reverend Henry Wace, D.D., Dean of the Cathedral and Metropolitical Church of Christ, Canterbury, and the Chapter of the same church, being the patrons or persons entitled to present to the said united benefice as respects every fifth turn out of five turns when the benefice falls vacant, do hereby consent to the disunion of the said united benefice by the separation of the vicarage of Beauxfield, otherwise Whitfield, with the vicarage of West Langdon, from the rectory of Waldershare, under the provisions of the Pluralities Act, 1838, and to all matters and things contained in the aforesaid statement of facts.

"We, the undersigned Randall Thomas, Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury, do hereby, in pursuance of the Pluralities Act, 1838, certify to Your Majesty in Council that it having appeared to us that the united benefice consisting of the rectory of Waldershare and the vicarage of Beauxfield, otherwise Whitfield, with the vicarage of West Langdon, in our diocese of Canterbury, might with advantage to the interests of religion be disunited by the separation of the vicarage of Beauxfield, otherwise Whitfield, with the vicarage of West Langdon, from the rectory of Waldershare, we enquired into the circumstances of the case, and on such enquiry it appeared to us, amongst other things:

"That the aggregate population of the said united benefice, according to the latest returns, does not exceed six hundred and thirty persons, the population of the parish of Waldershare being two hundred and forty-three, that of Beauxfield, otherwise Whitfield, two hundred and ninety-one, and that of West Langdon

ninety-six.

"That there is a church belonging to each of the said benefices.

"That there is a sufficient house of residence at Waldershare, but there is no house of residence belonging to either Beauxfield, otherwise Whit-

field, or West Langdon.

"That on the disunion taking effect the patronage of Waldershare shall belong to and be exercised by the Archbishop of Canterbury for the time being and the patronage of Beaux-field, otherwise Whitfield, with West Langdon shall belong to and be exercised by the Archbishop of Canterbury for the time being and by the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral and Metropolitical Church of Christ, Canterbury, alternately, the first turn of presentation being made by the Archbishop of Canterbury for the time being.

"That six weeks and upwards before certifying such enquiry and consents to Your Majesty in Council we caused a statement in writing of the facts to be affixed to the principal outer door of each of the parish churches of Waldershare, Beauxfield, otherwise Whitfield, and West Langdon with notice to any person or persons interested that he, she, or they, might within such six weeks show cause in writing under his, her, or their hand or hands to us the said Archbishop against such disunion and no such cause

has been shown.

"The copies of the statement of facts, and notice before referred to together with the consents in writing of the patrons are hereunto annexed.

"And we do hereby certify the enquiry, consents and matters aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do, make and issue an Order for the disunion of the said united benefice by the separation of the vicarage of Beauxfield, otherwise Whitfield, with the vicarage of West Langdon annexed from the rectory of Walder-share, and we recommend that after the said disunion shall have been carried into effect that the benefice of Waldershare and the benefice of Beauxfield, otherwise Whitfield, with Langdon, shall respectively bear, pay, and discharge all the outgoings which are charged upon the income which they shall respectively hold and enjoy, and that the endowment to be appropriated to the rectory of Waldershare shall consist of the tithe rent-charge arising in that parish of the commuted value of one hundred and fifty-five pounds twelve shillings and two-pence, of an annual sum of two pounds eight shillings and tenpence from the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne, and the rent of glebe belonging to the benefice situate in the

parish of Elham, now fifteen pounds per annum, and that the endowment to be appropriated to the united benefice of Beauxfield, otherwise Whitfield with West Langdon, shall consist of the rent of glebe situate in the parish of Nonington, now ten pounds per annum, tithe rent-charges arising in the parish of Beauxfield, otherwise Whitfield, of the commuted value of seventy pounds ten shillings and sixpence, the rent of glebe fifteen pounds eight shillings situate in the parishes of West Langdon and Little Mongeham, tithe rent-charges arising in the parish of West Langdon of the commuted value of forty-six pounds sixteen shillings, and the before-mentioned permanent endowment by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England of one hundred and twenty pounds per annum, and we also hereby declare that after the said disunion shall have been carried into effect the course and succession in which the respective patrons for the time being shall collate, present, or nominate to the benefice of Waldershare, and to the benefice of Beauxfield, otherwise Whit-field with West Langdon, from time to time as the same shall respectively become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the patronage of the said benefice of Waldershare shall belong to and be exercised by the Archbishop of Canterbury for the time being, and the patronage of Beauxfield, otherwise Whitfield with West with Beauxfield, otherwise Whitfield with West Langdon, shall belong to and be exercised by the Archbishop of Canterbury for the time being and by the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral and Metropolitical Church of Christ, Canterbury, alternately, the first turn of presentation being made by the Archbishop of Canterbury for the time being.

"As witness our hands this fourth day of February, in the year of our Lord one thousand

nine hundred and ten.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the said united benefice consisting of the rectory of Waldershare and the vicarage of Beauxfield (otherwise Whitfield) with the vicarage of West Langdon annexed, all situate in the county of Kent and diocese of Canterbury, shall be disunited by separating the said vicarage of Beauxfield (otherwise Whitfield) with the vicarage of West Langdon annexed from the said rectory of Waldershare.

And His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is further pleased, on the recommendation of the said Archbishop, to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the said rectory of Waldershare and the said vicarage of Beauxfield (otherwise Whitfield) with the vicarage of West Langdon annexed shall respectively bear, pay, and discharge all the outgoings which are charged upon the income which they shall respectively hold and enjoy, and that the endowment hereby assigned and attached to the said rectory of Waldershare shall consist of the tithe rent-charge arising in that parish of the com-muted value of one hundred and fifty-five pounds twelve shillings and twopence, of an annual sum of two pounds eight shillings and tenpence from the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne and the rent of glebe belonging to the said rectory situate in the parish of Elham, now fifteen pounds per annum, and that the endowment hereby assigned and attached to the said vicarage of Beauxfield (otherwise Whitfield) with the vicarage of West Langdon annexed shall consist of the rent of glebe situate in the parish of Nonington, now ten pounds per annum,

The KING was pleased, on Tuesday, the 21st instant, at St. James's Palace, to present the following Decorations which have been conferred for gallantry in saving life on land.

## THE ALBERT MEDAL. (2nd Class.) HENRY SMITH.

On the occasion of the earthquake at Messina on the 28th December, 1908, the steamship Afonwen, of Cardiff, was lying at her moorings, having arrived at Messina on the 24th December.

The first intimation the Master of the ship (Captain William Owen) had of the disaster was on being awakened in the early morning of the 28th December by the noise of the upheaval and the commotion caused by the tidal wave, but owing to the darkness and the dense clouds of dust the full extent of the disaster could not be realised for some time. The danger to shipping claimed the first attention of the Captain, but having satisfied himself as to the safety of his vessel he proceeded ashore with his crew, as the dawn broke, to render assistance.

The particular act of gallantry in respect of which the Albert Medal has been awarded was performed when a building of five storeys was reached, where children were noticed at a great height from the ground crying for help. The interior of the building had for the most part collapsed, and one of the walls had disappeared; the structure was therefore in a very dangerous condition.

The Captain having given the word, Henry Smith, Able Seaman, and, shortly after, James Vivian Reed, Second Mate, swarmed up a rope to the rescue of the children, who had lowered string by means of which the rope was hauled up and made fast. The rescue of the children having been effected, three persons were lowered down from a story above.

Henry Smith was away at sea in pursuit of his calling, and was therefore unable to attend at Buckingham Palace on the 22nd July, 1909, when the like decoration conferred upon James Vivian Reed was presented.

## THE ALBERT MEDAL. (2nd Class.)

Mrs. Caroline Hughes.

On the 14th October, 1905, a fire occurred on the premises, 129, Clarendon-road, Hove, where two children named Austen, aged 11 and 4 years respectively, had been left at home by their

mother who was out working. Mrs. Hughes, whose house was in the same street, and who was informed of the outbreak by her daughter, ran to the house and on entering found a paraffin lamp in flames on the table, and the two children crouching in the far corner, too frightened to move. She led them out one at a time, and in shielding them from the flames her dress caught fire.

Mrs Hughes afterwards carried out the blazing lamp, and while doing so sustained serious injuries to her face, chest and arms, which eventually led to the amputation of her left arm two years later.
