WILD BIRD (ENGLAND)

The Wild Birds Protection (County Borough of Halifax) Order, 1910.

Dated 29th June, 1910.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of the County Borongh of Halifax, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County Borough of Halifax) Order, 1910."

BIRDS.

Close Time Extended.

II. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Act of 1880 shall be extended throughout the County Borough of Halifax, so far as concerns all Wild Birds except Woodcock, so as to be between the last day of February and the 12th day of August in any year.

The close time for Woodcock is hereby extended so as to be between the 1st day of February and the 12th day of August in any

year.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the County Borough of Halifax to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:—

Bullfinch, Blackheaded Bunting, Cirl Bunting, Corn Bunting, Reed Bunting, Snow Bunting, Yellow Bunting (Yellow Hammer), Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Rough - legged Buzzard, Chaffinch, Chiffchaff, Corn Crake (Landrail), Spotted Crake, Tree Creeper, Crossbill, Dipper or Water Ouzel, Turtle Dove, Pintail Duck, Scoter Duck, Tufted Duck, Golden Eagle, Sea Eagle, Peregrine Falcon, Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Gadwall, Goosander, Little Grebe (Dabchick), Hedge Sparrow, Hen Harrier, Marsh Harrier, Montagu's Harrier, Common Heron, Hobby, Kestrel, Kite, Linnet, House Martin, Sand Martin, Merlin, Nuthatch, Osprey, Ring Ouzel, Alpine Pipit (Water Pipit), Meadow Pipit, Richard's Pipit, Rock Pipit, Tree Pipit, Water Rail, Raven, Lesser Redpole, Mealy Redpole, Redstart, Robin, Pallas' Sand-grouse, Great Grey Shrike, Lesser Grey Shrike, Redbacked Shrike, Woodchat Shrike, Siskin, Tree

Sparrow, Stonechat, Swallow, Swift, Song Thrush, Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Blue Tit, Coal Tit, Crested Tit, Great Tit, Long-tailed Tit, Marsh Tit, Twite, Grey Wagtail, Pied Wagtail, White Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail, Aquatic Warbler, Blackcap Warbler, Dartford Warbler, Garden Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Marsh Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler, Wheatear, Whinchat, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Common Wren, Fire-crested Wren, Golden-crested Wren, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snakebird).

The House Sparrow deprived of protection.

IV. The County Borough of Halifax is hereby exempted from the operation of the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, so far as the House Sparrow is concerned.

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

V. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880 (as extended by Clause II of this Order), does not apply, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County Borough of Halifax:—

Bee-eater, Bittern, Little Bittern, Bullfinch, Blackheaded Bunting, Cirl Bunting, Corn Bunting, Reed Bunting, Snow Bunting, Yellow Bunting (Yellow Hammer), Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Rough-legged Buzzard, Chaffinch, Chiffchaff, Corn Crake (Laudrail), Spotted Crake, Crossbill, Cuckoo, Stone Curlew (Thick-knee), Dipper or Water Ouzel, Black-throated Diver, Dotterel, Turtle Dove, Dunlin (Purre, Ox Bird), Golden Eagle, Sea Eagle, Peregrine Falcon, Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Goldfinch, Great Crested Grebe, Little Grebe (Dabchick), Black-headed Gull, Common Heron, Hedge Sparrow, Hen Harrier, Marsh Harrier, Montagu's Harrier, Hobby, Hoopoe, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Kite, Kitti-wake, Lark (Skylark, Woodlark), Linnet, House Martin, Sand Martin, Merlin, Nightingale, Nightjar (Goat Sucker, Night Hawk or Fern Owl), Nuthatch, Oriole, Osprey, Ring Ouzel, Long-eared Owl. Short-eared Owl, Tawny or Brown Owl, White or Barn Owl, Alpine Pipit (Water Pipit), Meadow Pipit, Richard's Pipit, Rock Pipit, Tree Pipit, Water Rail, Raven, Lesser Redpole, Mealy Redpole, Redshank, Redstart, Robin, Roller, Ruff or Reeve, Sanderling, Pallas' Sand-grouse, Common Sandpiper (Summer Snipe), Green Sandpiper, Great Grey Shrike, Lesser Grey Shrike, Red-backed Shrike, Wood-chat Shrike, Siskin, Tree Sparrow, Stint, Stonechat, Swallow, Swift, Arctic Tern, Black Tern, Common Tern, Lesser Tern, Roseate Tern, Sandwich Tern, Song Thrush, Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Blue Tit, Coal Tit, Crested Tit, Great Tit, Long-tailed Tit, Marsh Tit, Treecreeper, Twite, Grey Wagtail, Pied Wagtail, White Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail, Aquatic Warbler, Blackcap Warbler, Dartford Warbler. Garden Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Marsh Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler, Wheatear, Whinchat, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker, Common Wren, Firecrested Wren, Golden-crested Wren, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snakebird).

Sunday Protection.

Redpole, Redstart, Robin, Pallas' Sand-grouse, VI. During that period of the year to which Great Grey Shrike, Lesser Grey Shrike, Redbacked Shrike, Woodchat Shrike, Siskin, Tree Protection Act 1880 (as extended by Glause II

of this Order), does not apply, the killing or taking of Wild Birds on Sundays is prohibited throughout the County Borough of Halifax.

Eggs.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the Borough.

VII. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds, also the eggs of the Birds named in the Schedule to the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as amended by the Act of 1881 (except the Lapwing, Peewit or Green Plover), and of those added to the Schedule by Clause III of this Order, is prohibited throughout the County Borough of Halifax.

Blackcap, Black-headed Bunting, Cirl Bunting, Corn Bunting, Reed Bunting, Common Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Chiffchaff, Dipper, Falcon, Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Heron, Hobby, Kestrel, Landrail or Corn Crake, Linnet, House Martin, Sand Martin, Merlin, Nuthatch, Peregrine Falcon, Meadow Pipit, Rock Pipit, Tree Pipit, Raven, Lesser Redpole, Redstart, Ring Ouzel, Shrike (Butcher Bird), Stonechat, Swallow, Swift, Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Coal Tit, Long-tailed Tit. Marsh Tit, Treecreeper, Turtle Dove, Grey Wagtail, White Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail, Dartford Warbler, Garden Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler, Water Rail, Wheatear, Whinchat, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Common Wren, Fire-crested Wren, Golden-crested Wren, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snakebird).

The taking or destroying of the eggs of the Lapwing, Peewit, or Green Plover is prohibited

after April 14th in each year.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated June 24th, from His

Majesty's Representative at Constantinople, intimating that owing to the increase of cholera in Southern Russia it was decided at a meeting of the Constantinople Sanitary Board, held on June 21st, to impose the following measures:

1. Ships with passengers coming from the littoral situated between Akerman and Anapa to undergo five days' quarantine, the duration of the voyage included, and regular disinfection. If the duration of the voyage exceeds four days, these ships with passengers will undergo twentyfour hours' observation and regular disinfection.

Ships without passengers coming from these ports will undergo twenty-four hours' observa-

tion and disinfection only.

2. Ships with or without passengers arriving from the littoral situated between Anapa excluded and Batoum included will be submitted to a medical visit on their arrival at first Ottoman port of call.

ORDER of the Local Government Board: General Order: Altering Dates for closing Union Accounts and for other Purposes.

POOR LAW UNIONS.

To the Boards of Guardians of the several Poor Law Unions in England and Wales:-And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by certain General and other Orders (hereinafter referred to as "the Orders,") the Poor Law Commissioners, the Poor Law Board, and We, the Local Government Board, have made rules and regulations which relate to matters concerning the several Poor Law Unions in England and Wales, and including the keeping, closing and audit of the accounts of the Boards of Guardians and of the officers of Boards of Guardians of the said Poor Law Unions, the Financial Statements to be prepared and submitted to the District Auditors by the said Boards of Guardians, the periodical payment of the salaries and other remuneration of the said officers and the half-yearly estimate of expenditure and orders for contribution.

And whereas the Orders provide for contracts which contain covenants, agreements or conditions with regard to certain things to be done periodically:

And whereas it is expedient that further provision be made as hereinafter set forth:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, do hereby make

the following Regulations, that is to say,—
ARTICLE I.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and ten, and shall thereafter apply and have effect subject to any departure to which we may assent.

ARTICLE II.—For the purposes of these Regulations and of the Orders so far as they relate to the Accounts of the Guardians, or of any Officer of the Guardians of a Poor Law Union, to the Audit of those Accounts, or to the Financial Statement to be prepared and submitted to the District Auditor by the Guardians, the following expressions shall have the meanings hereinalter respectively assigned to them; that is to say,

The expression "year" means the twelve calendar months ending on the thirty-first day of March; and the expression "yearly" shall

be construed accordingly.

The expression "half-year" means, as the case requires, the six calendar months ending on the thirtieth day of September or on the thirty-first day of March; and the expression "half-yearly" shall be construed accordingly.

The expression "quarter" means, as the case requires, the three calendar months ending on the thirtieth day of June, or on the thirtieth day of September, or on the thirty-first day of December, or on the thirty-first day of March; and the expression "quarterly" shall be construed accordingly.

The expression "week" means every period of seven days beginning on that day which the Guardians appoint as the first day of the week for the purposes aforesaid; and the expression "weekly" shall be construed accordingly.

ARTICLE III.—The accounts of the Guardians and of the officers of the Guardians of every Poor Law Union shall be made up and closed, and the Financial Statement shall be prepared by the Guardians, to the thirtieth day of September

and the thirty-first day of March in each year.

ARTICLE IV.—Where in pursuance of the Orders the salary or other remuneration of an officer of the Guardians is payable quarterly, the said salary or remuneration shall be payable on the thirtieth day of June, the thirtieth day of September, the thirty-first day of December, and the thirty-first day of March in each year; and those days shall be the days according to which the Quarterly Account of any officer who, in pursuance of the Orders, is entitled to be paid any fees or emoluments shall be made out.

ARTICLE V.—The Orders, so far as they require the Clerk to the Guardians to estimate the probable amount of expenditure and the probable balances, to apportion the sums to be contributed, and to prepare orders for contributions, shall have effect as if the thirtieth day of September, and the thirty-first day of March were substituted in the Orders for the twenty-ninth day of September and the twenty-fifth day of March.

ARTICLE VI.—In every contract made in pursuance of or in conformity with the Orders on or after the day on which these Regulations come into operation, every covenant, agreement, or condition requiring anything to be done periodically shall be framed and shall apply and have effect so as to give to every expression defined by these Regulations, and used in or referred to or otherwise made applicable by the said covenant, agreement, or condition, the meaning assigned by these Regulations to the said expression.

ARTICLE VII.—In every contract made in pursuance of or in conformity with the Orders before the day on which these Regulations come into operation and subsisting on that day, every covenant, agreement, or condition requiring anything to be done periodically shall, where the parties so agree, and endorse the contract with

a memorandum of their agreement in writing | County Courts Admiralty Jurisdiction Acts, 1868 under the common seal of the Guardians and the hand or seal of every other party, apply and have effect after the date of the endorsement so as to give every expression defined by these Regulations and used in or referred to or otherwise made applicable by the said covenant, agreement, or condition the meaning assigned by these Regulations to the said expression:

Provided that where any such subsisting contract relates to Public Vaccination, the approval of the said contract by Us or by the Poor Law Board prior to the date of the endorsement hereinbefore mentioned shall continue to be of full force and effect for any purpose of the Vaccination Acts, 1867 to 1898, and the Vacci-

nation Act, 1907.

ARTICLE VIII.—(1) Any provisions of the Orders which are inconsistent with these Regulations shall cease to apply and have effect.
