

a memorandum of their agreement in writing under the common seal of the Guardians and the hand or seal of every other party, apply and have effect after the date of the endorsement so as to give every expression defined by these Regulations and used in or referred to or otherwise made applicable by the said covenant, agreement, or condition the meaning assigned by these Regulations to the said expression:

Provided that where any subsisting contract relates to Public Vaccination, the approval of the said contract by Us or by the Poor Law Board prior to the date of the endorsement hereinbefore mentioned shall continue to be of full force and effect for any purpose of the Vaccination Acts, 1867 to 1898, and the Vaccination Act, 1907.

ARTICLE VIII.—(1) Any provisions of the Orders which are inconsistent with these Regulations shall cease to apply and have effect.

(2) Where the circumstances so require, the Orders shall apply and have effect subject to these Regulations and to such modifications as are necessary to bring the provisions of the Orders into conformity with these Regulations, and as if words used in the Orders had the meanings assigned to the said words by these Regulations.

ARTICLE IX.—This Order may be cited as the Poor Law Unions (Dates for Closing Accounts, &c.) Order, 1910.
