The following Address was presented to His Majesty, at St. James's Palace, on Friday, the 8th July:—

UNIVERSITY OF GLASGOW.

To the King's Most Excellent Majesty.

May it please Your Majesty,

On behalf of all the Members of the University of Glasgow, we, the Chancellor, Rector, and Principal of the University, beg leave respectfully to tender to Your Majesty and the Members of the Royal Family our deep sympathy in this time of national sorrow.

By the decease of Your Majesty's illustrious Father the Empire has lost a magnanimous Ruler, who gave His whole-hearted devotion to the duties of His Kingly office, and spent His strength in furthering the welfare of His people. The memory of what His wisdom achieved in the cause of peace and goodwill among men will ever be gratefully cherished, not only within the British Dominions but throughout the civilised world.

Charged as we are with the interests of one of the National Universities, we are ourselves specially mindful of His late Majesty's heedful care for the promotion of higher education in this country, and we recall in particular the gracious encouragement He accorded to the University of Glasgow, when, with His Royal Consort, He laid the foundation of its present building, and was pleased to assume its academic title of Doctor.

For all He did to maintain the high traditions: of the great and glorious reign of the well-beloved Queen Victoria, and for all that in virtue of His surpassing qualities of mind and heart, He accomplished for the nation, His subjects have abundant grounds of heartfelt thankfulness.

To Your Majesty, whose recent visit to the University accompanied by the Princess who is now our gracious Queen, will ever be a memorable event in our annals, we would offer in all dutifulness our loyal homage on Your Majesty's accession to the Throne of Your Fathers. We are deeply conscious of the favour Your Majesty has already shown to the University by participating in our efforts to extend its equipment for the advancement of knowledge, and by permitting Your name and that of Her Majesty the Queen to be inscribed upon its roll of honorary graduates. It will be our constant aim to foster worthily the institution thus graced by association with Your Majesty's Royal Person and Family, and it will be our constant prayer that long life and happiness, with every Divine blessing, may be vouchsafed to Their Majesties our King and Queen.

Arrivals from Batoum without any (? cases) passengers and crews subject to medical inspection only.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated July 1st, from His Majesty's Representative at Constantinople, intimating that the following quarantine measures have been imposed on arrivals from

Black Sea ports:

(1.) Vessels without passengers coming from the littoral between Akerman and Anapa, these two ports and those of the Sea of Azov, inclusive, will be submitted to the same measures imposed on ships with passengers from the same locality, i.e., five days quarantine, the duration of voyage included and the regular disinfection. If the duration of voyage exceeds four days the said ships will be submitted to 24 hours observation with disinfection only.

These measures will be carried out at the Sinope Lazaret or at Monastir-Aghzy.

(2.) Ships coming from all Russian ports in the Black Sea and carrying emigrants or passengers of that category, will be submitted to a quarantine of five clear days, and to the usual disinfection to be carried out at the Sinope This quarantine will only commence to count after complete disembarkation at the lazaret of the passengers, crew and their belongings, and after completion of the first disinfection.

- Section thirty-five. "This section, so far as it relates to the deposit of material, shall have effect subject to the first proviso to section ninety-one of the Public Health Act, 1875.
