CONVOCATION OF CANTERBURY.

Address to His Majesty The King.

We, Your Majesty's loyal and faithful subjects, the Archbishop, Bishops and Clergy of the Province of Canterbury in Convocation assembled, approach Your Majesty with the dutiful assurance of our devotion to Your Majesty's Throne and Person.

Four months ago, on the opening of a new Convocation, it was our privilege, in accordance with well-established usage, to present to the Sovereign in person a loyal and dutiful Address, and the gracious reply which we received on that occasion from His Majesty King Edward was such as to encourage all who have at heart the right discharge of the varied and responsible duties which, as Ministers of Christ in the National Church of this country, we are called upon to fulfil.

A few weeks later the whole Church and Empire were united in a common sorrow by the death of the King who had thus spoken to us, and we desire to-day to tender to Your Majesty and to the Royal Family an expression of our dutiful and heartfelt sympathy in a bereavement so unexpected and so grave.

We recall with profound thankfulness the work which His Majesty King Edward was, in the Providence of God, enabled to accomplish for the unity, peace, and concord of the nations of the world. We are thankful for the wisdom and beneficence of His rule, for His untiring and effectual efforts on behalf of the sick and suffering, and for the support which He gave to every wise and wellconsidered plan for the public good.

considered plan for the public good. It is our earnest prayer that the blessing and consolation of God may be vouchsafed to Your Majesty and to Her Majesty The Queen, and with special earnestness do we remember before God in Her widowed life Your Majesty's Royal Mother, Queen Alexandra, who has for more than forty years evoked the affectionate loyalty of the whole Empire by Her ceaseless anxiety to relieve suffering and distress, Her gentle sympathy with every good cause, and Her care for what is pure and lovely and of good report.

With confidence and high hope we invoke the benediction of Almighty God upon Your Majesty's reign, praying earnestly that grace and guidance may be given to Your Majesty from day to day in the discharge of the high and sacred responsibilities which devolve upon the occupant of the Throne of this great Empire. We pray, too, that the home life of Your Majesty and of the gracious Queen who has shared with Your Majesty the travel by land and sea, which has made You acquainted with every part of the Empire, may be abundantly blessed of our Father from whom every family in heaven and earth is named.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious Answer :---

I thank your Grace most earnestly for the loyal and dutiful Address of Condolence from the Bishops and Clergy of the Province of Canterbury in Convocation; and on behalf of Queen Mary and Queen Alexandra for your expressions of sympathy and sorrow. The tributes of respect and honour which you pay to King Edward's memory are precious to those who have most deeply suffered by His loss.

It is My desire to follow in My Father's steps, and, so far as may be in My power, to promote the peace and unity of nations, to second all efforts for the alleviation of sickness and suffering, and to support every wise and wellconsidered scheme for the public good. I am encouraged in all this by your good wishes and your prayers for God's blessing upon My endeavour. I am fortified by the belief that the ends which we pursue are in harmony with the teachings of the Church, and that they will be achieved only while we seek in faith and humility that perfect standard of conduct and sacrifice which has been revealed to Christian men.

CONVOCATION OF YORK.

To the King's Most Excellent Majesty.

The humble Address of the Convocation of the Province of York.

May it please Your Majesty,

We, the Archbishop, Bishops and Clergy of the Convocation of the Northern Province, acting according to ancient privilege, approach Your Majesty with deep emotion, desiring to express our respectful sympathy with Your Majesty in the heavy bereavement which has befallen You in the death of Your loved and honoured Father, King Edward VII. We, loyal in heart to the Throne, share the unfeigued grief which is felt in all parts of the Empire. We recognise that what is a personal and unique sorrow to Your Majesty is to Your subjects everywhere a national and imperial loss.

We recall with gratitude the signal services which Your Majesty's revered Father, our late King, rendered to the United Kingdom and the Empire by His calm judgment, by His loyal selfrepression, and by the happy art with which He helped to build up those conditions of international comity which made for the peace of the We remember with pleasure the words world. He spoke to the members of our Convocation when He said, "It is My desire that the power of the Church to aid My people may be strengthened as the years unfold." We cherish now those words with mingled feelings as the last official utterance of His late Majesty. His unwearied labours to raise the lot and to relieve the sufferings of His people, His fortitude in sickness, and His self-forgetful devotion to kingly duty, have rendered Him, who was beloved in life, doubly dear in death.

We ask Your Majesty to convey to Your Royal Mother, the Queen Alexandra, the assurance that in Her deep sorrow She has a place not only in our sympathy but in our prayers.

We desire to tender to Your Majesty on Your accession to the Throne this declaration of our unswerving loyalty and sincere attachment. We recognize the heavy responsibilities and special difficulties which have devolved upon Your Majesty; but we rejoice to think that the high traditions of faith and duty which have been consecrated in the glorious examples of Your Royal predecessors are dear to the heart of Your Majesty and not less to the heart of the gracious Lady whom we welcome as our Queen. We know Your Majesty's wide and unrivalled acquaintance with every part of the Empire: we remember Your Majesty's familiarity with the wise and invigorating discipline prevailing in that branch of national service to which You were attached, and in which we recall with pleasure Your Majesty's unflinching devotion to duty in spite of the temptations of pleasure or the menace of danger. We call to mind the happy and sympathetic interest which Your Majesty and Your Royal Consort, Queen Mary, have shown in the welfare and joys of children, and the practical example of loving home life which Your Majesties have maintained. Encouraged by these remembrances we are persuaded that, by God's blessing, difficulties will be happily surmounted, and national welfare assured under Your Majesty's rule.

We are deeply convinced that the stability and prosperity of nations can only be secured by sedulous obedience to sound moral and religious principles, which have, as a friend and counsellor of Your Royal House declared, "an inherent power to sustain themselves and produce practical good." We recognise that as representatives and guardians of the religious life of the people we are called to teach and maintain these principles, and we desire at the commencement of Your Majesty's reign to pledge ourselves once more to set forward righteousness, peace and love among all committed to our care.

The reign of the venerated and illustrious Queen Victoria was marked by the vigorous expansion of Her dominions. Under Her rule the United Kingdom became the British Empire. The reign of Your beloved Father, King Edward VII, was marked by its peaceful consolidation. We pray that under Your Majesty's rule the old and living qualities of righteousness, faith in God, and patriotic self-sacrifice, may so prevail among us that the Empire may grow in peaceful and powerful influence to the beuefit of other nations, the welfare of the world, and the glory of Almighty God.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1909, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. Notwithstanding the provisions of Article 14 of the Sheep-Dipping (England) Order of 1908, undipped sheep intended for immediate slaughter may enter or be exposed for sale in either of the markets mentioned in the Schedule hereto on any of the dates specified therein, under and in accordance with the provisions of this Order.

2.--(1.) Sheep exposed for sale at either of the markets on any of the specified dates shall not be moved from the market unless they are accompanied by a licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the: liceal Authority of the District in which the market is situate, and the movement authorised shall be either to a slaughter house or place of detention specified in the licence. The licence shall be available for six days, inclusive of the day of issue, and no longer.

(2.) The sheep shall be moved to the slaughterhouse or place of detention specified in the licence by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay, and during the movement they shall, so far as practicable, be kept separate from all sheep not being moved with a licence under this Order.

(3.) Sheep moved to a place of detention shall not be moved therefrom unless they shall have been thoroughly dipped in an efficient sheep-dip; in the presence and to the satisfaction of an Inspector of the Local Authority. Provided that such sheep may be moved from such place of detention without being previously dipped, if accompanied by a licence authorising such move-ment granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District, to a market mentioned • • •

(4.) Sheep while detained under this Article shall be kept separate from other sheep.

(5.) After completion of the movement the licence shall forthwith be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police station in the same District by the person in charge of the sheep at the time of completing such movement.

(6.) Sheep moved with a licence under this Order to a slaughter-house shall be there detained until they are slaughtered.

(7.) The licence may be in the Form I set forth in the Second Schedule to the Sheep-Dipping (England) Order of 1908, or to the like effect, and if it authorises movement to premises situate in the District of another Local Authority a copy of it shall be sent by the Inspector granting it to the Local Authority of the District in which the premises are situate.

(8.) This Article does not restrict the removal of any carcase of a sheep.

3.--(1.) If a sheep is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the sheep, and the person in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the sheep, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the sheep is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2.) If any person fails to deliver up or send a licence as required by this Order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.


