The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, the following translations of two Circulars, issued by the Imperial and Royal Marine Board at Trieste, respecting arrivals from the Consular District of Port of Spain and South Russia.

(1) It is officially ascertained that bubonic plague has broken out at the Consular District of Port of Spain. Arrivals from the said port will be treated according to the prescriptions contained in Government Circular of August the 12th, 1904, No. 12468.

(2) Cholera having broken out in South Russia, arrivals from the Russian Ports (Black Sea) will be treated according to the prescriptions contained in Government Circular of August the 12th, 1904, No. 12468.
