HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, chapter seventy-seven, and of the Act of the fifth year of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria (session two) chapter twenty-six, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the ninth day of June, in the year one thousand nine hundred and ten, in the words following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, chapter seventy-seven, and of the Act of the fifth year of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria (session two), chapter twenty-six, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for authorizing certain alterations and improvements at the episcopal house of residence belonging to the See of Norwich, which is known as the Palace, Norwich.

"Whereas the Right Reverend Bertram, now Bishop of Norwich, is desirous that certain alterations and improvements should be made at the said episcopal house of residence, and has submitted to us the particulars of such improve-

ments and we have approved the same.

"And whereas the said Bishop is also desirous and it appears to us to be expedient that towards the cost of effecting the said improvements a sum of two thousand pounds (being a sum which does not exceed two years' income of the See) should be provided by the borrowing of the same sum by way of mortgage upon the security of all and every part of the lands, tenements and hereditaments, endowments or emoluments which now belong or may hereafter belong to the Bishop of Norwich.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich (testified by his having affixed his signature and episcopal seal to this scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that the said Bishop be authorized to borrow from the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne, and that the said Governors be empowered to lend under the provisions of the above mentioned Acts any sum not exceeding two thousand pounds, and that as a security for the same the said Bishop do mortgage all and every part of the lands, tenements and hereditaments, and endowments or emoluments which now belong or may hereafter belong to his said See to the said Governors by deed for the term of twenty-two years or until the said sum so to be borrowed as aforesaid with the interest for the same as hereinafter mentioned, and all costs and charges which may attend the recovery thereof shall be fully paid and satisfied, and that such principal sum shall be repaid with interest in the manner following: that is to say, during and in respect of the first period of twelve months of the said term, computed from the day of the date of the mortgage, no part of the said principal sum shall be repayable, but the said Bishop or his successor shall yearly, at the end of the second period of twelve months so computed and at the end of every such like period of twelve months thereafter, pay to the said Governors, their successors or assigns, oneeighteenth part of the said principal sum until the whole thereof shall be repaid, and shall also at the end of the first and each succeeding period of twelve months, computed as aforesaid, pay interest at the rate of four pounds per centum per annum on the said principal sum or on so much thereof as shall from time to time remain unpaid. And that if and when it shall happen that either the principal or the interest directed to be paid as hereinbefore mentioned shall be in arrear and unpaid for the space of forty days after the same shall become due, it shall and may be lawful for the said Governors, their successors and assigns, to recover the same and the costs and charges attending the recovery thereof by dis-tress and sale in the like manner as rents may be recovered by landlords or lessors from their tenants by the laws in force at the time of such distress and sale, and that such mortgage deed shall be in the form and to the effect to be approved by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and shall bind as well as the said Bertram, now Bishop of the said diocese of Norwich, as every succeeding Bishop of the same diocese, until the principal money and interest, costs and charges shall have been paid off and discharged.

"And we further recommend and propose that the said sum so to be borrowed as aforesaid shall be paid to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and that the receipt of our Joint Treasurers for the time being endorsed on the said mortgage deed shall be a good and sufficient discharge of the said Governors and their successors for the same, who shall not be bound or required to see to the application thereof and that upon the receipt of the said sum so to be borrowed as aforesaid the whole or any part or parts thereof shall be applied by us at such times and in such manner as shall appear to us to be expedient towards effecting the said proposed improvements at the episcopal house of residence aforesaid.

"And we further recommend and propose that the Bishop of Norwich for the time being shall insure against loss or damage by fire and keep insured the said episcopal house of residence, the said insurance to be for a sum of not less than seven thousand pounds, and to be effected in one or more of the public offices of insurance in London or Westminster to be approved by us, and that in case of loss or damage by fire to the same episcopal house of residence the moneys receivable in respect of the said insurance shall be paid over to us by the said Bishop, and shall with any interest or accumulation thereon be applied by us in rebuilding or repairing the same episcopal house of residence with the concurrence of the said Bishop.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in conformity with the provisions of the herein-before mentioned Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts: and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Norwich.

W HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the fifth and sixth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and eight, and of the Act of the twenty-first and twenty-second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-seven, which Acts are known as "The Ecclesiastical Leasing Acts," duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the twenty-third day of

June, in the year one thousand nine hundred and ten, in the words following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifth and sixth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and eight, and of the Act of the twenty-first and twenty-second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-seven, which Acts are known as 'The Ecclesiastical Leasing Acts,' have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme relating to the vicarage and parish of Pannal, in the county of York and diocese of Ripon.

"Whereas the annual value of the benefice of Pannal, that is to say, of the vicarage of the parish of Pannal aforesaid (hereinafter called the said benefice), has been improved by means of certain sales and leases of the glebe lands of the said benefice effected under the authority of the said Acts by the Vicar or Incumbent of the said benefice of Pannal.

"And whereas the net proceeds of the said sales have been paid to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and have from time to time as the same have been received by us been invested in accordance with the provisions in that behalf contained in the said Acts and of such investments there are standing in the name of us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, first, a sum of five thousand one hundred and seventyseven pounds ten shillings and five pence India three pounds per centum stock, and second, a sum of two thousand nine hundred and ninetynine pounds seven shillings and eleven pence London County three pounds per centum stock, both which said sums of stock are now held by us in trust to pay the Vicar or Incumbent for the time being of the said benefice the annual interest or dividends from time to time arising or accruing therefrom or thereupon but subject nevertheless to the provisions contained in the said Acts with respect to making a certain portion of the improved value arising to the said benefice from the said sales and leases payable to us for the benefit of our common fund to be applied as in the said Acts mentioned.

"And whereas the improvement in the annual value of the said benefice arising from or by means of the said sales and leases exceeds the annual sum of three hundred and fifty pounds and after the appropriation hereinafter recommended to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for the benefit of our common fund of the sum of stock hereinafter mentioned the average annual income of the said benefice will not be left at a less sum than three hundred pounds.

"And whereas the Reverend Mark Rowntree, Clerk in Holy Orders, is the present Vicar or Incumbent of the said benefice.

"Now therefore we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that upon the vacation of the said benefice by the said Mark Rowntree the sum of stock secondly hereinbefore mentioned, that is to say, the sum of two thousand nine hundred and ninety-nine pounds seven shillings and eleven pence London County three pounds per centum stock, shall cease to be held by us for the benefit of the Vicar or Incumbent of the said benefice and shall be held by us for the benefit of our common fund to be applied as in the said Acts mentioned.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the notice of the foregoing scheme, which is required by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, has been given by the said Commissioners to the Patrons of the said benefice of Pannal, and the said Patrons have not made any objection to the said scheme.

WHEREAS by section 6 (1) of the Southendon-Sea Corporation Act, 1909, it is provided that the Borough of Southend-on-Sea shall be divided into such number of wards and the wards shall have such names or distinguishing numbers and boundaries as shall be determined by a scheme to be made by a Commissioner to be appointed for that purpose by His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department:

And whereas His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department did, on the twenty-second day of September, one thousand nine hundred and nine, appoint Raymond Asquith, Esquire, Barrister-at-Law, a Commissioner for the purpose aforesaid:

And whereas the said Commissioner has made and has, in accordance with the provisions of section 30 (11) of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, sent to His Majesty's said Principal Secretary of State, to be submitted by him to His Majesty in Council for approval, a scheme dated the third March, one thousand nine hundred and ten, in the words and figures following:—

"Article I.

"This Scheme shall except so far as is otherwise herein expressly provided or as there may be anything in the subject matter or context inconsistent therewith come into operation for the purpose of all proceedings preliminary to the ordinary Municipal Elections of the year one thousand nine hundred and ten on the date of its publication in the London Gazette and for all other purposes on the first aday of November, one thousand nine hundred and ten.

"Article II.

"Subject as regards any future alteration of the wards hereby constituted to the provisions of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, and any Act amending the same as to the alteration of wards the following provisions shall have effect:—

"(1) Whereas heretofore the borough has been divided for the purpose of the election of Councillors into three wards, termed respectively the Prittlewell or North Ward, the East Ward and the West Ward (hereinafter called the old wards); from and after the coming into operation of this scheme the borough shall be divided into eight wards, termed respectively the Westborough Ward, the Prittlewell Ward, the Southchurch Ward, the Victoria Ward, the Chalkwell Ward, the Milton Ward, the Pier Ward and the Thorpe Ward (hereinafter called the new wards).

"(2) The boundaries of the said eight wards which shall in every case follow the centre line of the roads hereinafter named shall be

"(a) Westborough Ward.—On the north and west the boundaries of the borough; on the east, North-street and the main Rochford-road; on the south, Hadleigh-road, Leigh-road, and West-road;

"(b) Prittlewell Ward.—On the north the boundaries of the borough; on the east, Sutton-road, North-avenue and Bournemouth Park-road; on the south, Southchurch-road; on the west, Victoria-avenue, the aforesaid eastern boundary of the Westborough Ward, and the boundaries of the borough;
"(c) Southchurch Ward.—On the north




