CEREMONIALS OBSERVED AT THE FUNERAL AND LYING IN
STATE OF HIS LATE MAJESTY KING EDWARD THE
SEVENTH OF BLESSED MEMORY.

FROM BUCKINGHAM PALACE TO WESTMINSTER HALL, MAY 17TH, 1910.

Guards of Honour from the Royal Navy and Brigade of Guards were mounted at Buckingham Palace, and from the Brigade of Guards and Royal Marine Light Infantry at Westminster Hall.

At 11.30 precisely in the morning the Royal Coffin was removed from Buckingham Palace by a party of Warrant Officers and Sergeants of the Brigade of Guards under the command of an Officer, and placed upon a gun carriage, and the Crown and Cushion, the Regalia and the Insignia of the Garter laid thereon.
