A Guard of eight Gentlemen at Arms were on duty over the Royal Coffin throughout the Service.

The Remains of His late Majesty King Edward the Seventh, of Blessed Memory, lay in State in Westminster Hall from Tuesday, the Seventeenth of May, to Friday, the Twentieth of the same month.

During the Lying in State, Four Gentlemen at Arms stood at the head of the Coffin, and four Yeomen of the Guard stood at the four corners of the Catafalque. Two Officers of the Household Cavalry and Brigade of Guards were also stationed on either side, and a native Orderly Officer of the Ghurka Rifles at the foot of the Coffin.

The Public was admitted to Westminster Hall on Tuesday, the Seventeenth of May, from four o'clock in the afternoon to ten o'clock in the evening; on Wednesday, the Eighteenth, and Thursday, the Nineteenth of May, from six o'clock in the morning to ten o'clock in the evening.

ON FRIDAY, THE TWENTIETH DAY OF MAY, Guards of Honour from the Royal Navy and the Brigade of Guards were mounted at Westminster Hall and Paddington Railway Station.

At 9.45 o'clock precisely in the morning the Royal Coffin was removed from Westminster Hall by the Bearer Party of the Brigade of Guards, and placed upon a Gun Carriage, and the Crown and Cushion, the Regalia, and the Insignia of the Garter laid thereon.
