ORDER OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL IN ENGLAND.

(Dated 22nd July, 1910.)

Whereas by the 21st Section of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1874, it is enacted that the Registrar-General, with the sanction of the

Local Government Board, may from time to time alter Registration Sub-Districts:—

1. And whereas it is expedient that the part of St. Bartholomew's Ward of Birmingham County Borough now included in Duddeston Sub-district of Aston Registration District should be transferred to Deritend Sub-district of the same Registration District.

2. Now, therefore, I, Bernard Mallet, Registrar-General of Births, Deaths, and Marriages in England, in exercise of the powers given me by the above mentioned Act, and with the sanction of the Local Government Board, do hereby order and declare that the foregoing alteration shall take effect accordingly.

3. This Order shall come into operation on 1st day of August, nineteen hundred and ten.
