The following Statute, duly made by the Governing Body of Magdalen College, Oxford, on the 25th day of May, 1910, amending the existing Statutes of the College, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877":—

STATUTE to amend the existing Statutes of Magdalen College in the University of Oxford, dated the 16th day of June, 1881, duly made at a General Meeting of the President and Fellows specially summoned for that purpose on the twenty-fifth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and ten, and passed at such Meeting by the votes of two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting, and submitted to His Majesty the King in Council.

Statute for Magdalen College made by the College under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877.

Preliminary.

This Statute is supplementary to the existing Statutes of the College, that is to say, the Statutes dated the 16th day of June, 1881, and the 1st day of July, 1881, made for the College by the University of Oxford Commissioners (hereinafter referred to as the Statutes of 1881), as altered by the Statutes dated the 10th day of August, 1888, the 7th day of March, 1899, the 15th day of September, 1902, the 10th day of May, 1905, and the 31st day of May, 1910, made by the College under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877.

Waynflete and other Professorships.

In the clause numbered 2 of the Statute as to Waynflete and other Professorships in the Statutes of 1881, £600 shall be substituted for £300, and in clause 6 of the same Statute the words "one member of which Board shall always be the President and another shall be either the Visitor of the College or a person to be chosen by the President and Fellows who shall be elected for a term of years, and shall be reeligible at the end of that term or of any subsequent term for which he shall have been "one member of which Board shall always be the Visitor and another the President of the College" and the said clause shall be read and take effect accordingly.
