STATUTE to amend the existing Statutes of Magdalen College in the University of Oxford, dated the 16th day of June, 1881, duly made at a General Meeting of the President and Fellows specially summoned for that purpose on the twenty-fifth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and ten, and passed at such Meeting by the votes of two-thirds of the number of persons
