The Ministers of the Interior and of Finance: Having regard to Article 1 of the Royal Decree

of October 11, 1909;

Bring to the notice of the public that on and after August 20, 1910, the importation and transit of rags, used articles of clothing and unwashed underclothing and bedding from any of the places situated in the Russian Government of Bessarabia or in that of Taurida shall be prohibited for as far as this prohibition does not already exist.

Luggage which travellers bring with them shall be included in this prohibition so far as unwashed bedding and underclothing are concerned.

This prohibition shall not apply:

I. As regards importation and transit: To goods which have arrived from the said places but which can be shown to have come from elsewhere, and which are packed and have Brindisi, and all Province of Lecce, free from been transported in such a manner as to render

II. As regards transit:

To goods which are packed in such a manner that they cannot undergo any operation of manufacture or any treatment on the way.
