The Quarantine medical inspection of vessels arriving from Odessa, required by the Supplement I of July 5th, 1910, to the above Notice regarding the danger from Cholera, shall refer also to the danger of the introduction of Plague. Special attention is to be given to the possibility of the appearance of rat plague.

GOVERNMENT NOTICE. No. 199.

It is hereby notified that His Excellency the Governor, acting on the advice of the Council of

Health, and in exercise of the powers vested in him by articles 38 and 44 of the Fourth Sanitary Ordinance, has been pleased to amend as follows the Regulations for the prevention of contagious, infectious and epidemic diseases published by Government Notice No. 165 of the 28th August, 1908, viz.:

- (a) The following paragraph is added after the third paragraph of article 1, Part I of the Regulations above referred to, viz.:
- "'Place' means any clearly defined portion of territory, such as a province, a district, a department, a commune, an island, a town, a village, a port."
- (b) The words "port or" in the first line of the fourth (now fifth) paragraph of the article above referred to at (a), are cancelled.
- (c) The words "ports or" in the first line of article 4, Part I of the said Regulations, are cancelled.
- (d) The word "port" in the second line of sub-paragraph (c) of article 4, Part I of the said Regulations, is cancelled and the word "place" is substituted therefor.
- (e) The words "ports or" in the first line of article 5, Part I of the said Regulations, are cancelled.
- (f) The word "port" in the fourth line of sub-paragraph (iv) of article 5 of Part I under heading "C. Healthy Ships" of the said Regulations, is cancelled and the word "place" is substituted therefor.
- (g) The word "port" in the first line of article 7 of Part I of the said Regulations is cancelled and the word "place" is substituted therefor.
- (h) The following paragraph is added to article 8 of Part I of the said Regulations, viz.:—
- "Where any ship has passengers on board coming from any part of a country other than an infected place in such country, the Quarantine Medical Officer may, if in his opinion it is desirable with a view of preventing the introduction of disease, subject any such passengers landing in these islands to surveillance for such period, not exceeding five days, as may be prescribed by the said Quarantine Medical Officer."
- (i) The words "ports or" in the first line of article 9 of Part I of the said Regulations are cancelled.
- (j) The word "port" in the second line of article 10 of Part I of the said Regulations is cancelled and the word "place" is substituted therefor.
- (k) The words "ports or" in the first line of article 15 and in the second line of article 16 of Part I of the said Regulations are cancelled.
- (1) The words "ports" in the second line of article 1 and of article 2 of Part III of the said Regulations is cancelled and the word "places" is substituted therefor.
