(2) *South Channel—Alterations in Buoyage.*

1. Alteration in position of Middle Ground Buoy:

New position.—At a distance of $1\frac{1}{10}$ miles, S. 30° E., from former position; lat. 31° 15' 55" N., long. 121° 46' 40" E., on Chart No. 1602.

2. Fairy Wreck Light-buoy withdrawn:

Position.—Lat. 31° 11 $\frac{1}{2}$ ' N., long. 121° 52 $\frac{1}{2}$ ' E.

Remarks.—The symbol for a wreck has been placed on the charts in the position where the buoy was shown.
