The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated August 26th, from His Majesty's Minister at Lisbon, enclosing the following translation of Special Rules for precaution against cholera, to be observed with regard to vessels arriving at Portuguese ports:-

I. Unless a vessel proves by an authenticated certificate that no water has been taken on board at a cholera infected port, all fresh water intended for drinking, cooking, or washing purposes shall be thrown overboard after having been treated with permanganate of potash in the proportion of 50 grammes to the cubic metre.

II. Bilge water, water ballast, and the water in the pumps shall also be thrown overboard after treatment with sulphate of copper, 1 kilogramme to the cubic metre, the inside of reservoirs being immediately subjected to chloride of lime at 15 per cent. or quick lime at 20 per cent., or to steam injections from the boilers in vessels fitted with appropriate appliances for the purpose. If the emptying of water ballast is likely to endanger the stability of the ship the ballast tanks shall not be emptied but shall be hermetically closed and sealed.

III. Water closets shall be disinfected with sulphate of copper at 5 per cent; during the time a ship remains in port the use only of water closets provided with a flushing cistern containing the disinfecting solution will be permitted. It is strictly prohibited to empty fæces overboard

without previous disinfection.

IV. According to the power consigned in Article 289 of the "General Regulations for Health and Public Beneficence," the importation for commercial purposes is prohibited of the following articles coming from places infected with cholera:

1. Old and tattered rags, soiled clothes and bed linen, bedding and pillows, used bedroom furniture, old paper, wood and paper shavings, refuse of all kinds, and substances in decomposition.

V. Permission to go on board vessels proceeding from infected ports shall, with the exception of persons embarking as passengers, be restricted to persons who have special duties to perform or who may allege strong motives to go on board, but the latter shall only be admitted on production of a written licence from the Chief Health Officer, who shall mention the names and addresses of all such persons on the proper

VI. Cargo labourers shall be subjected to the same sanitary rules as the crew of the ship.

VII. Emigrants in transit shall not be permitted

VIII. Strict medical supervision shall be exercised upon the ship and her crew during

her stay in port.

IX. Bills of Health issued by the Portuguese sanitary authorities shall make special mention of the quarantine, disinfection and the sanitary treatment to which the vessel has been subjected.

It is hereby notified that His Excellency the Governor, acting on the advice of the Council of Health, and in exercise of the powers vested in him by articles 38 and 44 of the Fourth Sanitary Ordinance, has been pleased to amend the Regulations for the prevention of contagious, infectious, and epidemic diseases published by Government Notice No. 165, of the 28th August, 1908 (as amended by Government Notice No. 199 of the 22nd ultimo), by the addition of the following paragraph to article 15, Part I, viz :-

"Ships arriving from any other place may, when the Sanitary Authority deems it advisable, be also ordered to proceed to the said anchorage."

SHORES OR BANKS OF THE SEA AT CLEY - NEXT - THE - SEA, SALTHOUSE, KELLING, WEYBOURNE, UPPER SHER-INGHAM, BEESTON REGIS AND RUNTON.

REMOVAL OF MATERIALS PROHIBITED.

Whereas the Board of Trade, acting in pursuance of the Harbours Act, 1814, as amended by the Harbours Transfer Act, 1862, find it necessary for the protection of the Ports of Lynn and Yarmouth to prohibit the taking or removing of any shingle or ballast from the shores or banks of the sea:-

. (1) between the western boundary of the rural district of Erpingham (which crosses the shore about 3 miles 200 feet west of the Rocket House at Salthouse) and the western boundary of the urban district of Sheringham (which crosses the shore near the Lifeboat House at the Old Hithe, Upper Sheringham); and (2) between the eastern boundary of the urban district of Sheringham (which crosses the shore about 1,000 feet eastward of the gangway adjacent to Vincent Road, Sheringham) and the western boundary of the urban district of Cromer (which crosses the shore about 700 feet eastward of Windham Park Terrace, Runton), being within the said port.

Now the Board of Trade do hereby, by this Order, prohibit the taking or removing of any shingle or ballast from the shores or banks of the sea between the points above mentioned.

ORDER of the Local Government Board: Altering General Consolidated Order: Daily Visitation of Sick and Lying-in Wards of Workhouse: Transferring certain Duties from Master and Matron to Superintendent Nurse:—

NEWCASTLE UPON TYNE UNION.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Newcastle upon Tyne Union;-

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by a General Order dated the 24th day of July, 1847, the Poor Law Commissioners made certain Rules and Regulations with regard to the government of the Workhouses of certain Unions, including the Newcastle upon Tyne Union, and the duties of persons appointed to certain offices in the said Workhouses, including the offices of Master and Matron of the Workhouse:

And whereas by Articles 208 and 210 of the said Order the Master and Matron of the Workhouse are respectively required to visit the wards of the male and female paupers every morning and night, and to see that the regula-tions prescribed in the said Articles are duly and properly carried out;

And whereas it is expedient that other provision should be made as regards the visitation of the sick and lying-in wards of the Workhouse of the said Union:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order that the following Regulations shall be in force in the said Newcastle upon Tyne Union as regards the visitation of the sick and lying-in wards of the Workhouse of the Union:-

ARTICLE I .- It shall be the duty of the Superintendent Nurse to visit each of the sick and lying-in wards of the Workhouse daily, and to see that the said wards have been duly cleansed and are properly warmed and ventilated, and also that all such arrangements are made as may be necessary for the proper care of and attendance upon the inmates both by

day and during the night.

ARTICLE II.—The duty of making morning and nightly visits to the sick and lying-in wards of the Workhouse shall cease to be part of the duties of the Master or Matron of the Workhouse, as the case may be; but, except to this extent, nothing in this Order shall affect the duties of the Master or Matron so far as those duties relate to the general control of the Workhouse.

TEMPORARY ORDER of the Local Government Board: Relief to Able-bodied Men, their Wives, and Families:

SALFORD UNION.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Salford Union ;-

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by a General Order dated the 14th day of December, 1852, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of certain Unions and Parishes, including the Salford Union, the Poor Law Board prescribed Regulations with regard to the administration of out-door relief to poor persons in the said Union;

And whereas it is expedient that further provision should be made temporarily with regard to the administration of relief to certain

classes of poor persons in the said Union:
Now therefore, We, the Local Government
Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order as

ARTICLE I .- The Guardians of the Poor of the Salford Union may, after not less than seven days' notice of the proposal has been sent by their Clerk to each Guardian, pass a Resolution (hereinafter referred to as "the Resolution") to the effect that the powers conferred by this Order shall be exercised by them, and a copy of the Resolution shall be forwarded to Us by the Clerk within one week after the passing of the Resolution.

ARTICLE II.—(1.) The Guardians may, from and after the passing of the Resolution, and during the operation of this Order, relieve out of the Workhouse the wife and family of any ablebodied male person who is relieved in the Work-

(2.) An able-bodied male person who is relieved in the Workhouse, while his wife and family are relieved by the Guardians out of the Workhouse, shall not be absent from the Workhouse more than once in any one week, nor for a period exceeding twelve hours, nor without the consent of the Guardians.

(3.) Any such able-bodied male person who is absent from the Workhouse without any contravention of sub-division (2) of this Article may be relieved by the Guardians during his absence from the Workhouse, without being set to work during the time or any part of the time of his

ARTICLE III.—This Order shall operate and have effect until the twenty-fifth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and eleven.

ORDER of the Local Government Board: Motor Car Act, 1903: Regulations under Section 9 (1).

COUNTY OF ESSEX.

Parish of Littlebury.

To the County Council of Essex; And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that, within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by Us, the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;

And whereas We have received and duly considered an application from the County Council of Essex for the issue of a Regulation in pursuance of the said sub-section putting the above mentioned provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising certain roads or parts of roads situate within the parish of Littlebury, in the county of Essex:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, We do, by this Our

Order, make the following Regulations:—
ARTICLE I.—The provisions of sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Act with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour shall apply and have effect within the limits comprising the roads or parts of roads within the said parish which are specified in the Schedule hereto.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the nineteenth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and ten.

SCHEDULE.

So much of the main road from London to Cambridge passing through the village of Littlebury as extends from a point situate 75 yards south of the Corner of the Church Yard Wall to a point situate 50 yards north of the Smithy at the northern end of the village;
